Get Ready For Fun and Sun: Pool Opening

The Cotswolds & Oaks HOA is happy to announce that the Banbury and Snowshill pools will open for Spring/Summer on Friday, April 16th. For the Banbury pool, we have ordered new tables, chairs, loungers, and umbrellas that we hope you will enjoy and take care of. As the pools open, we just wanted to remind you of the pool rules and regulations that are put in place for your safety and maintenance of the areas:

POOL RULES

- NO lifeguard on duty Swim at your own risk.
- Pool closes at 9:00 pm Sunday Thursday. Pool closes at 10:00 pm Friday & Saturday
- Pool use is restricted ONLY to Cotswolds & Oaks Home Owners Association members in good standing and invited guests. Limit guests to 4 per household
- Children 12 years or age or younger may NOT use the pool unless supervised by an adult (18 years of age of older.)
- NO diving.
- NO running, pushing, foul language, general roughhousing or unbecoming behavior will be tolerated. Please keep conduct in a manner promoting a family environment.
- NO food or drink within 4 feet or in the pool. NO glass containers of any kind is permitted.
- ALL alcoholic beverages MUST be placed in a plastic or steel cup.
- NO open flame or grilling inside the gated area or on the deck.
- NO leaning or climbing the fence.
- NO smoking or other tobacco products on the premises.
- NO loud music. Personal music devices only.
- NO animals, skateboards, roller blades, bicycles or scooters allowed inside the fence or on the deck.
- Appropriate swim attire ONLY no cutoffs or thong swimsuits.
- ALL babies or children not potty trained MUST wear swim diapers.
- Please clean up after yourself. Place all trash in the receptacles provided.
- Parking is reserved for Cotswolds and Oaks resident pools ONLY.

Failure to observe ANY pool rules may result in suspension, loss of pool privileges, or fines. Report any incidents or unsafe conditions to the

School Bus Laws: When to stop and when not to!

It is estimated that over 50,000 motorists illegally pass buses every

single day. In October 2019, we learned of 9-year-old girl and her twin 6-year-old brothers being struck and killed by a pickup truck as they crossed the road to board a school bus. The driver was arrested and charged with three counts of homicide and one misdemeanor count of passing a school bus when arm signal device is extended.



The State of Alabama school bus law

forbids drivers from passing a stopped school or church bus on **any** road. The only exception would be drivers traveling on a divided highway of at least four lanes, provided the driver is on the opposite side of the thoroughfare from the stopped bus. The law also establishes a uniform penalty statewide for motorists who illegally pass stopped buses:

1st Offense	fine: \$150 to \$300		
2nd Offense	fine: \$300 to \$500	License suspended: 30 days	100 hours community service
3rd Offense	fine: \$500 to \$1,000	License suspended: 90 days	200 hours community service
4th Offense	fine: \$1,000 to \$3,000	License suspended: 1 year	prosecuted as a Class C felony
