JOHN 10:11-18: The image of the good shepherd is so full of thorough caring and security that it has been a source of comfort for centuries. In the beautiful 22nd/23rd Psalm David took the standpoint of the sheep being led by his Lord, the shepherd. His own experience of tending his father's sheep gave him particular insight and sympathy. It is quite possible that as a child Jesus also tended the village sheep, and he would certainly have known David's Psalm. So it is particularly apt that he should take the same beautiful image and refer to himself as the Good Shepherd. There is all the difference in the world between being a hired man and being the shepherd to whom the sheep belong. Working as usual from the practical situations that his hearers would understand, Jesus explains the kind of love he has for us; it is costly love – responsible and completely dedicated. His death proved his words could be trusted; and as we live in his risen life that same unlimited love will blossom and fruit in us.

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY: As we keep the Fourth Sunday of Easter, also known as Good Shepherd Sunday, we are asked to pray especially for vocations to the priesthood. Good Shepherd Sunday is always a world wide day of special prayer for vocations to the priesthood, and we pray especially for those new vocations we need

to serve our own Diocese of Shrewsbury. We need to pray even more insistently for more priests to serve the people of our Diocese, and we are asked to join in praying for this intention in our daily prayers, maybe offering the rosary or morning prayer for vocations to the priesthood. 'The harvest is rich, but the labourers are few. Let us ask the Lord of the harvest to send more labours to his vineyard.' (Luke 10:2)
