About the Scholarship

The Constable Andrew Hong Memorial Scholarship Fund was established to honour the life, service, and enduring legacy of Constable Andrew Hong of the Toronto Police Service.

A devoted officer and a respected member of the Toronto Police Motor Unit, Constable Hong was also a cherished part of the Canada 911 Ride community. For many years, he selflessly served as a police escort for our rides, exemplifying the values of service, unity, and dedication that lie at the heart of our Foundation.

His tragic death in the line of duty on September 12, 2022, deeply impacted not only his family and colleagues, but also the Canada 911 Ride community and the broader emergency services community across Canada. While his loss left an immeasurable void, it also inspired a renewed commitment to honour his memory in a meaningful way.

Thanks to the generous support of an anonymous donor—moved by Constable Hong's story and the profound impact of his passing—this \$10,000 annual scholarship was created to support the post-secondary educational aspirations of children of Toronto Police Service members.

The scholarship is intended to recognize and empower young individuals who demonstrate leadership, community spirit, and a strong commitment to civic responsibility—the very qualities that defined Constable Hong's life and career.

One successful applicant will be awarded the scholarship annually. Funds will be disbursed in Canadian dollars and paid directly to the recipient's accredited post-secondary institution¹, whether it be a college, university, or recognized trade school.

¹ In Canada, an accredited post-secondary institution is one that is officially recognized by a provincial or territorial government as authorized to grant degrees, diplomas, or certificates. This includes public universities and colleges, as well as certain private institutions approved to confer recognized credentials.



Eligibility Criteria

- Be a child of a currently serving or retired employee of the Toronto Police Service (civilian or sworn).
- Opened to anyone going into or continuing their studies with an accredited post-secondary institution.
- Be no older than 25 years of age at the time of submitting the application.
- Have obtained an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).
- Provide proof of acceptance to an accredited post-secondary institution commencing in 2025.
- Demonstrate a commitment to community service.
- Maintain good academic standing while in high school.
- Be of good moral character and personal habits.

Category	Criteria	Score Range
1. Strength of Candidacy (Why are you a strong candidate?)	Clarity and persuasiveness of why the applicant believes they deserve the scholarship.	0–10
2. Demonstrated Leadership, Resilience, or Community Service	Specific examples of leadership, overcoming adversity, or meaningful community engagement.	0–10
3. Alignment with Values (Educational/Career goals reflecting integrity, service, giving back)	How well the applicant's aspirations align with Constable Hong's values and the mission of the scholarship.	0–10
4. Legacy Connection (How scholarship helps honour Constable Hong's legacy)	Insightful and sincere connection made between the applicant's journey and the legacy of Constable Hong.	0–10
5. Writing Quality (Structure, clarity, grammar, and overall impact)	Organized, coherent, well-written, and free from significant grammatical errors.	0–10
