## Modern Slavery Statement

This statement is made pursuant to Section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. It sets out the steps taken by Wessex Fabrications Ltd to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking in its business operations and supply chain.

Wessex Fabrications Ltd is an Architectural and Structural Steel Manufactures with approx. 10 – 20 workers both employed and self employed. We have approx. 50 suppliers across many sectors that are all detailed within our supplier chain summary. It is important that should any risk be identified we conduct due diligence within our supply chains and operations.

Modern slavery is a crime resulting in an abhorrent abuse of human rights. It is constituted in the Modern Slavery Act 2015 by the offences of ‘slavery, servitude and forced or compulsory labour’ and ‘human trafficking’.. Modern slavery and human trafficking are abhorrent and we welcome the UK Government’s introduction of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and the requirement on businesses to report on activities taken to combat slavery

Our commitment to our customers is very clear, we will always treat people in our business and supply chain fairly. We are committed to

- Provide employees with good working conditions, fair treatment and reasonable rates of pay
- Respect workers’ human rights and comply fully with all applicable laws
- All work must be voluntary, and not done under any threat of penalties or sanctions
- Workers must not pay any deposits for work, and employers – whether labour users or recruiters – must not keep original copies of identity documents.
- Indentured labour is prohibited, and workers must be free to leave work at any time, with all salary owed to be paid.
