November – Work with your Post to present a program on Veterans Day or read to a classroom. Provide much needed items for classrooms for National Education Week.

January – Ask schools to allow you to do a bulletin board about scholarship opportunities with the American Legion Family.

February –Spread the word of the national scholarships due March 1st. More than 80 are awarded each year and some are designated for non-traditional students.

March – Volunteer to read in your schools on Read Across America Day, also known as Dr. Seuss' birthday, on March 2nd.

April – Sponsor a party for the military children in your schools. Purple-Up! Day on April 15th.

May – Send thank you notes to teachers to show your appreciation in the week of May 5th – 9th. Submit a report to your Department Education Chair by May 15th highlighting all the Education activities your Unit or District has participated in.

June – Attend Department Convention so you can hear about what other Units and Districts are doing for their schools and how they are raising funds for scholarships.

July – Pay your dues so you can continue to support all ALA programs. Start planning Education activities for the upcoming school year.

August – Promote American Legion Auxiliary and American Legion scholarship opportunities.

Scholarships for the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Alabama are four year scholarships, but are awarded annually. To reapply, the recipient must have a 3.0 grade point average and a completed application on file in the above named office.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE COMPLETED IN APPLICANT'S OWN HANDWRITING, stating qualifications, age, need, etc., must be accompanied with a complete transcript of grades of High School and/or College Record, three (3) letters of recommendation from school, church, and a friend/neighbor (must be non-related to applicant), a small photograph, and proof of relationship (birth certificate) must accompany application with a copy of Service Record of Veteran (parent/grandparent) attached. (Please do not send the original Discharge). The applicant (boy or girl) must be a resident of Alabama, as must the veteran through whom they are applying. The value of the scholarship for each year is \$850.00. No money will change hands, credit will be given for books, tuition and board costs at each facility.

Evaluation of each application will be conducted by the American Legion auxiliary Scholarship Committee. Each application shall be reviewed and scored on a point basis in relation to each item listed on the official application form. No application will be considered for review which does not contain all requested information in one envelope. DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS TO REACH ABOVE OFFICE IS APRIL 1ST OF EACH YEAR. OTHERWISE, THEY WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR JUDGING.

If all required material is not included in one envelope, no consideration will be given to that application. Scholarships, once awarded, cannot be transferred from one campus to another. Copies of all grade transcripts for each semester must be provided to this organization to maintain a complete record on each recipient.

Please be sure all papers and information requested have been included with your application. The Scholarship Committee will meet immediately after April 1st to award these scholarships.
