Hierarchy	Meaning	Practical Example
E	Eliminate	Work from Home
R	Reduce	Split shifts, less people within the workplace at any one time, making adjustment to how tasks are undertaken
	Isolate	Self-Isolation if symptomatic, making adjustment to how tasks are undertaken
С	Control	Physical barriers to keep workforce apart
Р	PPE	Masks, gloves
D	Discipline	Asking workforce to keep 2m apart
