RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Please read these – your completed entry form denotes your agreement.

- 1. Entries payable by cash, cheque or Bank transfer. Please make any cheques payable to NESHPES.
- 2. Rosettes will be awarded 1st 6th unless otherwise stated.
- **3.** Parents/guardians of anyone under the age of 18 should specify if they do not wish their child/children to be photographed.
- 4. Whilst on the Showground everyone mounted, whether competing or not must wear a hard hat conforming to the current minimum safety standards, with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. Failure to do so will incur elimination of the horse and/or rider from the competition. Juniors under 18, it is advised that a hard hat be worn whilst on competition grounds.
- 5. The Show Committee shall not be liable for any damage or loss to person, animals or property that exhibitors or public may sustain at the show. It shall be deemed a condition of entry that each entrant agrees to indemnify the organisers against any legal action arising and that they have public liability insurance for their livestock.
- 6. Competitors are required to show courtesy towards others when warming up. If riding on the opposite rein to one another competitors should pass left shoulder to left shoulder.
- 7. NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED WITHOUT ENTRY FORM AND CORRECT ENTRY FEE.
- **8.** The organizers reserve the right to decline any entry, combine, divide or cancel any class, dependant on entry numbers.
- **9.** The organizers will not be held responsible for any complaint regarding horses or ponies entered in the wrong classes, but will act as a mediator provided the complainer has proof on the day of the show.
- **10.** All stallions should be handled / ridden by a competent adult at all times while on the showground
- **11.** All horses and ponies should be passported and vaccinations should be up to date. Passport must accompany pony to the show and be made available for inspection if required by official.
- **12.** Any complaints should be made in writing within 20minutes of the incident to the Show secretary and accompanied by a deposit of £30, deposit will be returned if the complaint is upheld
- **13.** Please keep dogs on leads at all times.
- 14. Health and Safety. The Organisers have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the Health & Safety of everyone present. To ensure these measures are effective, everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid accidents occurring and must obey the directions of organisers, officials and stewards.
- **15.** Any animal that constitutes a danger will be asked to leave the ring/show field.
- **16.** The making of an entry implies acceptance of the conditions above.

Please be respectful to our hosts by ensuring that you do not leave your horses droppings, hay or litter on the Showground.

Important Show Notes

If entering more than one class please note you may have to make a decision as to which class to enter if classes are clashing, classes maybe held at the judge's discretion but for no more than 5 minutes.

A limited number of Paper Catalogues will be available on the day, electronic version will be emailed to all competitors in advance of the show.

All first prize winners are invited to compete for their Section Championship with second places on standby at the discretion of the Judge.

All Section Champions can compete for the Overall Championship to be held on completion of all individual Championships



Caledonian Showing Championships

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season

Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on17/18/19 October 2025

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all In hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Ponyclasses will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line.

- Class 5 Sports horse In-hand, 15hh & over at maturity in-hand

SIDE SADDLE SECTION

RING to be confirmed – Not before Noon

Class 69 Side Saddle Equitation Open Qualifier horse or pony 4 years old of over, Open to any rider riding side saddle. Only Life or paid up Full or Junior members of the Side Saddle Association are eligible to win qualifying points, to receive Side Saddle Association Rosettes. Lead Rein competitors may only compete Hors Concours.

- Class 70 Best Horse or Pony Ridden Side Saddle open to horses or ponies 4 years old and over. Conformation and manners will be taken into account. Horses/ponies will not be stripped. A special rosette to the highest placed Adult and Junior Member of the SSA. The highest placed coloured exhibit ridden by a competitor aged 16 or over (who has not already qualified) receives a special rosette and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the CHAPS Championship Show. Open to any type of exhibit. Lead rein riders are eligible for this class. Leaders must be correctly dressed.
 Class71 Unaffiliated Starter/Novice Side Saddle Classes Open to any horse or pony 4 years old and over. Riders to be smartly dressed (shirt, tie, jacket and breeches but do not need to wear a habit for this class.
- Class 72 Concours d'Elegance horse or pony 4 years old or over. The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by the horse and rider. This class may be ridden Side Saddle or Astride in Costume or Traditional Dress.

Special Area 1 Member Rosette presented to the highest placed Member in each of the classes.

The Side Saddle Association

EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS

Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Members' Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members.

Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd

Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southernden Side Saddles sponsor a rosette to the highest

placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. A rosette sponsored in memory of The Late Mr R Philpot is offered to the Adult Member and Just So Elegant Side Saddle Hire sponsor a rosette for the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out. Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above.

QUALIFIER FOR THE SIR LANCELOT MEMORIAL TROPHY

- Only applicable to UK Areas (Area 20 cannot hold Sir Lancelot Qualifiers)
- For Shows (maximum of 2 per Area), invited by the relevant SSA Area Chairman, to hold a Sir Lancelot Qualifier

The Judge shall be on the current SSA Judges' Panel but may be assisted by a Celebrity or Sponsor

A Special rosette will be offered to the Adult Member, carrying their current Championship Points Card, of the SSA Area in which the Show is organised, who during the Equitation Qualifier Class (irrespective of final placing) is judged to be the most elegant. That member will be eligible to compete in the Final for the Sir Lancelot Memorial Trophy (donated by the late Mrs E. Skelton) at the National Side Saddle Show. A Member may only qualify once per season between one National Show and the next, and if the Judge's first choice has already qualified, the rosette will be awarded to the next eligible competitor.

QUALIFIER FOR THE LADY GUINEVERE TROPHY

At those shows where a Sir Lancelot Qualifier is to be held a Special rosette will be offered to the Junior Member, carrying their current Championship Points Card, of the SSA Area in which the show is organised, who during the Equitation Qualifier Class (whether Open or Junior) (irrespective of final placing) is judged to be the most elegant. That Junior Member will be eligible to compete in the Final for the Lady Guinevere Trophy at the National Side Saddle Show. A Junior Member may only qualify once per season between one National Show and the next, and if the Judge's first choice has already qualified, the rosette will be awarded to the next eligible competitor.

BEST HORSE OR PONY RIDDEN SIDE SADDLE

Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: conformation & manners will be taken into consideration;

horses/ponies will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior

Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards.

The Highest placed coloured exhibit ridden by a competitor aged 16rs or over (who has not already qualified) receives a Special Rosette and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the CHAPS Championship Show. Open to any type of exhibit. Riders/Owners need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the Rider/Owner must be a showing member and their horse/pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final. Lead Rein competitors are eligible for this class. Leaders must be correctly dressed.

SPECIAL CLASS - To be Judged before Overall Champion

The Moredun Foundation Equine Grass Sickness Fund is the only registered charity in the UK raising funds specifically for research into grass sickness.

EGSF is dedicated to supporting and advancing research into grass sickness and further improving the treatment of grass sickness.

Grass Sickness remains a major cause of mortality in horses and ponies in Britain with more than 95% of cases proving fatal.
