Sunday Before the Exaltation of the Cross

From the Desk of the Pastor...

Dear Bishop Bohdan,

On behalf of Holy Trinity parish permit me to express how eager your flock is to greet you! As the children gaze upon your vestments, I would like to turn this into a teachable moment for them. For example, despite its opulence, your mitre symbolizes Christ's crown of thorns reminding us of His humility, as well as the kingly exaltation awaiting those bishops who serve the flock faithfully. Likewise, the eagle mats under your feet during liturgy symbolize your calling to soar above earthly cares and lead the people to higher, heavenly things.

This talk about symbolism in vestiture reminds me of an old-fashioned symbol of an ox gazing at an altar and a plow. Beneath the image is a motto: "Ready for either." The Roman ox was not only a beast of burden but also a beast of sacrifice. It had to be ready for either a short life ending in bloodshed or a long, hard life pulling a plow. The first Roman Christians were a lot like the Roman ox. They too had to be ready for a short life, ending in bloodshed, or a long life of pulling the plow (witnessing to Jesus in a hostile society). The fate of the first Christians could easily become that of us modern Christians as well.

Your Grace, as we think about the fate of Ukrainian Catholics in Russian-occupied territories it compels us to ask, 'how prepared are we for such a fate?' Jesus was prepared for his fate "to be lifted up," as evidenced at the beginning of his ministry in a conversation with Nicodemus, as found in today's Gospel. Clearly, we are not oxen, nor are we Jesus. We are weak and sinful. Nevertheless, under your care, we are called to be like both Jesus and the oxen by being ready for our fate. If we fail, we will not consider it a disaster: we will look at St. David, Sts. Peter and Paul, each of whom failed and repented and found God's mercy. The only true disaster that can befall us is to feel ourselves at home on earth.

Just as the ox in that old image stood between the altar and the plow—ready for sacrifice or service—we too are called to live with our eyes fixed on God. The church building reminds us of this truth. As we behold the new golden domes you blessed today high above us, we know they are not mere decoration, but theology in architecture. Shining like the firmament, they lift our gaze heavenward, declaring that the Christian life is not bound by earth alone. As St. Paul writes, "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (Phil.3:20). From the beginning, God ordained that His temples orient His people upward. When Solomon dedicated the first Temple, he prayed, "Hear from heaven, your dwelling place; and when you hear, forgive" (1 Kings 8:30). Thus, the architecture of our church joins Scripture's witness with your vestiture: our true direction is toward Christ. The domes gleam with the promise that, as St. Paul says, "When Christ... appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory" (Col.3:4). They remind us we are pilgrims on earth, but heirs of heaven.
