Since the last update Woodridge Forest Patrol (WFP) has:

- Completed numerous area patrols, clubhouse checks, pool checks, MUD property checks, and playground checks.

• Notable Events:

- WFP – Dog from xxxxx Windward Meadow got out and ran up to a family scaring a young child. The officer helped to get the dog. It was returned home and the child was not harmed.
- WFP Assisted MCSO on theft of a package. Suspect info gathered and circulated via social media and the East MCSO Patrol and HPD. This suspect has committed thefts around several neighborhoods in Kingwood. Possibly following the delivery trucks.
- WFP A New Cany school bus and a resident had a minor accident, causing the bus to have to stop her route. One of the parents became angry due to the bus driver, stating that she cannot release some of the kids, then blocked the bus with her car. The appropriate police agency (NCSID) was contacted by the bus driver and made the scene and was able to move the residence car and allowed all parents to retrieve their students off the bus. Once that was completed the bus and Officer also cleared.
- WFP engaged with several residents who expressed their appreciation for our ongoing presence.
- WFP Two dogs got lose I located them found the owner and assisted with tracking them down and returning them both dogs were returned safely to the

home.

- WFP Autumn Water resident said people will fish at 12 - 3 am, and would like for us to run them off.
- WFP contacted two individuals preparing to fish in the mud pond, provided information regarding designated fishing areas, and clarified catch-and-release regulations.
- WFP Adult male with a shopping cart and bike at Soaring Woods and Forest Lake. He was a criminal trespass warning and will be arrested if he returns.
- WFP Mcso had a call for a suspicious backpack on Woodridge parkway in the traffic circle. They were able to clear the backpack without incident. And open the roadway back up..
- WFP Arrest was made of a resident by MCSO, during the arrest two MCSO units were injured.
