

Genesis 9:14-15: "and I will remember My Covenant," (20)

Again, just as in Genesis 8:1 where Scripture says, "God remembered Noah" this word remembered has nothing to do with remembering. God does not, can not, forget. This is

another example of human language (all languages) not being up to the task of expressing what's going on. In both cases, and subsequent cases, I believe this is better described as, "then God turned His focus once again," or "then the time had come for God to ..." or "at the appointed time." etc. so, 14-15: for example: "The time had come where God instituted a covenant between Himself, man, and all living things not to destroy all life using flood waters."

Genesis 9:16 My opinion, in order to remove remember, is: "and it will be the everlasting covenant between God,"

Genesis 9:17 The repeat of verse 16 ↑.

Genesis 9:18-19: Notice that Scripture is very clear that

Noah, Ham, Shem, and Japheth repopulated the whole earth. This is important because this means that all other people on the earth had been wiped out! And as we noticed, two weeks ago Eight people multiplying for the last 4373 years (2348 B.C. → 2025 A.D.) equals the population we currently have. Not to mention that all nations, tongues, and tribes have a retelling of a flood in their history! This means that the flood waters covered the tallest mountain on earth, Mount Everest, which is 29,031.7' high (that's 5,498 miles tall) or that after the flood Mount Everest sprung up out 29,031.7'. Both are unfathomable. Both are child's play for God. We can never forget that this is the same God who created mankind, animals, and the infinite ever expanding Galaxies out of thin air just by speaking them into existence. (See printout for ^{secular} proof of a worldwide flood).

Genesis 9: 20-28 Noah becomes a farmer and plants a vineyard. At some point he got drunk and something lewd happened. We know that Ham took advantage of Noah's drunkenness. This led to Noah cursing Ham's son Canaan. Why did he not curse Ham? Because the son is cursed for the father's action, and because of Noah being a prophet he saw that Ham's lineage through Canaan would result in the immorality of the Canaanite peoples many centuries later. Remember that after God had delivered the Israelites He sent them to the promised land and told them to walk in and take it, for He would drive out the evil Canaanites with hornets. Verse 28 says, "So all the days of Noah were nine hundred and fifty years, and he died". It might be (?) important to take note that the Bible does not give us anything about Noah's last 350 years on earth. Did Noah's sin, his part in the sin, lead to Noah losing his salvation? Absolutely Not!

Noah's faith counted him as righteous and that means that Noah's past, present, and future sins were covered by the shed blood of the promised Messiah, the Lord Jesus Christ. THIS IS BY NO MEANS A LICENSE TO SIN!

Hebrews chapter 11 is filled with saved saints who: lied, swindled, cheated, killed, adulterized, had multiple wives and concubines who openly worshiped other Gods, had children with women outside of Israelites and one definitely in heaven saint even denied and cursed knowing Jesus Christ. Romans 8:1 says, "There is therefore now no condemnation in those who are in Christ Jesus."

Genesis 10: 1-7 No need to read these Genealogies.

Genesis 10: 8-12 Cush (descendant for Ham - verse 6) begot Nimrod the ruler, king and person that we know as the architect of The Tower of Babel.

Verse 9 says, "He (Nimrod) was a mighty hunter before (22) the LORD (capital LORD is Yaweh or Jehova). And from that Scripture the common phrase "Like Nimrod the mighty hunter before the LORD..." came about. This has nothing to do with hunting. This simply means he was a ruler/leader (mighty) who shed much blood (hunter), and before the Lord means he stood before God in opposition.

Genesis 10: 13-32 more geneology and topical (references to borders. No need to read.

Genesis 11: 1 "The whole earth had one language and one speech. The original language that God spoke to Adam and Eve."

Genesis 11: 2-4 These two verses are very important. They (Nimrod and his people) said, "let us make bricks, let us build ourselves a city, and a tower whose top is in the heavens; let us make a name for ourselves," This is them literally saying, "we can build ourselves a tower and then we can overtake heaven."

To make a name for ourselves is to be ordained king. This means that they march to the orders of satan. Their ideology is the lust of the flesh, the pride of life (to be like God) and the lust of the eyes. And they do all this with a sense of urgency saying, "Come" (Now). Being minions of satan they also have the awareness that God will react to their plans and scatter them across the whole earth if they don't do this quickly.

Side note: satan knows that his time is short (a few thousand years compared to eternity) yet he doesn't relinquish. he knows that God will react yet he continues to press forward with his evil. This is the same mindset of the fallen. We read it in the study of Revelation. The lost saw that God's righteous judgement had been poured out on them and what did they do? They shook their fists at Him. They hid from Him.

in the mountains wanting the rocks to fall on them. (23)
Never repentance. Not once! Their foolish hearts had
been hardened. And Nimrod is the pinnacle poster child

for this. Not only did he want to overthrow heaven but
he also, on the side with inspiration from satan, was the founder
or planter of all false religions! Prior to Nimrod and the
Tower of Babel there was only One God (plural Elohim) to be
worshipped. Not even debatable! Everyone knew that God, Jehova,
Elohim, Jehova, and the Lord were all names for the One
and only true God. The creator of the Universe. All that
changed during the Nimrod "empire". At the end of verse
4 we read that Nimrod also knew that being caught by
God could lead to them being "scattered" a broad over the face
of the whole earth.

Genesis 11:5: God knew every square inch of what this tower
looked like long before it was ever built. This does not imply
that God had to come down to see for Himself. This does
however make very clear that God the Son, the visible image
of the invisible God / the Pre-incarnate Lord Jesus did come
down and walk amongst it. There are many instances in our
study of Genesis that we will encounter this. These are called
Theophanys.

Genesis 11:6 The Lord said, "Indeed the people are one (united in
evil)..... now nothing that they propose to do will be withheld
from them". This means the their purposed evil will have no
bounds, humanly speaking.

Genesis 11:7 Elohim (the Triune Godhead) says, "let Us"...
So Elohim confused their language by making them all speak
a different language. These are all the languages of the
present day world. God also "teleported" them in groups
all over the planet. This explains how the account of

the flood was found in every language around the world, all with tweaks of different gods and religious symbolism as we just witnessed in the global flood accounts. (24)

Again, this is ^{further} conclusive proof that the Bible is absolutely God's Word. Another thing was that Scripture mentioned that the Tower of Babel was built where asphalt was present (11:3). This Scripture led the Anglo-Persian Oil Company of Masjid-Sulaiman to drill for oil in the region in 1908. Since where there is asphalt, there is oil. Another of the proofs of God's word.

Genesis 11:10-23 Shem's descendants through Nahor. (No need to read).

Genesis 11:24-26 Nahor → Terah → Abram (our Abraham).

Genesis 11:27-32 Terah takes Abram, Lot (whose father Haran died), and Sarai (our Sarah) and headed to Canaan. But God did not let them make it to Canaan only to Haran where they settled until Terah died. Why? Because Terah was an idol worshipper who served other Gods. We learn that in

Joshua 24:2: And Joshua said to all the people, "Thus says the LORD God of Israel: 'Your fathers including Terah, the father of Abraham and the father of Nahor, dwelt on the other side of the River in old times; and they served other gods. (Abraham came from a whole tribe of pagan god worshippers. And God could not make a nation out of him until he split from his family) Hence:

Genesis 12:1-3 God tells Abram to leave his family. Totally (except for Sarai), Abram needed to even leave Lot behind.

Why? Because when God is working His will in our lives, or in Abram's case His will to make of him a new nation, set aside and God's special nation, all ties to the former must be cut. When we are born again our old lives have

died, we have been made new. And as we continue to be refined we can not also sleep around our old sin nature! Any ties to the evil past must be severed, like cancer.
