#### • Notable Events:

- WFP – Spoke to the resident who is having ongoing issues with kids from a nearby high school and advised her the officers that work the neighborhood are aware of the issue and will be looking out for suspicious activity. Contact was also made with Humble ISD PD by the patrol officers.
- WFP Tx plate xxxxx blue ford focus. Parked at the clubhouse. Patrol spoke to the lady and she advised she had a flat tire and was waiting for someone to come change the tire back right tire was flat. Patrol advised if she left it parked there that it may get towed due to the parking lot being private property and they don't want abandoned vehicles there. She advised she was not staying or leaving the car. Plates come back clear.
- WFP- While on an area patrol driving through the intersection of acre woods and brass bell..observed two dogs not on leashes jumping on kids and adults that were out with them. The adults advised me that the dogs were loose and not there's. Patrol was able to get the dogs on leashes and controlled. Patrol asked mcso to contact animal control but they were unable to come out. Patrol even attempted to contact BARC out of Houston but was not able to get with them either. With the assistance of the residents using the neighborhood pages we were able to find the owner and get the dogs back to them. The dogs were

not aggressive and got loose by breaking a board in the fence.
