Football:

The fall is season is off to a great start. The football season started with a game played at Olivet College against Saranac. The team was able to get the first victory of the year and the first victory for coach Bowers as a varsity head coach.

The athletic and maintenance department successful navigated the challenge of not having use of our home bleachers and managed to have a successful evening for our first home game versus Summerfield.
