- The 2024 Mason Middle School Robotics Team, composed of 20 hardworking 6th-8th graders, concluded their second season with an impressive showing at the FIRST Tech Challenge. The event was hosted by Bedford High School and had a total of 36 teams competing from different schools in Michigan. The team demonstrated exceptional growth, creativity, and collaboration as they tackled the marine-themed "Into the Deep" challenge. Significant improvements were made to their robot from the previous season, showcasing their growing technical skills and understanding of engineering. Throughout the competition, the students displayed professionalism and graciousness, building positive connections with other schools and embodying the core values of teamwork and respect. Coaches Mrs. Petree and Mr. Chrysochoos praised the students for their dedication and innovative problem-solving, reflecting a successful season of learning and achievement.
- This week our Mason middle school Youth in Government delegates went to Lansing to learn how to debate, write bills, and develop leadership skills. One of 12 schools/YMCA groups in attendance, we brought one of the largest delegations with 40 students. We had 5 candidates ran for elected positions.
