Short Term Rentals: What To Know

Auburn's History for Short Term Rentals

In November 2018, Mayor Ron Anders appointed Ward 4 Councilperson Brett Smith, Ward 6 Councilperson Bob Parsons and Planning Commission members Robert Ritenbaugh and Marcus Marshall to the Short-Term Rentals Task Force. As short-term rentals become more popular and prevalent in Auburn, the task force continues to work with residents and stakeholders to move forward with creating regulations for short-term rentals in the Auburn City limits.

The task force consists of Mayor Ron Anders, Councilperson Brett Smith, Councilperson Bob Parsons, Marcus Marshall, Bob Ritenbaugh, Anna Solomon, Evan Crawford and Bruno O. Ulrich.



From December 13, 2018, and throughout January 2019, a public comment period was held to receive input on a draft ordinance prepared by the Auburn Planning Department. Based on that and other public input, a new draft update to the City Code was prepared by the Auburn Planning Department. The Short-Term Rental Task Force sought additional input on an updated draft throughout April 2019. In January 2020, the Planning Commission held a work session to discuss the proposed areas in which short-term non-primary rentals would be permitted in the City. The Planning Commission held additional work sessions on Sept. 9 and Oct. 5, 2020, and recommended approval of the proposed ordinance at a Jan. 25 special called meeting.

Short-Term Rentals Ordinance (adopted March 16, 2021)

In March 2021, after years of debate and discussion, the city of Auburn now has an ordinance on the books to regulate short-term rentals, as the City Council approved the draft ordinance submitted by the Planning Commission. The Council passed on a 5-3 vote Mayor Ron Anders' amendment that again prohibited short-term rentals in those neighborhoods in the Neighborhood Conservation, Development District Housing, Limited Development and Large Lot Residential districts. Short-term rentals are also prohibited in the Corridor Redevelopment –West and Neighborhood Redevelopment districts east of North Donahue.

The approved ordinance takes a two-tiered approach to regulating short-term rentals either as "homestays" or "short-term non-primary rentals." Both uses would be allowed in those zones that allow up to five unrelated people to live under the same roof. Homestays must be the permanent residence of the owner and may not operate more than 90 days per licensing year when the owner is not present, while STNPRs need not be the owner's permanent residence and are limited to operating 240 days per calendar year.

Cotswolds & Oaks Covenant Restrictions for Short-Term Rentals ARTICLE VI - USE AND DEVELOPMENT RESTRICTIONS

Except as otherwise provided to the contrary in Section 5.13 above and in this Section 6.01, each Lot and Dwelling shall be used for single-family residential purposes only allowing only one unrelated person to the Owner to live in the Dwelling, and no trade or business of any kind may be carried on in or from any Lot or Dwelling; provided, however, that any Additional property may be used for attached or detached town houses, condominiums, cooperatives, duplexes, zero-lot-line homes, and cluster or patio homes for residential dwelling purposes. The use of any portion of a Dwelling as an office by an Owner shall not be considered a violation of this covenant if such use does not create regular customer, client, or employee traffic. The leasing or rental of a Dwelling for residential purposes only shall not be considered a violation of this covenant so long as the lease (1) is for not less than the entire Dwelling, and (b) is otherwise in compliance with the rules and regulations promulgated and published from time to time by the Association; provided, however, that Developer shall have the perpetual right to designate from time to time any Dwellings owned by Developer, its successors and assigns, which may be leased for such periods of time as Developer may determine. Notwithstanding anything provided in this Section 6.01 to the contrary, the Property of any portion thereof, including , specifically, and Lots constituting any portion of the Property, may be used and developed for (i) any of the uses included in the definition of Common Areas and (ii) any uses permitted under applicable zoning ordinances affecting the Property; provided, however, that in the even any portion of the Property is to be developed or used for any purpose other than Common Areas, single-family residential purposes, or any of the residential uses authorized above for Additional Property, then such use must be approved in writing by the ACC.
