Dear Small Municipal Water Provider,

The Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) has reviewed the 2021 Annual Water Withdrawal and Use Report (Report) for HIGHLAND PINES DOMESTIC WATER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT. Based on submitted data of water supplies, deliveries, and use, ADWR has calculated Lost and Unaccounted for Water (L&U).

All Small Municipal Water Providers within an Active Management Area (AMA) shall not have an L&U that exceeds fifteen percent (15%). **If both the annual and 3-year average L&U exceeds 15%, you are non-compliant** and must contact the AMA Municipal Planner and Data Specialist within 30 days of this notice to submit a Remedial Action Plan to achieve compliance.

DEFINITION

Chapter 5 Section 701 (20)

Lost and Unaccounted for Water (L&U) is defined as the total water from any source, except direct use effluent, withdrawn, diverted or received in a year minus the total amount of authorized deliveries made by the municipal provider in that year. Lost and unaccounted for water includes line leakage, meter under-registration, evaporation or leakage from storage ponds or tanks, system and hydrant leaks or breaks, and illegal connections.
