Paul said that "one sows, another waters, but it is God who gives the increase."

You have heard me say in the past that often times when a repentant sinner comes to Jesus Christ as his personal savior, all too often he then receives the church doctrinal statement and basically "rules of conduct". Here at United Holiness Church of the living God, we act such and such, we do so and so and we refrain from some things while embracing other things.

If you are to mature in the faith, you will follow our example, they say.
