* PREAMBLE: Law as Living Frequency

Common Law 101 (CL-101), known as the Alignment Protocol, establishes the foundational compass by which the Mathias El Tribe conducts lawful reasoning, governance, and relational enforcement. It is not merely a set of legal postulates, but an internal doctrine of lawful coherence—a self-governing principle rooted in ancestral wisdom, spiritual awareness, and logical consistency.

This principle stands as both a shield and a mirror: a shield against incoherence and external imposition; a mirror to ensure inner clarity, ancestral rhythm, and alignment with universal law.

CL-101 stands for Common Law 101—Common not by simplification, but by shared frequency and harmonic understanding. Law that is known in the heart, affirmed in the spirit, and confirmed through conscious alignment.

SECTION I: PURPOSE AND SCOPE

CL-101 applies to all tribal proceedings, public notices, private instruments, internal deliberations, external declarations, and sacred agreements recognized by the Mathias El Tribe Supreme Court and its

instrumentalities. It affirms:

- The sovereignty of clear thought, lawful action, and spiritual alignment.
- The rejection of external systems that operate in deception, coercion, or contradiction.
- That self-determination and legal reasoning are inseparable from personal and collective alignment.

SECTION II: INTERPRETIVE STANDARD

CL-101 provides the interpretive lens through which all foreign or domestic claims shall be viewed when interacting with the Tribe:

1. Law must align with logic.

- Any code, statute, or ruling that contradicts reason, spiritual law, or tribal clarity is void within this jurisdiction.

2. Identity is not subject to external redefinition.

- No entity may redefine the Tribe's existence, history, or status for administrative or jurisdictional purposes.

3. Alignment supersedes assumption.

- If a policy, action, or decision is misaligned with the foundational rhythm and sovereignty of the Tribe, it may be lawfully rejected.

SECTION III: AUTHORITY IN APPLICATION

CL-101 may be invoked at any time by:

- The Chief or duly appointed officials of the Mathias El Tribe.
- Any tribal citizen acting in lawful protection of the trust.
- The Mathias El Tribe Supreme Court, in all official filings, notices, and judgments.

When invoked, CL-101 invalidates any action taken in bad faith, misclassification, misrepresentation, or foreign coercion.

SECTION IV: RELATION TO OTHER LAWS

CL-101 aligns with, but is not limited by, the following authorities:

- Public Law 93-638 (Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act)
- United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP)

- Indian Canon of Construction
- The Treaty of Dancing Rabbit Creek (1830)

Where any external law conflicts with CL-101 in a way that causes spiritual, legal, or logical misalignment, CL-101 shall prevail within the jurisdiction of the Mathias El Tribe.

SECTION V: NOTICE AND STANDING

Posting of CL-101 serves as public and spiritual notice to all entities-foreign, public, private, or administrative-that the Mathias El Tribe governs in accordance with its own alignment.

This is not a plea.

This is a living doctrine of lawful being.
