TCC Leadership Conference:

Twelve of our sophomore and junior athletes had the opportunity to attend the TCC leadership conference held at Adrian Madison on 9/27/22. Athletes participated in a leadership workshop titled “Unlocking a Season of Significance” with guest speaker Greg Hillier. They also worked with other athletes from the different TCC schools in problem-solving and team-building activities. Our athletes enjoyed the conference, and many stated it was much better than they anticipated.

Football:
