Tips for Advocating G/T Services During the Pandemic

With distance learning and hybrid models in effect, it is important to ensure that all educational and related services are provided to gifted and talented students. Here are some tips from AGTSLA:

- 1) Review the current IEP. Changes in program services may require amending or rewriting the current IEP.
- 2) Work with the IEP team to ensure that educational needs and services are being addressed in the current educational setting.
- 3) Ensure that special class minutes are consistent with state law minimum requirements.
- 4) Keep the lines of communication with the special education teacher open to ensure the continuity of services.
