You only had to have an A in one area to be considered a Reward School and our two schools had it in two out of the three areas and three out of three respectively.

I also share these wonderful accomplishments because as your Superintendent, I have taken great pride in watching our students and staff beat the odds every year. I have been granted a wonderful life in the world of education. It is with this tremendous gratefulness – and a fair amount of excitement - that I announce my retirement, effective June 30, 2020. Wanting Mason Consolidated Schools to have a smooth transition with the next Superintendent, I have offered a one-year transition period where I will be available to work in a part time role as the mentor to the Superintendent along with a continuing role in transportation and facilities.
