



2026 APPLICATION & RESIDENCY GUIDELINES

Thank you for your interest in the Adisa Ancestry Artists Residency (AAAR). We look forward to welcoming the inaugural artists for this year's residency period.

Residency Dates:

- March 15 – March 29, 2026 (2-week Residency)
- April 5 – May 24, 2026 (Option: 1 or 2-month Residency)
- May 31 – June 28, 2026 (1 month Residency)
- July 12 - July 26, 2026 (2-week Residency)
- September 6 – November 1, 2026 (Option: 1 or 2-month Residency)
- November 29 - December 13, 2026 (2-week Residency)

- Applications are accepted and reviewed on a rolling basis. Applicants must submit their materials at least 30 days prior to their intended residency start date.

- Each application requires a non-refundable application fee of \$20 USD, payable after submission via Paypal. Applications will not be reviewed without payment.

Residency Fees & Responsibilities

- **Residency Fee:** \$750 USD for a 2-month residency period, \$400 for a 1- month period and \$200 USD for a 2-week residency period. This fee covers utilities, maintenance costs, and biweekly cleaning.
- **Transportation & Food:** Artists are solely responsible for their own transportation and food. We will provide support and recommendations where possible.
- **Visa & Travel Requirements:** Artists are responsible for securing necessary travel documents. While we cannot sponsor visa applications, we can provide a letter of acceptance.
- **Materials:** Artists must provide their own materials for the completion of their work.



Residency Policies

- **Prohibited Activities:** Smoking and drug use are strictly forbidden on the property. Any evidence of smoking will result in early termination of the residency.
- **Visitors & Occupancy:**
 - Spouses, partners, children, or pets are not permitted.
 - A maximum of two artists may reside at AAAR at any given time.
 - All visitors must be approved in advance by the residency administration.
Overnight visitors are not allowed.

Residency Requirements

- Maintain residence at the AAAR home and studio for the duration of the residency.
- Focus solely on the creative project outlined in the application (no external employment allowed).
- Engage with the community by offering a reading, performance, or discussion session about the work completed during the residency.
- Allow AAAR to publicize images and excerpts from their work for promotional purposes.

Selection Criteria

- **Artistic Excellence:** Demonstrated through work samples, resume, and artist statement.
- **Career Impact:** Potential benefit to the artist's career, as shown in the work plan.
- **Diversity:** AAAR seeks artists from various disciplines, identities, and geographic backgrounds.

Application Process

- Applications are accepted and reviewed on a rolling basis. Applicants must submit their materials at least 30 days prior to their intended residency start date.
- A non-refundable \$20 USD application fee is required. Once you have completed your application, please email adisaconsultingja@gmail.com to receive payment submission instructions.
- To apply, complete the application questions and submit your written responses as a PDF attachment to adisaconsultingja@gmail.com.
- Completed applications will be reviewed by the selection panel, and applicants will be notified via email.
- Each artist may participate in only one residency per year



Application Materials

- Artist Bio: A brief overview (500 words max.) of your current and past work.
- Resume/CV: A document (3 pages max.) listing education, work experience, publications, awards, and past residencies.
- Work Plan: A one-page document describing your goals for the residency and how the program will benefit your creative practice.
- Work Samples: Recent work that best represents your artistic practice.
 - Composers/Musicians: 3-5 recordings.
 - Visual Artists: At least 5 high-quality images of work.
 - Writers: 10 pages of prose or poetry.
 - Playwrights/Screenwriters: 10-page excerpt.
 - Performance Artists: 2 short video excerpts (max 5 minutes each).
- References: List people who know you as an artist and can attest to your work or work practices. References will be contacted by phone or email.

Work Sample Guidelines

- Submit work in an accessible format for review.
- Please provide links whenever possible.
- You may include hyperlinks or use a PDF with embedded links to your work samples.
