Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2024-2025 educational progress for Mason Senior High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student group in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had at least one student group performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1.) PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Students who attend Mason Senior High School come directly from our Middle School building, via transfer, or are accepted as a School of Choice student from neighboring districts.



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2.) THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The School Improvement Plan continues to be modified to meet the curricular and achievement demands for our district. Based on our student achievement data, the need for a guaranteed and viable curriculum has become our district's biggest priority. Through the district strategic planning committee, we have identified a series of needs to support our student achievement goals. Over the next year, these needs will be supported with the appropriate professional development to ensure our staff create an effective and transparent curriculum for the four core academic areas K-12 grades. We will continue to redefine our MTSS model to meet the at risk demands of our students. This includes our restorative justice practices and mental health support.

3.) A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

We do not have any specialized schools here at Mason Senior High School.

Implementation of the Mason Senior High School core curriculum varies as the State and Federal requirements change, student performance data is reviewed, and student needs evolve. Continual evaluation of these expectations is the guiding factor in revisions to the delivery and assessment of core content. All curricula meet requirements of the Michigan Merit Curriculum, content expectations, and Common Core State Standards (CCSS). In the spring of 2025, Mason Senior High School administered the SAT test to the junior graduating class of 2026. Composite, ELA, and Math assessment results are listed:

We offered AP Chemistry and AP Physics as well as 13 AP courses available on our virtual platform in the 2024-2025 school year.

We had 36 students (11%) enrolled in AP courses in 2024-2025 school year.

10.) THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING A SCORE LEADING TO COLLEGE CREDIT

We had 11 students (31%) receive a score on their AP test leading to college credit in 2024-2025 school year.
