## ma ke aio o: presence

Ma ke aio o means Presence and is the concept of showing up for Presence of God being present with you another person(s) in the community structure. One of our communities we focus on, is our Makua Mauna.

With the advent of the global pandemic, we want to make sure the Kupuna in all five Maunaloa Kupuna facilities in Makua will continue their operations with COVID 19 by providing food services through monthly groceries for the next 5 months (September 2020) - February 2021. We have succeeded in a greater scale of the initiative with 1 month's worth of groceries for the Kupuna Maunaloa Kupuna with 75 residents in April 2020. 1 month's worth of groceries for the Kupuna Maunaloa Kupuna with 75 residents in April 2020. 1 month's worth of groceries for the Kupuna Maunaloa Kupuna, Pūhala, and Maunaloa Kupuna, making 400 residents in August 2020. Our goal is to continue to partner with community members to meet spiritual and non-spiritual needs, offer food and Kupuna care services (Maunaloa Kupuna), and total food businesses to increase both economic and material support for them, but most importantly, life.



## ma ke alo o: presence

Ma Ke Alo o means Presence, and we're a people who believe in the Presence of God, being present with one another and present in the community around us. One of our communities we focus on, is our Kaka'ako Kupuna.

**PROJECT: Kaka'ako Kupuna "Food for 500": Provide 1 month's worth of groceries for the next 6 months (Sept 2020 - Feb 2021) for residents in all three low-income Kupuna facilities in Kaka'ako:**

Na Lei Hulu Kupuna (76 residents),  
Pohulani (263 residents),  
Honuakua (150 residents).

With the advent of this global pandemic, we want to make sure the kupuna in all three low-income senior living facilities in Kaka'ako will minimize their exposure risk to COVID-19 by providing food access through monthly groceries for the next 6 months (September 2020 - February 2021). We have succeeded in a smaller scale of this endeavor with 2 week's worth of groceries for one location (Na Lei Hulu Kupuna with 76 residents) in April 2020, 1 month's worth of groceries for the same location in June 2020, and 1 month's worth of groceries for all three locations (Na Lei Hulu Kupuna, Pohulani, and Honuakaha, totaling 498 residents) in August 2020. Our goal is to continue to partner with community members via direct donations and non-perishable donations, other food and kupuna care non-profits (i.e. Hawaii Food Bank), and local small businesses to increase both awareness and material support for these, our most vulnerable, citizens.

# A SUMMARY OF LEVITICUS

The **Book of Leviticus** is the third book of the Bible found in the Old Testament and was written by Moses. Leviticus focuses on Moses and his older brother Aaron. This Book gets its name from Levi; the tribe of Israel that were designated to serve as priests who were the sons of Aaron. It is a continuation of the story we read in Exodus. Leviticus sets strict laws, regulations, and instructions for the priests to perform sacrifices and ceremonies in the Tabernacle as well as the duties of the Israelites on how to live a holy life through sacrifice and worship. Because they lived in Egypt for hundreds of years, Levitical Laws were put in place to redirect them back to God's law, as many of them had adopted Egyptian customs and idols. Discover how the new nation is directed into right living with God set with clear and direct examples.

Leviticus begins with the laws concerning the five main offerings; Burnt Offering, Grain Offering, Fellowship Offering, Sin Offering, and Guilt Offering and how to prepare them.

Aaron and his sons are installed and ordained into the ministry of the priests. Aaron's sons Nadab and Abihu died after their decision to add to an unauthorized sacrifice. The Lord reveals laws regarding personal purity and makes a distinction between clean and unclean. They include clean and unclean food, purification after childbirth, regulations for skin diseases, regulations for mildew, cleansing from skin diseases, cleansing from mildew, and discharges that cause uncleanness. These laws correlate to modern medical practices as we are experiencing right now with COVID-19, to provide protection against the spreading of germs or viruses. These principles promote health and well-being.



# LEVITICUS



Yom Kippur, also known as the Day of Atonement, the holiest day of the year is observed by Jews as a day of atonement and repentance. The Lord gives more laws pertaining to Holy Living. They are eating blood prohibited, unlawful sexual relations, various laws for Holy Living, punishment for sin, regulations for priests, acceptable and unacceptable sacrifices, the annual feasts, rules for oil and bread in the Tabernacle, punishment for blasphemy, the Sabbath and Jubilee Years, Covenant Blessings and Curses, and regulations for offerings vowed to the Lord. The reward for obedience and consequences of disobedience wraps up Leviticus.

Sin is always detestable in God's sight. His plan was that all sin must be atoned for by the offering of sacrificial blood; as fulfilled by the blood of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. God never waivers or changes. Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever. Hebrews 13:8.
