On behalf of the Diversity Committee, School Board of Broward County, I forward to you this Committee's annual response to the Superintendent's Annual CCC Settlement Agreement Status Report for 2010 - 11.

Sent to you in this report are: (1) Recommendations in response to ongoing gaps revealed in *SUPERINTENDENT'S CCC LAWSUIT SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT STATUS REPORT, 2010-11;* and, (2) Observations and Concerns from Diversity Committee's 10 school site visit reports completed in 2010-2011.

The Diversity Committee found the district to be <u>Out of Compliance</u> / <u>Not in Compliance</u> with the terms of the *CCC Lawsuit Settlement Agreement*, 2000. The 2010-2011 year is the eleventh consecutive year in which this district was not in compliance.

Though Broward County has made incremental progress toward closing the identified achievement and opportunity gaps reported in SBBC staff assessments of data presented in each of the nine CCC Conditions and related indicators, this district has never been in full compliance with the terms of this lawsuit settlement agreement.

Perhaps, as part of the 2012 – 2015 Strategic Plan process, this district will commit to identifying, implementing and pursuing actions that will lead to 100% compliance with the terms of the CCC lawsuit settlement agreement and, by extension,, to 100% graduation of ALL of Broward school's students.
