# Tulips

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## **Tulipa 'Amazing Parrot'** ☀️

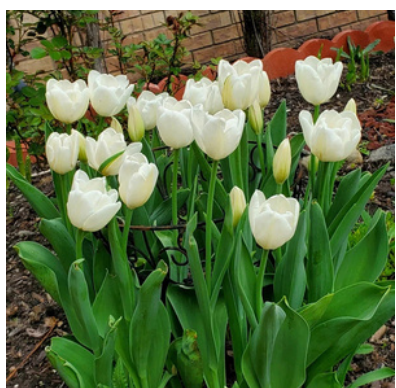
A flamboyant parrot tulip bursting with lively color and ruffled edges—perfect as a garden showpiece or dramatic cut flower.

Height: ~20-22"

Flower Color/Form: Large feathered blooms in shades of rose-red, apricot, orange, and golden-yellow with dramatically ruffled edges.

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Mid to late spring (April-May)



## **Tulipa 'Hakuun' (Darwin hybrid 'White Cloud')** ☀️

Elegant and dependable, this pure-white Darwin hybrid is excellent for heat-prone regions and long-lasting arrangements.

Height: 18-20"

Flower Color/Form: Pure, long-lasting white blooms; heat tolerant

Light Requirements: Full sun; tolerates heat

Bloom Time: Mid spring (April)



## **Tulipa Mayflower 'Menton'** ☀️

A beloved late-season tulip with enormous blush-pink blooms that seem to glow in the garden. One of our favorites for extending the tulip season with an incredibly long bloom time and romantic cottage-garden charm.

Height: ~18-20"

Flower Color/Form: Large apricot-pink blooms with soft rose and peach tones that deepen and change color as the flowers mature.

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Late spring (May)

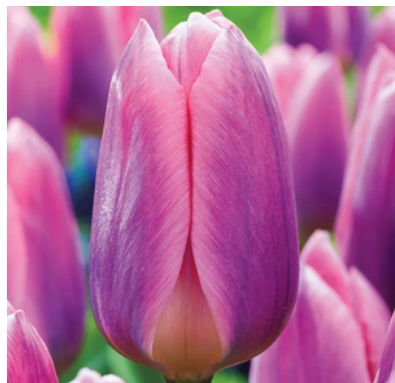
## *Bulb Tip*

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After your flowers bloom in the spring, feel free to snip off the faded flowers, but be sure to leave the leaves in place until they've yellowed and withered. That green foliage is hard at work helping your bulbs store up energy for next year!



# Tulips



## **Tulipa darwinhybrid 'Light and Dreamy'**

Classically shaped, candy pink flowers marked with lavender and pale edging come back year after year.

Height: ~18-20"

Flower Color/Form: Purple or pink blooms, classic tulip shape

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Mid spring (April)



## **Tulipa 'Rainbow Mix' Variety Blend**

An economical way to achieve a stunning, rainbow display in your garden. Bulk format ensures vibrant spring color throughout bloom season.

Height: ~18-20"

Flower Color/Form: A vibrant blend of red, yellow, purple, pink, white—designed for large, cheerful displays

Light Requirements: Full sun to part sun

Bloom Time: Mixed bloom times (March-May)

## *Bulb Tip*

Want your spring garden looking colorful for as long as possible? Mixing early, mid, and late-spring bloomers can keep the flowers going from March all the way into June!

# Daffodils



## **Narcissus 'Golden Ducat'**

An early/mid-spring standout, this opulent double daffodil adds bold, golden texture, ideal for mass plantings and fresh bouquets.

Height: ~16"

Flower Color/Form: Large, double golden-yellow blooms resembling peonies

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Early to mid spring (March–April)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant





# Daffodils



## **Narcissus 'Double Replete'**

Mid-spring elegance in a double-headed package; excellent for fresh-cut bouquets and naturalizing with returning reliability.

Height: 15"

Flower Color/Form: Double blooms with white outer petals and pink centers

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Mid spring (April)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant



## **Narcissus 'Double Duo'**

A dreamy double blend in soft pinks and whites; ideal for pastel-themed borders or as low-maintenance showpieces in containers.

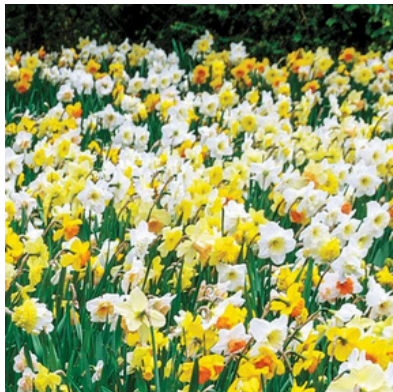
Height: 12-16"

Flower Color/Form: Blend of white-centered doubles with pink and yellows

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Early spring (Late March–Early April)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant



## **Narcissus 'Shade Tolerant' Variety Blend**

Brightens shady corners with staggered blooms; naturalizes beautifully while adding multi-season interest.

Height: 12-18"

Flower Color/Form: Variety of pastel yellows, creams, and pinks

Light Requirements: Full sun to full shade

Bloom Time: Mixed bloom times (March-May)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant



## **Narcissus 'White' Variety Blend**

A refined, fragrant mix of whites perfect for woodland settings, containers, or alongside darker foliage for a crisp spring statement.

Height: ~14-16"

Flower Color/Form: Blend of 'Obdam', 'Ice Follies', and 'Thalia'

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Mixed bloom times (March-May)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant



# Dainty Daffodils

## Inspo Pic

*We LOVE these dainty daffodils! With each only growing to about 10 inches high, these are the cutest little accent to your bulb garden. (Check out how adorable the Minnows look layered with hyacinths and tulips!)*



### **Narcissus tazetta 'Minnow'**

Blooming in clusters on each stem, these absolutely darling miniature daffodils are perfect for layering into borders, pathways, and container gardens.

Height: ~10"

Flower Color/Form: Petite creamy-white petals with soft buttery-yellow cups in clustered blooms

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Mid spring (April)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant



### **Narcissus cyclamineus 'Tête-à-Tête'**

One of the most beloved miniature daffodils for good reason—these tiny golden blooms arrive extra early and create the sweetest cheerful drifts throughout the garden. Excellent for naturalizing and tucking into borders or lawns.

Height: ~10"

Flower Color/Form: Bright golden-yellow miniature trumpet blooms

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Early to mid spring (Early March-April)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant



# Alliums



## **Allium ampeloprasum 'Ping Pong'** ☀️🦌🐝

A playful, long-blooming allium with durable, spherical blooms that transition from pink to white. Great for pollinators and as an architectural focal point.

Height: 20"

Flower Color/Form: Blooms start pink, aging to bright white globes

Light Requirements: Full sun

Bloom Time: Early to midsummer (Jun-Jul)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant. Attracts pollinators



## **Allium 'Globemaster'** ☀️🦌🐝

An imposing summer bloomer, Globemaster delivers towering purple balls (*up to 10 inches in diameter!*) that forge dramatic structure and attract pollinators.

Height: ~32"

Flower Color/Form: Rich purple globes

Light Requirements: Full sun

Bloom Time: Summer / blooms for weeks

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant. Attracts pollinators



## **Allium aflatunense 'Purple Sensation'** ☀️🦌🐝

A garden classic—Purple Sensation provides bold, spherical purple blooms that elicit visual drama and floral interest year after year.

Height: ~18-20"

Flower Color/Form: Rich violet-purple globe-shaped blooms atop tall sturdy stems

Light Requirements: Full sun

Bloom Time: Late Spring (May)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant. Attracts pollinators

## *Bulb Tip*

Want to see more pollinators in your garden? Plant Alliums! Their tall stems and globe-shaped blooms are one of the absolute favorite spots for chunky little bumblebees to perch and snack.



# Hyacinths



## **Muscari armeniacum 'Grape Hyacinth'** 🌞🦌🐝

A spring garden classic. These tiny blooms spread beautifully over time and look especially magical woven beneath tulips and daffodils.

Height: ~6-8"

Flower Color/Form: Deep violet-blue bell-shaped flowers in grape-like clusters

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Mid to late spring (April-May)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant. Attracts pollinators



## **Hyacinth 'Royal Trio Blend'** 🌞🦌🐝

A regal mix bringing fragrance and mid-spring charm to beds and borders.

Height: ~8-12"

Flower Color/Form: Fragrant spikes in shades of blue, pink, and white.

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Early to mid spring (March-April)

Notes: Deer/rodent resistant. Attracts pollinators

## *Bulb Tip*

Tired of deer and bunnies treating your garden like a salad bar? Good news! Daffodils, Alliums, and Hyacinths are plants they typically avoid, making them some of the most reliable spring bulbs for critter-prone gardens.

# Crocus



## **Crocus sieberi 'Tricolor'** 🌞🦌🐝

One of the prettiest early spring crocus varieties. A tiny but mighty flower that brings joyful color to the very beginning of spring. Perfect for planting in lawns.

Height: ~4-6"

Flower Color/Form: Lavender petals with bright golden centers and crisp white throats.

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Late winter to early spring (Feb-Mar)

Notes: Not deer/rodent resistant. Attracts pollinators



# Crocus



## **Crocus vernus 'Golden Yellow'** 🌞 🦌 🐝

These cheerful golden blooms are among the very first signs of spring, popping up through chilly soil with bright sunny color. Beautiful planted in drifts through lawns, pathways, and sunny garden borders.

Height: ~4-6"

Flower Color/Form: Yellow, cup-shaped flower

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Early spring (March)

Notes: Not deer/rodent resistant. Attracts pollinators



## **Giant Crocus Mix** 🌞 🦌 🐝

Crocus mixes bring early-season cheer in a flurry of pastel purples, whites, and yellows and are perfect for naturalizing lawns and garden beds.

Height: ~4-6"

Flower Color/Form: Purple, white and yellow cup-shaped flowers

Light Requirements: Full sun to part shade

Bloom Time: Early spring (March)

Notes: Not deer/rodent resistant. Attracts pollinators

## *Inspo Pic*

*Crocus may be tiny (usually only about 6 inches tall), but they're mighty! These little early-spring bloomers are one of the first food sources for hungry pollinators after winter, and they're often planted right in lawns since they bloom and fade away before the grass even needs its first mow of the season.*





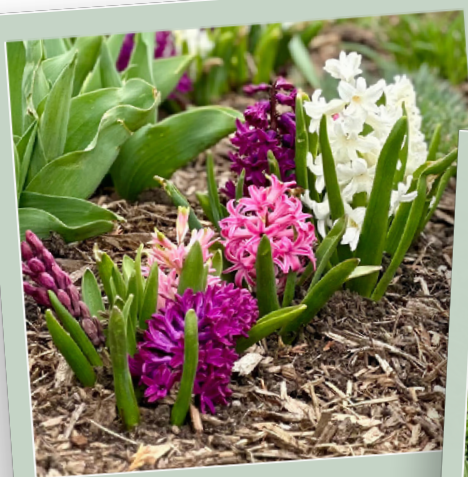
# Kayla's 2026 Bulb Recipe!

All four photos shown below were taken of the same Garden Groomer Farmette garden bed during Spring 2026.

**This was Kayla's absolute favorite bulb combination of Spring 2026 at The Garden Groomer Farmette!**

What made this combination so special wasn't just the colors—it was the way each variety overlapped with the next, creating beautiful blooms for months.

The show began with the fragrant **Royal Trio Hyacinths** in early spring, followed by the crisp white blooms of **White Cloud Tulips**, creating a fresh, luminous display that caught your eye from across the garden.



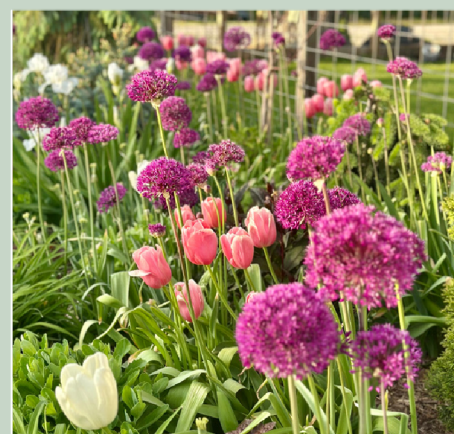

Soon, the soft pink **Menton Tulips** took center stage, blooming alongside the White Cloud Tulips to create a soft, romantic blend that felt effortlessly elegant. And for the grand finale, the dramatic **Purple Sensation Alliums** emerged, extending the display well into late spring while providing a favorite food source for pollinators.

**Kayla's only tweak for Fall 2026?** Adding a drift of Double Duo Daffodils between the hyacinths and tulips for an even smoother succession of color!

## Bulb Tip

Spring bulbs make the biggest impact when planted in generous groups and drifts.

The GG Farmette garden bed pictured above contains **hundreds of bulbs**, including approximately 75 Hyacinths, 150 White Cloud Tulips, 150 Menton Tulips, and 100 Purple Sensation Alliums.

Kayla's verdict? *"Next year, we're planting even more."*

Bulb orders are due by **Friday, August 14th**. Quantities are limited, so don't miss your chance to turn your garden into a spring showstopper!

Once we receive your order, our team will reach out to schedule a tentative planting session for **October** or **November**. If you're already booked for fall maintenance we'll coordinate your bulb installation into one of those visits, no extra appointment needed.

Bulbs are priced between **\$1-\$4 each** (shipping included), making it easy to add bold spring color to your garden. No upfront payment is required—we'll simply invoice you after installation is complete.
