## Philanthropy Spotlight

Last month we participated in IFC's Greek Bowl and Dance Marathon, both benefiting the Child Life Program at Palmetto Health Children's Hospital. IFC's Greek Bowl is a flag football tournament between fraternities at USC, that raises money for Dance Marathon, a 14-hour no-sitting, no-sleeping dance marathon that celebrates the culmination of a year's worth of efforts to raise financial and emotional support for the patients of Palmetto Health Children's Hospital.



We had 15 brothers participate on the Greek bowl team and 31 brothers attend the tournament, raising \$990 for Dance Marathon. We then sent 24 brothers to the Dance Marathon event and raised a total of \$3,891 for the kids. Eric Alling, Dylan Harnett, and Grant Singleton stayed for the whole 14 hours, as well as Dance Marathon staff members, McLemore Alexander and Andrew Cashmere. In the upcoming month we have a bowling night to raise money for Relay for Life and Clays for Cause, which raises money for the USO.
