At age eight, Emilia McCarthy (left), now 17, doubled for Elle Fanning as Brad Pitt's desert-wandering daughter in *Rabbit*, while *Saw* franchise vetress Niamh (pronounced Neeve) Wilson, also 17, has been paying income tax since she was five. So when it came time to play the Young Hollywood heirs hanging off teen idol Benjie (Evan Bird) in David Cronenberg's upcoming Los Angeles satire *Maysie at the Stars*, they knew the territory. "In L.A., I totally met people who were like that," Oakville, Ont., native Wilson says of Benjie, a cocky, Bieber-esque teenager fresh from rehab. "Being in show biz I think you gain a maturity," says McCarthy, who has already moved from Ancaster, Ont., into her first Toronto apartment, her parents taking turns as her roommate. Compared with L.A., Canadian sets are "like family," says Wilson, citing the camaraderie of the Toronto *Degrassi: The Next Generation* set, where she plays Jack, the new queer girl in town. The role has generated fan interest in two things: her lipstick (M.A.C's Ruby Woo) and her sexuality. "Until this point, I have only dated boys," she says. "But that could change at any time. Life happens." ●
