Michael Davis - "The Alla Prima Still Life" Workshop

One day workshop on Thursday, April 25, from 10:30 am to 4:30 pm on developing still life composition and technical skills with Michael Timothy Davis, multiple Award Winner in international Art Renewal Center (ARC) and other major competitions. The focus will be on the use of simple arrangements of 3 - 5 objects, creating dynamic and fundamentally sound paintings in one sitting, composing and breaking down the still life to its essentials, creating a finished and expressive painting within a few hours. The cost is \$75 for VAA and Museum members and \$85 for non-members. Lunch is included in the workshop fee. Brendan Rich - Pigment Workshop

Three to four Pigment Workshops are being planned for May with Brendan Rich. The participants will work up the pigment as paint and then follow up with painting on damp plaster (fresco). Other sessions might culminate with painting on dry plaster (secco); and experimenting with differing mediums: linseed oil, gum Arabic, or casein (milk paint). The focus could be on three different aspects of preparing pigments: earth minerals, chemically derived pigments or organic pigments.

Lesa Cook - "Low Relief Sculpture" Workshop

Two-day workshop with sculptor and painter, Lesa Cook, winner of many awards, instructor at the Delaplaine Art Center, Certified copyist at the National Gallery: students will create a low (bas) relief sculpture in water-based clay using their own photographic sources from animal, human subject matter, a shallow relief that can be wall-mounted after firing. The workshop will be held on Thursday - Friday, June 6 - 7, 2024, from 10:30 am – 4:30 pm each day. Included in the workshop fee is the use of sculpture stands and tools loaned by the instructor. Lunch is also included. Cost is \$150 for VAA and Museum members, and \$165 for non-members. The clay will be provided by the instructor for a \$20 supply fee. Firing arrangements may be made with her during the workshop. Minimum is 6. The lunch break will be 30 minutes.
