Resolution Protecting and Strengthening Children and Families in Colorado:

Whereas, it is a fundamental responsibility of civil government to protect and strengthen the primary building block of society called the family, and

Whereas, there are currently forces at work in the super-majority Democrat Party presently controlling Colorado state government and public schools to reframe the traditional definitions of boys and girls, and

Whereas, these traditional definitions are based on biologically distinct and scientifically proven physiological differences, and
