

Below are a selection of **B2 high-scoring phrases** which will help you to increase the quality of your presentations.

1. Opening & Framing the Topic

Use these to sound deliberate and confident from the first sentence:

- "I'd like to begin by outlining the main issue."
- "The topic I'm going to focus on today is ..."
- "This issue has become increasingly relevant in recent years."
- "This topic raises several important questions."
- "There are three key aspects I would like to address."

2. Explaining & Clarifying

Ideal for **explain / describe / talk about** tasks:

- "What this means in practice is ..."
- "In simple terms, this refers to ..."
- "This can be explained by the fact that ..."
- "A good example of this can be seen in ..."
- "This plays a significant role in ..."

3. Comparing & Contrasting

High-value phrases for **compare / contrast** tasks:

- "In comparison to ..., ..."
- "One key difference between ... and ... is ..."
- "While ... focuses on ..., ... tends to ..."
- "Both approaches have similarities; however, they differ in ..."
- "On the one hand ..., on the other hand ..."

4. Developing Arguments

These phrases help extend answers beyond basic statements:

- "This is particularly important because ..."
- "As a result, this can lead to ..."
- "This has both short-term & long-term consequences."
- "From an economic / social / environmental perspective ..."
- "This issue affects not only ... but also ..."

5. Giving Your Opinion (Formally)

Crucial for **giving your opinion** without sounding casual:

- "In my opinion, ..."
- "I believe this is largely due to ..."
- "From my perspective, this approach is more effective because ..."
- "I tend to agree with the view that ..."
- "Personally, I would argue that ..."

6. Balancing & Evaluating

These raise answers from B2 to **strong B2+**:

- "That said, it's important to consider the limitations."
- "Despite these advantages, there are also drawbacks."
- "This approach may be effective; however, it is not without risks."
- "A balanced view would take both factors into account."
 - "The reality is often more complex than it first appears"
