MARY READ: The funeral for Mary Read will be at 10am on 16<sup>th</sup> May, at St Mary's Church. Mary died in April, aged 89, and some of you will remember her from when she came to the Mass. We also took communion to her on Dewsnap Lane. Mary has no family and if you do remember her, please try to come to her funeral.

**JOHN 15:9-17:** We have the perfect example of loving in Jesus himself. He was able to show us the sort of committed, responsible caring that God has for us, worked out in practical, human ways. He was filled with compassion and sympathy for the bereaved, the crippled, and the diseased, and used his power to comfort, heal, visit, encourage, and feed. He was sensitive to people's needs – even their unspoken needs – and listened

to what they said. He had no invisible boundaries, so no-one was ignored or considered unimportant. He deliberately cut across social and religious strata, making friends over a very large spectrum. He spent many hours on his own in prayer, was obedient to the Law, worshipped with the community and was prepared even to lay down his life for us humans, whom he loves. We are offered not only the example but the power as well. If we commit ourselves whole-heartedly to Christ, his love in us will turn us into exceptionally beautiful people – people whom the world desperately needs.

**FEAST OF THE ASCENSION:** On Thursday we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension, which is a holy day of obligation. **Mass will be at St Paul's in the morning and an evening Mass will be celebrated at St Mary's.** It is a celebration of Jesus' triumphant return to Heaven, His commission to His apostles, and the fulfilment of His redemptive mission. It is a significant moment in Christian faith, commemorating Jesus' bodily ascent into Heaven after His resurrection and is a joyful occasion during which we reflect on the significance of Christ's ascension and His continued presence with us. *O Christ God, You have ascended in Glory, Granting joy to Your disciples by the promise of the Holy Spirit. Through the blessing they were assured That You are the Son of God, The Redeemer of the world!* 

MAY DEVOTION: This year we are encouraged to say the Rosary as a family and dedicate our prayers asking for World Peace. Immaculate Mary, help us to conquer the menace of evil, which so easily takes root in the hearts of the people of today, and whose immeasurable effects already weigh down upon our modern world and seem to block the paths toward the future. From famine and war, deliver us.

THE UNIVERSAL LIVING ROSARY ASSOCIATION: 'To conquer the entire world, all souls for Christ through the Immaculate Heart of Mary'. The Living Rosary Association has left some rosary beads for parish members to take home and use to pray the Rosary. Three minutes is all it takes to join millions of people throughout the world. Together we pray the Rosary, to bring the world back to God.

VISIT OF PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE & FATIMA RELICS: On Saturday 15th June, from 10.00am-4,00pm, the World Apostolate of Fatima will visit the parish of Our Lady & St Christopher, Romiley, with the relics of Saints Jacinta and Francisco and the Centenary Pilgrim Statute of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The statue was blessed at the Chapel of the Apparitions in Fatima. Pope St John Paul II invited us to receive the light of Fatima. The Fatima message of reparation, repentance and peace is still relevant to us today. The day includes Mass, Confession, film on the story of Fatima and Investiture and Enrolment of the Brown Scapular for those who wish to receive it.
