

The Plan That God Has Set in Motion

The plan that God has set in motion since the beginning makes so much sense. It takes a foolish mind to reject it.

Notice how the Old Testament and the New Testament work together to weave out a perfect plan in His hands. Customs that were established by the Jewish people fit right into the end time plans of our Heavenly Father.

Take for example the issue of Abraham and his son Isaac.

When it comes time for Isaac to find a bride, Abraham calls his “unnamed” servant to go and find a bride for his son Isaac. Isaac is in a figure the Lord Jesus. Abraham is a figure of God the Father, and the unnamed servant is a picture of the Holy Spirit.

The unnamed servant was to find a bride for his son – Isaac. Obviously, the ministry of the Holy Spirit today is to find a bride for the Son Jesus. Jesus Himself tells us that the mission of the Holy Spirit today is not to talk about himself, but to reveal who Jesus is.

So the Holy Spirit is out there today finding a bride for the Son.

Several things to understand here. Abraham instructed that the bride was to be from His people. Obviously, this speaks of the “elect” of God for His Son – Jesus Christ.

When the unnamed servant (Holy Spirit) finds this woman (Rebecca) to become a bride for the Son, he would not speak of Himself, but would reveal to her this man Isaac.

When the unnamed servant asked Rebecca (a picture of the bride of Christ) if she will come with him to meet his master – Isaac, she agreed to go with him

Isaac was meditating (**Genesis 24**) in the evening time when he looked up and saw Rebecca and the “unnamed servant” coming toward him, Rebecca “lifted up her eyes” (as the Church is instructed to do today) and she saw Isaac. She dismounted her camel and asked the servant who this fellow was – his answer, that is my master, Isaac.

She placed a veil over her face and ran toward him.

The servant then told his master Isaac all that had transpired, and Isaac then brought her into his mother’s tent where they immediately married.

Now it is of interest to me that from the time Abraham was following God’s direction to take his son – Isaac- and offer him as a sacrifice in **Genesis 22**, until we see the unnamed servant sent by Abraham to find a bride for his son in **Genesis 24** that we do not see the man Isaac mentioned in scripture.

Wonder why that is?

Could it be that in a picture after Isaac was offered as a sacrifice in **Genesis 22**, that this corresponds to the time between Jesus on the cross at calvary and the time the unnamed servant presents the bride to be, to the Lord Jesus at the rapture of the Church?

Could it be that we are living in that period of time right now? Ie, Jesus waiting for the direction from His Heavenly Father to go “get His bride” while the Holy Spirit is going throughout the entire earth searching for a bride for the Lord Jesus.

Isaac representing the Lord Jesus, Abraham representing the Heavenly Father, the unnamed servant representing the Holy Spirit and Rebecca representing the Church are all necessary parts of the puzzle.

Tradition of the Jewish people tells us that from the time the unnamed servant was going after the bride to be, that Isaac (representing Jesus Christ) has gone ahead and is “preparing a place for the bride.

Isn't that what Jesus said in **John 14:2** – “I go to prepare a place for you” – the Church?

Wow beloved, what kind of place can this be? Jesus has been working on it for over 2,000 years.
