He was sort after and commissioned by reputable London fashion and advertising agencies including Saatchi & Saatchi, TBWA, Yellowhammer, O & M, Young and Rubicon, GGT, Carlson Direct, MSBK, Publicis, Coca-Cola, British Telecom, British Airways, Walt Disney, Lloyds TSB, Sheraton hotels and Jaguar.

Nick's current projects are a step away from the rock music industry. Several conceptional dark art projects, set to amaze and shock its audiences, are a series of pictorial autobiographical fine art images depicting the tormented and ravaged mind of Elliott, inspired by a cascade of personal events that shaped him during a traumatic time in his life. 

Prize Caravaggio, Contemporary Art Curator Magazines Artist of the Future, and more.

Howard Harris serves as a Trustee of The Kansas City Art Institute and has won the Who's Who Worldwide Lifetime Achievement and the USA Small Businessperson of the Year. His work is shown internationally and represented by galleries in the United States, U.K., and Europe and appears in the South Korean Yukyung Art Museum.

LAURA WALDUSKY is an American artist living in the UK.

In 2001 she graduated with an MFA from Parsons School of Design in NYC. Her powerful, large works on paper are depictions of her real-life experiences and, sometimes painful, emotions that she desires to express. She has shown her art internationally, and her work is in private collections in the USA and UK. She has exhibited her work internationally at exhibitions and art fairs such as Red Dot Miami, Affordable Art Fair, and she had a solo exhibition organised by Saatchi Art at the Hoxton Hotel in London. Her upcoming exhibitions include Aqua Art Miami in December 2022.

Artist about her work: "When I start a blank sheet of paper, I have no idea where the lines are headed. Each piece I create is born out of moments and experiences where I felt powerless and exposed. While these memories can be painful to recall, the scraping of the pencil into the paper is a meditative process that allows me to exert control over the materials where I previously had none, transforming my vulnerability into my strength. In that sense, the patterns become empowering timelines of events as I recast them and serve as autobiographical representations of my feminist perspective."

LISE LADOUCEUR is a Canadian artist who was born in Sept-Îles, Québec. After graduating from the Art & Media Technology school in the province of Québec in 1986, she worked in advertising for 18 years.

Art has always been a big part of her life, but it wasn't until 2017 that she really got into it. She found herself glancing out the window and then at images of her family and friends on her cell phone one day while resting in a hospital room and attempting to get better. She then began to sketch pictures using her phone's drawing apps. She had all the time in the world and nowhere to be, after all. Her joy grew as she realised she had an immediate outlet for her creativity, and she was motivated to strive harder to better. It wasn't long until she figured out a unique way to create art on her phone, which opened up a whole new universe of possibilities.

Cellar or PhoneArt entered her life when she had no other artistic outlets through which to express her feelings. She's been working on her own art skills for the past six years.

"Art for me is very important. It gives me the possibility to connect all my creativity and make something real out of it. But it also gives me the opportunity to talk about mental health disease."

$MEFIO\,$ is a contemporary abstract painter who lives and works in London.

She obtained a BA in Modelmaking from the Arts University Bournemouth in 2008 and has worked with a variety of mediums, including metals, resins, ceramics, and computer-generated artwork. Later on, these vital talents were put to use in the creation of ornamental glassware. Her art is defined by symmetry and mathematics, beautiful iridescent colours, and hypnotic patterns. Metallic film overlay is created using a combination of gilding, decals, foiling, and precisely placed glazes, a wonderful blending of methods that makes it one-of-a-kind. She took part in the Luxemborough Art Prize 2020, and her work has been displayed in London exhibitions.

MASKED SPHINX studied fine art painting at Camberwell and Norwich Art Schools (1997) and lives and works in London.

Her art explores the emotional effects of the unconscious; bringing into play a visual mashup of universal symbols, mysterious landscapes and biomorphic forms that connect directly to sexuality, spiritual awareness and growth.

Masked Sphinx has curated and exhibited in several large-scale projects, events and exhibitions including the Uniqlo Tate Lates, Tate Modern (2018), a solo exhibition at Conway Hall, London (2017) and in group shows that include the Gerald Moore Gallery, Dulwich Picture Gallery, Guys Hospital and the Stephen Lawrence Centre. She ran South London Women Artists (2013-2016) and during this time she was the founder and editor of ArtVerve, a journal on women's art (2014-2017).

FRANCESCO RUSPOLI was born in 1958 in Paris, Ruspoli has been the recipient of several important international awards and medals such as the Eugene Fromentin Award and Gold Medal in France, Masters Award and Honorable Award in the USA, Gold Medal in China, Honorary Award of Distinction and Honorable Award in the UK, Silver Medal in Italy.

Ruspoli's work is distinct, strong, and bold, with a clear message; he is an artist with his own voice who explores the entire spectrum of human interaction. he is also intrigued by the way contemporary society is evolving and is reflecting on social environments, familial cells and social classes.
