Your Board has been very busy since our April 2024 annual meeting. Highlights include finalizing the maintenance on both groomers, successful trail grooming grant applications to the Mat-Su Borough and the State of Alaska, securing proper permitting for our trails, working on additional easements, finalizing (work in progress) GPS coordinates to update our trail maps, working on securing a surveyor to finalize requirements for the easement on the crossover at Lake Tyone, working with the Louise, Susitna, Tyone Community Association to finalize the information needed to secure Borough property and Safety Building, developing a 5-year plan for equipment replacement (Big Foot), continuous updates to our web-site and many other activities necessary to support an organization such as ours.

The maintenance, upkeep and grooming of this area's large trail system by our Club are essential for safety and community support. With that said, **we need more volunteers** to step up and lend a hand. We had some great turn-outs last year and let's see if we can even see more of you turning out to help. Contact the <u>Trail Boss</u> if you can give us a hand. Many of you may not realize it but this club maintains over 310 miles of trails. You can keep up on club news, winter schedule of activities and the recent weather by <u>logging in on our website</u>. Keep an eye on our <u>Facebook Page</u> also.
