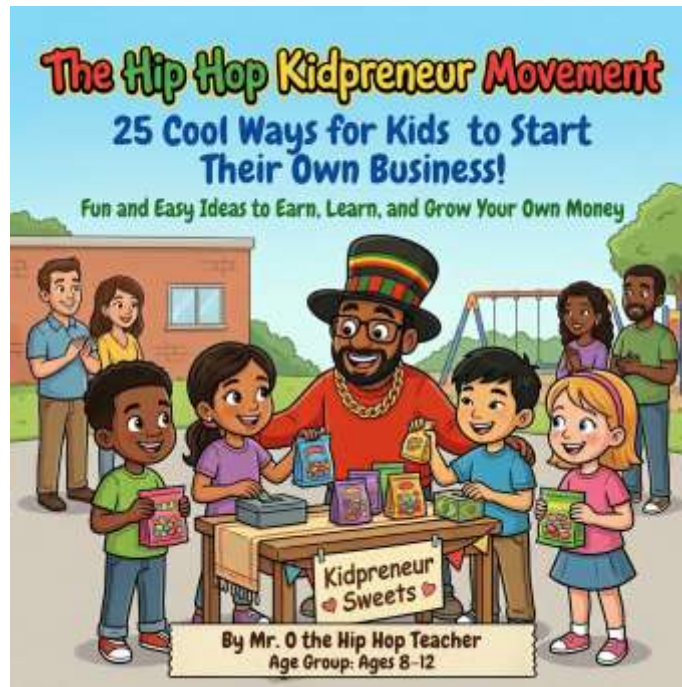

Junior Barber or Braider (Beautician)

Practice your haircutting or braiding skills on family members. Once you're confident, offer your service to friends (make sure your parents help with safety and pricing).

Lemonade or Iced Tea Stand

Classic and always fun! Mix your favorite recipe and set up a stand on a sunny day. Add a catchy sign or use reusable cups to stand out.



Handmade Flowers Crafter

Use silk, paper, or fabric to make beautiful flowers, then sell them for birthdays, Mother's Day, or school events. Wrap them nicely for extra style points.



Tech Fixer

If you love gadgets, learn how to repair small things like phone screens or computer issues (under supervision). Once you're good, charge a small fee to help others.



Tutor Hero

If you're great at math, reading, or another subject, help younger students study. You can do it after school or online—and build your confidence while helping others!



Young Podcaster

Start a podcast about your favorite things—sports, games, or jokes! Ask adults to help record and edit. Grow your audience and earn from sponsorships later.



Kid Music Maker

Write and record original songs or beats using free apps. You can sell them online or license them for use in videos and games. You can also build your own studio and make beats for rappers and singers!



DJ for Parties

If you love music, learn to mix songs and DJ at small parties or family events. Start by creating fun playlists that get everyone dancing.



Snack Seller

Buy chips or candy in bulk and sell them at school (if allowed) or around your neighborhood. Keep prices fair and your presentations neat.



Car Washer

With a sponge, bucket, and soap, you can clean cars in your driveway or near community events. Safe, simple, and satisfying work on sunny days!



Toy & Tech Reseller

Collect old toys or game systems, clean them up, and sell them online or at a yard sale. Post clear photos and explain how they still work great.



Dog Walker or Pet Sitter

Many people need help walking their pets or watching them when they are busy. Be kind, responsible, and always keep pets safe.



Yard Helper or Landscaper

Rake leaves, mow grass, or shovel snow depending on the season. You'll get fresh air, build muscles, and earn cash while helping neighbors. If you look around in suburban and rural neighborhoods, you will see a lot of landscaping companies. People are making good money owning these companies!



YouTube Kid Creator

Create fun, educational, or entertaining videos. You can teach a skill, tell stories, or review toys—but always get permission before posting!



Jewelry Maker

Design bracelets and necklaces with beads or strings. Sell your creations at craft fairs or online. Personalized items make great gifts!



Art Card Designer

Create artwork for greeting cards or posters. Scan them and sell digital or printed copies online. Mixing art and entrepreneurship is magical!



Book Buddy

Love reading? Start a book club for younger kids and charge a small fee for snacks or storytime materials. Reading together builds community.



Mini Photographer

If you enjoy taking pictures, practice with family events or scenery. Offer to take portraits for friends or neighbors. Learn basic editing for a professional look.



Recycling Champion

Collect recyclable bottles or cans, return them for cash, and turn it into a weekend business. You'll help the planet while earning sustainably.



Online Seller

Make crafts, draw art, or create cool digital designs to sell via Etsy (with adult help). It's a great way to learn online business skills early.



Birthday Party Helper/ Event Planner

Offer to help set up, decorate, or clean up at birthday parties. It's simple, social, and can become a steady weekend gig.



Mini Chef or Baker

If you love cooking, bake cookies, cupcakes, or healthy snacks and sell them at local events—with adult supervision and food safety in mind.
