VISITATION OF THE SICK/HOUSEBOUND: Fr. Isidore will visit the sick and the housebound this week; from Wednesday through Friday

LUKE 10:38-42: While on earth Jesus became the guest of Martha and Mary. Like Abraham, Martha bustled about to prepare the very best for a guest she honoured and respected. Unlike Abraham, she became so anxious about the practical side that she began to lose sight of the really important part of welcoming a guest: that of giving him her loving and receptive attention. Jesus does not need us to busy ourselves doing thousands of jobs we think he might find useful; he wants us to welcome him with a young child's enthusiasm, to be happy in his presence, enjoying his company and learning at his feet through a loving relationship.

PARISH HERITAGE DAY: What a lovely day we had! Thanks to everyone who helped make it such a successful day. Even though it was not specifically a fund-raising event nearly £500 was donated on the day. Matthew Noon also raised £150 doing his 5k every day in June. We have now raised over £4,200. Thank you very much for your ongoing generosity and support.

SEA SUNDAY: Seafarers and fishers play a vital role in all of our lives, but they often work in difficult, hazardous conditions. We are celebrating Sea Sunday this weekend. It is when the Church prays for all those who live and work at sea, and for the ministry of Stella Maris, the Catholic Church's agency that looks after seafarers and fishers. Please pray for seafarers, fishers and their families.

CONFIRMATION: The celebration of Confirmation for our young people was a very lovely occasion and was very well attended. Thanks to everyone who help prepare the church, joined in with the celebration on the day, to the catechists who prepared the children, and to all the altar servers who gave up their Friday evening to serve the community.

DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE TO LOURDES departs for Lourdes this week, with the theme 'With Mary, Pilgrims of Hope'. There are almost 430 pilgrims this year, which is the biggest number since covid. Whilst in Lourdes they will be praying for us and have asked that we pray for them and join with their pilgrimage intentions: For peace in the world; For every human life to be held sacred; For the new evangelisation of our country and for the increasing number of young adults seeking faith and Baptism; For our new Holy Father, Pope Leo, in his supreme apostolic ministry; For the renewal of our local church by new and generous vocations especially to Marriage as the foundation of the family; to the Priesthood, the vocation on which all other vocations depend; to the Permanent Diaconate in its generous service; to the Consecrated Life of women and men in its radiant witness; and for the apostolic life and apostolate in the midst of the world.

JULY DEVOTION: July is the month traditionally dedicated to the Precious Blood of Christ. O Jesus, who during all the days of Your earthly life, consoled so many sufferers, healed so many infirmities, raised so often a sinking courage; have pity on my soul who cries to You from the depths of my desperate hope.
