

# Measured Holiness

## Wisdom from Modern-Day Daniel Unpacked

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### Stanza 1

#### Scripture Foundation:

#### Insight:

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### Stanza 3

Promotion whispers, “Bend a line; no one will trace the seam,”

#### Scripture Foundation:

- **Luke 16:10** — “Whoever is faithful in little is faithful also in much.”

#### Insight:

Compromise is rarely catastrophic at first — it is incremental. Daniel’s life proves integrity is cumulative. Small bends weaken spiritual sharpness. Measured Holiness guards the “altar flame” — the place of devotion — against subtle erosion.

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### Stanza 4

#### Scripture Foundation:

- **Daniel 6:10** — “As he had done previously.”

- **Hebrews 13:8** — “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.”

#### Insight:

Measured Holiness is not reactionary. Daniel prayed before speaking into power. Modern outrage cycles demand immediate response, but Scripture commends kneeling before speaking. Eternal stability steadies temporal volatility.

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## Stanza 5

I may not face a lion's den with teeth and shadowed breath,

### Scripture Foundation:

- **Daniel 6:16–22** — The lion's den.
- **Matthew 10:28** — “Do not fear those who kill the body...”
- **Psalms 15:2** — “He who walks blamelessly...”

### Insight:

Modern lions are reputational, financial, relational. The fear of loss tempts compromise. Daniel chose faithfulness over survival instinct. Measured Holiness prefers truth over comfort because God sustains those whose lives are internally aligned.

### Scripture Foundation:

### Insight:

Daniel did not control Babylon's policies; he controlled his posture. Measured Holiness does not attempt to dominate culture — it resists drifting within it. Leadership influence begins with inner governance.
