

A non-profit group of volunteers whose purpose is to develop, construct, and maintain natural surface trails optimized for mountain biking at Willow River & Kinnickinnic State Parks in WI.

- WIKI has constructed 43 miles of trail since 2021.
- Our trail networks are thoughtfully designed for all riding abilities—from easy green routes to more challenging black trails.
- We strive to build strong minds, bodies, character, and community through cycling.

WIKI is part of the Friends of Willow River & Kinnickinnic State Parks, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. Together with the Wisconsin DNR, we organize and fund supplemental projects that enhance and support both parks.







WIKI has constructed over 16 miles of trail at Kinnickinnic State Park and more than 27 miles at Willow River State Park. These trail-building efforts represent over 15,000 volunteer hours and have created a trail network valued at more than \$2,000,000.

WIKI is now entering the final phase of its building plan and will require the following resources over the next three years to bring these projects to completion.

2026 - \$80,000

- General Maintenance and Minor Enhancements \$20,000
 Existing trails at Willow River and Kinnickinnic State Parks
- Willow River Brook Trout Trail \$60,000
 General rehabilitation, major enhancements, and 0.75 miles of new trail construction


2027 **—** \$106,000

- Willow River Bike Playground \$50,000
 Expanded features and design modeled after Kinnickinnic
- Bass Trail Rehabilitation & Construction \$56,000
 - Re-route sections of Large Mouth and Small Mouth trails to improve flow and sustainability
 - Add wood features on both trails
 - Addition of feature-rich, intermediate-level downhill

2028 - \$70,000

Willow River Screech Owl Trail — \$70,000
 Construction of a 1-mile, feature-rich expert technical trail, including advanced wood features

WIKI's mission is to create trails that embody the three components of sustainability as established by the Bureau of Land Management:

- Environmental the landscape and what it can sustain
- 2. Social the intended use
- **3. Economic** maintenance and upkeep of the trails

By adhering to these principles and strategies, WIKI has succeeded in building some of the best mountain bike trails in the Midwest.

Willow River & Kinnickinnic trails are now home to over 500 high school student-athletes and coaches who train there regularly.

Additionally, families that camp at Willow can now mountain bike, making it an outdoor activity destination spot.
