April Membership Meeting with Dr. Elizabeth Johns

Curating and Exhibits

Wednesday, April 27th at 7:00 PM

Elizabeth Johns, professor emerita of art history, University of Pennsylvania, earned her Ph.D. from Emory University in 1974 and has taught art history and American studies since 1968. In her capacity as a professor she taught courses on all eras of American art: on the Civil War that focused on the Civil War Heritage area of Antietam, Manassas, and Gettysburg, including the literature, visual images, and monuments from the period, as well as the National Park Service's interpretation of the sites; and on the history of photography. Her book about Winslow Homer (University of California Press, 2002), analyzes Homer's images of the Civil War in the context of his other work and his own northern commitments.

Most recently, at the Washington County Museum of Fine Arts, she curated the exhibition "Circuit of the Summer Hills: Mourning the Losses of the Civil War" (January 2010) to February 2011), which includes paintings and prints by both Union and Confederate veterans, including Abraham Volck and Daniel Ridgway Knight, whose "The Burning of Chambersburg", 1867, is a favorite in the WCMFA collection. Also in the exhibition are wood engravings of the war's effect on families by Winslow Homer from Harper's Weekly, quotations from Walt Whitman, a "Head of Abraham Lincoln" by Gutzon Borglum, folk art celebrating the Union by William Schimmel, mourning jewelry, broadsides announcing the assassination of President Lincoln, and period photographs of the Antietam National Cemetery in Sharpsburg, including the exhibition of "Old Simon" in 1876 at the Philadelphia Centennial.

Dr. Johns, a member of the Board of Trustees of the Washington County Museum of Fine Arts, has served as a guest curator for the museum for several years. Before her arrival in Hagerstown after her retirement, she curated and co-curated many exhibitions, including Western genre paintings for the exhibition "The West as America" for the Smithsonian Museum of American Art. American and French Impressionist landscapists for the Worcester Museum of Art, and the drawings of George Caleb Bingham for the Smithsonian Museum of American Art. She has written more than one hundred articles and book reviews; her books include Thomas Eakins: The Heroism of Modern Life (Princeton, 1982), American Genre Painting: the Politics of Everyday Life (Yale, 1991), and Winslow Homer: The Nature of Observation (California, 2002). She is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. held a Guggenheim Fellowship and a fellowship at the Woodrow Wilson Center and won both the Mitchell prize and the Eldredge prize for her scholarship.
