



Mars Applefest History 1985 - 2024

In the early 1980s, the owners of Treesdale Farms, Mars PA ⁽¹⁾ had more apples than they could sell. Since they needed to find a home for the apples, the apples were donated to the Mars Chamber of Commerce. The Chamber put the apples in a large crate on the corner of Pittsburgh Street and Grand Avenue, where citizens of Mars could pick apples as they wished.



In 1984, five local business owners met and decided it was time to turn this into a tradition, but they knew they could not stop at just apples. They wanted to feature apple pie, apple cider, apple turnovers, apple dumplings and anything else that could be made from apples. ⁽²⁾ The Chamber of Commerce subsequently developed to be known as the Mars Business Association.

Thus, in 1985 Jim Lasher, President of the Mars Business Association, led his fellow Martians to launch Mars Applefest. The festival's main goal was to generate business and awareness for the town of Mars. Mars having its own flying saucer in the town square just wasn't enough.



When Treesdale Farms yielded their last apple harvest in 1990, apples were consequently purchased to be resold during Applefest. The festival grew from a fledgling community event with a few vendors and support from town businesses, to what today is a major event in southern Butler County, PA. ⁽³⁾

Jim guided Applefest for 18 years, but stayed involved for an additional 4 years. Gail Carpenter (2003-2008) rose to the occasion to Chair Applefest for 5 more years, where attendance and vendor participation continued to grow and draw attention to Mars. ⁽⁴⁾

In 2009, when the Mars Business Association concluded as an organization, the Mars Ministerium took over under the direction of Reverend Gary Weston. ⁽⁵⁾

In 2010, there was an agreement that Rich-Mar Rotary ⁽⁶⁾ would assume the management of the event. Jack Kimbell, General Manager for Treesdale Country Club was president of the Rotary Club for this transition. ⁽⁷⁾



Since 2010, the Rotarians of Mars and Richland, PA, dedicated volunteers, have organized and supported this wonderful community event. Today, with direction from the Rich-Mar Satellite Club and assistance from Rich-Mar Main Club and the Appalachian Mission Satellite Club, Mars Applefest continues to dominate the Fall Festival scene.



In 2023, with 150 vendors, Applefest drew between 9,500 to 10,000 attendees.

Proceeds from Mars Applefest sustain Rich-Mar Rotary's 3 clubs and their specific civic missions.
