

From the Desk of the Pastor...

From the end of February until last Saturday our parish buried three of our own. I was not able to share this reflection in last Sunday's bulletin but I would like now to write a bit about Rosemary Zagorsky, whose funeral took place one week ago today.

Rosemary lived a long and faithful life, passing peacefully at the age of ninety-four. A lifelong resident of the Carnegie area, and worked as an executive secretary to philanthropist Leon Falk Jr. After marrying her high school sweetheart, Walter Zagorsky, she devoted herself to family life. Obviously, I only got to know her since moving to Carnegie but I was impressed by her kindness and good wit.

Those who knew Rosemary remember her especially for her kindness and thoughtful consideration of others. Scripture reminds us, "A kind person benefits himself" (Proverbs 11:17), and Rosemary lived that quiet virtue in a steady way.

For Deacon Myron and me, some of the most meaningful moments came when we would visit Rosemary at her home to bring her Holy Communion. She always looked forward to receiving Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist. In those visits one could see clearly the heart of a believer who knew where true comfort lies.

Rosemary was also blessed with a devoted son. Tom showed the love of a faithful son by ensuring that his mother was well cared for and surrounded by dignity in her later years. His attentiveness and care were a beautiful example of honoring one's parents not only in youth but throughout life. Young people, take special note!

Many parishioners will also recognize Rosemary through her family connection to our own Jean Daniels, who was her sister-in-law.

Through all the years of her life Rosemary loved God and found great solace in her Catholic faith. As St. Paul writes, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (Philippians 1:21). May the Lord whom she loved and received so faithfully now grant her eternal rest.

Icon teaching commemorated on the Fourth Sunday of Great Lent (St. John Climacus).




Christ


