

### A LABOR MOVEMENT FOR A MORE JUST WORLD

### THE ORIGINAL BROOKWOOD

Founded in 1921, Brookwood Labor College was considered the Harvard of organized labor. Brookwood saw the labor movement as an instrument for workers to achieve higher wages and better working conditions with the ultimate goal of a new social order free from exploitation and a good life for all. Unique for its time, the Brookwood faculty and student body were both co-educational and multi-racial. Brookwood educated more than 600 students between 1921 and 1937. They went on to lead the largest organizing campaigns in US history.

### MISSION AND VISION

New Brookwood Labor College strives to address racial, economic, and social imbalances of power by educating workers into their class and by building a labor movement that uses the power of organization not merely to lift individual workers or worksites, but to create a more just world.

### **EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY**

Like the original Brookwood, New Brookwood Labor College is non-accredited and offers no grades or diplomas. We exist to serve students who are interested in building a militant labor movement. Curriculum is rigorous, expectations are high, and work produced in the College will advance both the immediate needs and long-term goals of the labor movement.

- Working Class History
