SHE WALKS IN WEALTH

But thou shalt remember the LORD thy God: for it is He that giveth thee power to get wealth, that He may establish His covenant which He sware unto thy fathers, as it is this day.

—DEUTERONOMY 8:18

DEVOTIONAL

God has given you the power to build a thriving organization. It is He who can bring you favor among men when no one else can. When it seems like all else fails, it is He who brings new life to a problem, an issue, or a contract. You are not alone in the work of growing your business—if you remember the Lord who gave it all to you.

You may have thought it was just you—grinding, hustling, doing everything you can to make it happen. But it's not just you. You have a divine business partner—*the Lord Himself*. Act like it, talk to Him, and call on Him. He wants to lead you into success!

He is the best partner you could ever have. He holds the wisdom you need, the direction you've been praying for, and the timing for every decision. He knows when to expand, where to build, and what products to develop. The same God who created heaven and earth has given you the power to earn more, create financial security for you and your family, and to teach you how to effect the Kingdom.

But this power requires using your faith—faith to believe that what He said in Deuteronomy 8:18 is true for you: “*...for it is He that gives you the power...*” (NKJV). Remember Him in every decision, every transaction, every investment. Invite Him into your boardroom, your calendar, and your strategy meetings. When you do, you're not just running a business—you're operating under divine partnership.

The Message Translation says:

If you start thinking to yourselves, 'I did all this. And all by myself. I'm rich. It's all mine!'—well, think again. Remember that God, your God, gave you the strength to produce all this wealth so as to confirm the covenant that He promised to your ancestors—as it is today.

—DEUTERONOMY 8:17–18 (MSG)

And the Amplified Translation declares:

But you shall remember [with profound respect] the Lord your God, for it is He who is giving you power to make wealth, that He may confirm His covenant which He swore (solemnly promised) to your fathers, as it is this day.

—DEUTERONOMY 8:18 (AMP)

When I took over our book publishing company after my husband died, I honestly did not know the first thing about how to grow a business. All I had known were the four walls of a church. I had been a minister's wife since I was twenty, fresh out of Bible college. No one had ever taught me how to make money or grow an organization.

There I was, taking over a small business with children still in high school. How was I going to support them, myself, and the employees we had? I had no résumé, no boss on this planet to recommend me, and no

experience I felt would translate into corporate earnings. So—I turned to the Word.

The Lord said He would supply all my needs—and at that moment, I needed wisdom to build. He led me, opened doors, brought the right people, and taught me how to build. Within three months, I was tripling my profits, and by the end of the second year, I had paid off all the equipment in a 4,200 sq. ft. printing and publishing company. He is faithful to teach you how to do what He has assigned you to do. As you use your faith and speak the Word, you'll watch your business thrive and grow in ways beyond your wildest dreams!

The second part of this verse is one of the most powerful truths you can stand on:

“...that He may establish His covenant which He swore to your fathers, as it is this day.”

—DEUTERONOMY 8:18

Why does God give you the power to create wealth? So that His covenant—His promise—can be established on the earth. It's not random that you're building a business. It's not just a personal dream. It's part of His divine plan to bring wealth to His people. It is His promise—your covenant right.

You are part of something bigger—something eternal. God has sworn to establish His covenant, and He has chosen you as one of the vessels through which He will do it. (See Deuteronomy 7:8–12)

You are anointed and appointed for such a time as this—to be a successful entrepreneur, to earn more, to create financial security, and to advance the Kingdom. You are not doing business alone. You are partnering with the Creator of all things, who delights in seeing you prosper. (See 3 John 1:2)

Along the way, you'll sense gentle nudges from the Holy Spirit—that still, small voice saying, “*Go this way*,” or “*Wait*,” or “*Hire him or her*.” In the natural, it might seem like an odd choice, but trust the leading. That is your business partner—the *Holy Spirit*—guiding you into all truth and success.

When you don't know what to do, talk to Him. Don't leave Him out! He'll place you in the right rooms, at the right time, with the right people. *Expect divine connections.* Expect unexpected doors to open. Expect favor in boardrooms where you may feel least qualified—because He is establishing His covenant through you.

Do you see it now? This is bigger than just your dream—it is His success story for you. Your business is a vehicle through which God is fulfilling His promises on earth. When you remember that—when you remember Him—He will lead you into wealth and prosperity, not just for your benefit—but for *His glory.*

Declare each day as your feet hit the floor:

“Today, I remember the Lord my God, for it is He who gives me the power to create wealth. I partner with You, Lord, in every decision I make today, and together, we establish Your covenant promises on the earth.”

Teach me how to steward what You've placed in my hands and to walk in wisdom, diligence, and faith. Let everything I build bring glory to You and establish Your covenant on the earth.

And then God answered: ‘Write this. Write what you see. Write it out in big block letters so that it can be read on the run. This vision-message is a witness pointing to what’s coming. It aches for the coming—it can hardly wait! And it doesn’t lie. If it seems slow in coming, wait. It’s on its way. It will come at the right time.

DEVOTIONAL

Every God-given dream—whether a business, ministry, or church plant—begins with a vision: a divine picture painted in your spirit of what could be through the gifts and talents God has placed within you to pour out through your hands and feet.

In Habakkuk 2, God instructs the prophet to *write the vision*—not think it, wish it, or hide it—but to make it visible, readable, and clear. Why? Because your written vision becomes the bridge between faith and manifestation.

As a woman in business, you are called to build what Heaven has already spoken. Yet often, the vision stirring in your heart feels too small—too insignificant to act on. You tell yourself it's not the right time, or that you're not qualified enough. But the truth is, your dream isn't dying from lack of opportunity—it's *being smothered by fear*.

Fear of *failure*.

Fear of *what others will think*.

Fear that *you're not good enough*.

But God says the first step toward seeing your vision fulfilled is simple: *write it down*.

Write it out in big block letters so that it can be read on the run.

—HABAKKUK 2:2 (MSG)

Who needs to read it? *You do!* And those God will send to help you do it.

Put your vision where you can see it—on your bathroom mirror, car visor, or workspace—so it stays before your eyes as you run your race.

As a lifelong graphic designer, every time I start a new business, I begin with what God has placed in my heart. I write the mission and vision first, then bring it to life visually through design. That's how I see what God is showing me.

Maybe you're an illustrator—*paint it*.

A poet—*write about it*.

A videographer—*film it*.

A builder—*sketch it out*.

Whatever your gift, use it to express the vision. Write what you see and make it plain so that when others read it, they immediately understand what God has placed in your heart.

That's how you take the first step toward fulfilling the vision, the call, and the purpose God has placed you on this earth to do.

Your only assignment right now? *Write it down and make it plain*.

Then, watch what happens next. A door will open that you didn't see before. You'll meet someone with the resources you need. A book, video, or divine connection will cross your path at just the right time. God will order your steps once you take the first one.

Stay alert. Don't ignore those moments. Don't let doubt, fear, or outside voices talk you out of what the Lord is leading you into. Circumstances will shout, "*You can't do this.*" Your insecurities will whisper, "*You're not ready.*" Fear will try to paralyze you.

When that happens—*speak the Word.*

For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.

—2 TIMOTHY 1:7

David did this when he faced Goliath.

Paul and Silas did it when they worshiped in chains.

The woman at the well did it when Jesus met her in her brokenness.

Author and pastor Mark Batterson once said,

"The greatest regret at the end of your life will be the lions you didn't chase."

So chase the lion. Write the vision. Take the first step.

Writing your vision isn't just a business exercise—it's a spiritual act of obedience that moves Heaven and Earth on your behalf! When you write what God says, you anchor Heaven's blueprint to Earth.

Your written vision becomes a prophetic declaration of what will surely come—and it will come right on time.

FAITH ACTION

Set aside 30 minutes today to write out your business or ministry vision in clear, bold, and simple words—big block letters that speak life every time you see them.

Include these key questions to bring clarity and focus:

- What are you building? (*Define your dream.*)
- When will you begin? (*Remember, a dream without a start date is just a wish.*)
- Why are you called to this work? (*Clarify your impact and purpose.*)
- Who are you called to serve? (*Identify the people God has placed on your heart.*)
- Where will you build it? (*Online? Locally? Nationally? Globally?*)

When you’re finished, post your written vision somewhere you’ll see it daily—your office wall, journal, or bathroom mirror—and let it remind you that every great move of God begins with a written step of faith.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. Have I clearly written down what is in my heart about my business or calling?

2. Where am I struggling to wait on God's timing, and how can I strengthen my faith or my natural skills in the waiting?
3. What practical steps can I take this week to align my actions with the vision God has given me?
4. Who can I share my written vision with for prayer and accountability?

PRAYER PROMPT

Father, thank You for giving me a vision that is rooted in purpose. I will write what I see in my heart because my life is led by You. I will walk in faith and clarity, knowing that I am well able to accomplish all things because greater is He that is in me than He that is in the world. I am strong in the Lord, and I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. I was born for greatness, and I work like it depends on me, and trust You like it all depends on You. I am confident that You are working behind the scenes to fulfill the vision. My business will bring glory to You. What You've spoken over me and to me will come to pass.

Successful businesswomen prepare for growth. Even Jesus did—He did a lot of marketing before He launched His ministry. It takes faith, vision, and preparation to see increase. If you want to expand, you must first increase your capacity for growth.

The Message translation says it like this:

Clear lots of ground for your tents! Make your tents large. Spread out! Think big! Use plenty of rope, drive the tent pegs deep. You're going to need lots of elbow room for your growing family (customers). You're going to take over whole nations; you're going to resettle abandoned cities. Don't be afraid—you're not going to be embarrassed. Don't hold back—you're not going to come up short.

—ISAIAH 54:2 (MSG)

Isaiah 54:2 lays out the plan because increase is coming—so get ready for it!

How do you grow? How does a business increase? We have a lot of examples in the Bible about increase, and Isaiah 54 is one that gives us a clear plan of action. It's going to take some faith and courage on your part. Don't wait for your organization to grow and then expand—that will never happen. Get ready, get prepared, get things in order—*then increase will come.*

Isaiah instructs us on how to create increase in four steps:

1. *Enlarge your tent:* make yourself ready for more—where you are and what you're doing.
2. *Add extensions:* make your place bigger and add more services.
3. *Hold nothing back:* don't plan for just a few.
4. *Make the tent ropes longer and the pegs stronger:* prepare and have a strategy because you're going to need to know what to do with all that is coming to you.

What if I fail? What if I don't do it right? What if I don't have enough experience or education? Starting, growing, or expanding a business requires faith, courage, and wisdom. Building a business—even in small steps—requires believing in yourself and the courage to act on that belief.

I can do all things through Christ, which strengtheneth me.

—PHILIPPIANS 4:13

I know what it means to lack, and I know what it means to experience overwhelming abundance. For I'm trained in the secret of overcoming all things, whether in fullness or in hunger. And I find that the strength of Christ's explosive power infuses me to conquer every difficulty.

—PHILIPPIANS 4:12–13 (TPT)

Each time I started a business or wanted to expand the one I had, it came with a huge amount of fear and self-doubt—the kind of fear that made me break out in sweats at night. Each time I felt like Jonah, shut up in the belly of a whale. Each time I had to overcome fear, uncertainty, and the “*what ifs.*” But on the other side of fear is opportunity, and on the other side of self-doubt is prosperity. That’s why God is leading you there. (See John 16:13)

Many times, we are praying for growth—to make more money or increase our revenue—but we don’t like what it looks like to get there. “*Go to the ant, thou sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise.*” — Proverbs 6:6 You may have to market more, make more sales calls, schedule more interviews, or hire more people.

Sometimes we have the misconception that if we just open the doors or put up the website, customers will start flooding in. Much like the 1989 movie *Field of Dreams*, the phrase “*If you build it, they will come*” became a popular catchphrase. I have to admit, I might have thought the same thing—I might have believed too, like so many, if I open the doors, the customers will pour in. When few came, I realized there was more to growing an organization than opening the doors, providing a service, building a website, or just praying hard. Don’t get me wrong—I believe in praying hard. But I know, like author and speaker Mark Batterson puts it: “*I work like it depends on me, and pray like it depends on God.*”

You will have to have a lot of courage, believe in yourself and act on that belief. You might even have to do what I did—put sticky notes all over the house including my bathroom mirror to remind myself what the Word says about ME. Stop listening to that inner voice of self-doubt—

speak to yourself until breakthrough comes. You will have to say it, speak it, and sing it until that wall of fear falls down. Because on the other side of fear, there is wealth and prosperity.

Jabez prayed, “*Bless me indeed, and enlarge my territory.*” Are you praying that but haven’t seen it manifest? There are requirements for anyone desiring to succeed.

First, reject smallness. Enlargement requires stepping out of small boxes, small routines, small thinking, and a limited view of wealth building. Bottom line—*you must reject a lack mentality!* Caleb and Joshua saw a place of opportunity, but the rest shrank back and remained small. Caleb and Joshua believed it could be done; the others were afraid to try and stayed small-minded.

A colleague once said to me, “*\$2 million is nothing.*” I said, “*Okay.*” He replied, “*No! No! I mean I want you to really see that \$2 million is nothing.*” I actually think the Lord was speaking to me at that very moment to enlarge my thinking. I’ve never looked back!

Second, enlarging your tent means making room for new business, clients, products, services, bigger offices, or even new land. Expansion will require more of you, more of your faith, more of your time, and more believing in yourself. New employees will *s-t-r-e-t-c-h* you! Serving more clients will demand more work, more patience, and deeper reliance on God. If you want more—if you’re tired of barely paying bills or struggling to make payroll—God is saying, “*Enlarge and stretch.*” You will never see a miracle in your business or finances until you stretch your faith for increase and take the steps to grow.

When God tells you to lengthen your cords, it means expand your reach, widen your marketing, and stretch your sales team. Tents need longer cords to remain secure. And once you lengthen your cords, you must also strengthen your stakes—implement better policies, shore up weak procedures, and deepen your organizational foundations. Building a business is like growing a large tree—*the wider the branches spread, the deeper the roots must grow.*

Then it will require of belief in yourself. No one can give that to you, except you. You’re going to feel like you are just *faking it until you make it.* I challenge you to look deeper and see it as *faithing it until you make it!*

3. How am I using my faith to trust God with the growth He has planned for me?

"Father, thank You for calling me to increase. Help me conquer any self-doubt in me that I need to get rid of. Show me where I am thinking too small and show me how to think bigger. Show me how to expand, grow, and prepare for increase. I thank You for wisdom to strengthen the foundations of my business. Let every step I take be in alignment with Your plan for abundance and prosperity."

Throughout the book of Proverbs, Lady Wisdom calls us to esteem her above all else, to make her a priority. Wisdom invites us to receive the best way to live—a more excellent and noble way of living. She offers knowledge and understanding in her hand. When you receive wisdom, you gain guidance on how to build your life God's way.

Proverbs 24:4 says, “And through intelligence and insight their enterprises are established and endure.” What a powerful message! Lady Wisdom provides a blueprint for success in building a strong family and an ever-increasing business. Whether you have a family, run a business, or both, Lady Wisdom will guide you through it all.

The entire book of Proverbs is about the art of successful living. Every day, we encounter problems, fears, and challenges. Revelation, knowledge, and practical understanding are wrapped up in the metaphor of Lady Wisdom. She is our guide, a hostess who graciously invites us to come and dine at her table. When you accept her invitation, revelation, knowledge, and understanding are imparted to you through her divine hand.

Moms, wisdom is your answer. You don’t have to feel stressed or without direction—Lady Wisdom is your guiding light. If you are called—yes, called—to stay at home and care for a bustling household, Wisdom equips you to build strong children and a thriving home. For moms who work outside the home or run a business, Wisdom teaches you how to balance responsibilities and excel in both your family and career.

Wisdom will teach you how to build when you hunger after her. Lady Wisdom wants to be a part of your life. Love her, pursue her, and chase her hard. A wise builder is a God-lover, a wisdom chaser, a destiny dreamer.

And I find that the strength of Christ’s explosive power infuses me to conquer every difficulty.” I want to be trained in that secret of overcoming all things—don’t you? Let's look more closely at wisdom's instructions in Proverbs 24:4:

SHE FINDS FAVOR

And Ruth the Moabitess said unto Naomi, Let me now go to the field, and glean ears of corn after him in whose sight I shall find grace. And she said unto her, Go, my daughter.

—RUTH 2:2 (KJV)

DEVOTIONAL

The Hebrew word for guardian-redeemer is a legal term meaning one who has the obligation to redeem a relative in serious difficulty. Ruth needed a redeemer, and so did we. Sin left us in desperate need of redemption, and just as Boaz stepped in for Ruth, Jesus stepped in for us. He is our ultimate Guardian-Redeemer—the One who continually brings us back, restores what's been lost, and positions us for divine favor.

But notice something powerful in Ruth's story—she didn't sit back in sorrow, waiting for her circumstances to change. She didn't complain about her loss, her lack, or the impossibility of her situation. Instead, her faith became her fuel, and wisdom became her plan.

Ruth said, "...in whose sight I shall find grace" (Ruth 2:2). The NIV says, "in whose eyes I find favor." Webster defines grace as unmerited divine assistance, mercy, pardon, a special favor or privilege. That's exactly what we carry as Kingdom women in business—special favor when we walk into boardrooms, make presentations, submit proposals, or pitch ideas. Grace is our business advantage. Divine assistance goes before us when we're negotiating a contract, launching a startup, or expanding a vision.

But Ruth didn't just speak faith—she put her faith to work. Ruth 2:7 says, "She came into the field and has remained here from morning till now, except for a short rest." She got up early. She showed up. She stayed the course. Her diligence preceded her favor.

That's the posture of a woman who means business—spiritually, financially, and purposefully. She didn't wait for provision; she positioned herself for it. She didn't hope someone would notice her worth; she demonstrated it through her work.

When I became a young widow, I had to make the same hard decision. I remember the days when grief could have easily paralyzed me—when it would have been easier to retreat and stop moving forward. But like Ruth, I chose to go to the field. I chose to put my hand to what God had placed in my house (See 2 Kings 4). I showed up, stood up, and put my makeup on every day, even when my heart was broken, when my grief was so deep that I could hardly breathe. And God met me in the middle of my diligence.

That's what faith and prosperity look like in real life—not just abundance in your bank account (that will come), but abundance in your belief, in your work ethic, and in your expectation that God will favor your field.

Ruth found favor among workers, leaders, and eventually with Boaz. Why? Because she carried herself with humility, excellence, and unwavering faith. Everyone who watched her work respected her. She wasn't defined by her widowhood—she was defined by her faith and courage.

And that's what She Means Business is all about. It's about a woman who refuses to give up, who dares to believe that favor will meet her for her future, who understands that prosperity is not a one-time miracle but

the fruit of consistent, faith-filled pursuit of her passion to prosper and create Kingdom impact.

So today, I ask you:

- Do you have the kind of faith that finds favor among your staff, colleagues, and peers?
- Do you show up early to glean in the field God has assigned you?
- Do you trust that favor goes before you—in every client call, every business meeting, every marketing effort, every proposal?

Because when a woman of faith gets up, shows up, and goes to work, she can expect God's favor—heaven takes notice.

DEVOTIONAL

Every successful Kingdom business, every Kingdom-minded entrepreneur begins not in a boardroom, but at the altar. This passage paints a powerful image of surrender and partnership with God—“I lay out the pieces of my life on the altar and wait for Your fire to fall upon my heart.”

Your altar is where vision, strategy, and prayer meet. It’s where your plans are refined, your motives are purified, and your heart aligns with Heaven’s agenda. Each morning, you have an appointment with the Creator of the Universe, the Son of the Most High, the Bright and Morning Star, and Miracle Worker to offer a heart full of gratitude and worship. You have an open invitation with the greatest business partner

and divine leader of your life to present your business, goals, and challenges before Him—inviting the Lord to breathe His wisdom, direction, and favor over every piece.

When you begin your day with this level of spiritual surrender, you move from striving to flowing, from frustration to supernatural success, and from trouble into triumph. God leads you not just in spiritual matters, but in business strategy, decision-making, and innovation. Your prayer becomes a divine exchange—your plans for His power, your uncertainty for His clarity, your limitations for His limitless ability.

When you make your prayer life your business strategy, you invite supernatural results. When you make His Word a priority, you can confidently say, “Your Word have I hid in my heart that I might not sin against you.” The altar becomes your boardroom. The Holy Spirit becomes your Chief Advisor. Every decision becomes an act of faith that advances God’s Kingdom through your work.

It takes practice to establish the habit of preparing a time to meet Him in prayer, just like you would prepare for a board meeting. The Hebrew word for “prepare” in Psalms 5:3 is ‘arak’—a priestly term meaning to light the altar fire, prepare a sacrifice, and lay it in order upon the altar to be consumed. The Aramaic text states, “At dawn I shall be ready and shall appear before you.” The Hebrew can also be translated, “I’ll be on the watchtower [for the answer to come].”

There is a pattern we see in Psalms 5:3:

- 1. Rise up before dawn and be ready.**
- 2. Appear before Him with a voice of gratitude.** Let the first thing your King and God hears be thankfulness—enter His gates with thanksgiving.
- 3. Prepare your requests in order.** Plan ahead so you can lay out your requests like a business agenda.

Wait in worship for the answer.

Lay your requests before Him as you would with a business partner. What are the next steps for your company? What challenges need addressing? What strategies should you discuss with your Divine

Partner? Prepare your agenda, lay out your requests in order, and bring them to the altar to hear His direction.

3. What requests or challenges do I need to lay before God today with clarity and faith?

PRAYER PROMPT

“Father, I commit this day, my business, and my vision to You. Teach me to wait upon You, listen to Your voice, and follow Your direction. Let Your favor and wisdom guide every decision I make, and may my business bring glory to Your Kingdom.

DEVOTIONAL

Proverbs declares loud and clear that wisdom is the principal thing—get all you can (Proverbs 4:7). Wisdom is more than information; it is the divine ability to align your words, decisions, and actions with God's heart. When a woman walks in wisdom, she carries Heaven's blueprint for success.

Proverbs 3:16 paints a beautiful picture of what wisdom offers: in one hand, long life—divine health, endurance, and peace—and the other, wealth and promotion. That means wisdom doesn't just lengthen your years; it increases your prosperity and influence.

Promotion flows from wisdom because she teaches us to handle what we have with stewardship, strategy, and spiritual sensitivity. True wealth is more than money—it's the capacity to multiply resources, opportunities, and people. It's the ability to create value that benefits others and glorifies God. Promotion comes when wisdom positions you before the right people, at the right time, with the right words.

Wisdom will teach you when to speak and when to stay silent, when to sow and when to save, when to build and when to break away. She's not loud or boastful—she's strategic, precise, and full of peace.

For the woman in business, this truth is transformative. Every decision, every contract, every team meeting becomes an opportunity to release God's wisdom. When you lead with wisdom, your influence increases naturally. You don't have to strive for success—wisdom attracts it.

Your words carry authority. Out of your mouth flows righteousness—speaking what is right—and mercy—balancing truth with compassion. The combination of both releases favor and builds trust, which are the keys to long-term wealth and lasting promotion.

When your business is built on wisdom, you won't chase opportunities; they'll find you. Wisdom stabilizes what hard work alone cannot sustain. Success doesn't always come quickly—so speak carefully, speak truthfully, speak blessings. And remember—wisdom has both hands extended toward you: one filled with long life, and the other with wealth and prosperity. Take both, and build with grace.

- Opportunities find me, favor surrounds me, and success follows me.
- I don't strive—I thrive, because I began my day in His presence before I met the world.
- The world is waiting for me—I was born to do great things.



SHE'S A MILLION DOLLAR MOM

So Elisha said to her, ‘What shall I do for you? Tell me, what do you have in the house?’

And she said, ‘Your maidservant has nothing in the house but a jar of oil.

—2 KINGS 4:2 (NKJV)

DEVOTIONAL

This story is one of the most powerful business lessons in Scripture. It begins with a woman in crisis — widowed, in debt, and facing the loss of her sons. I think I love this story so much because it was **my story**. At the age of forty-nine, my husband moved to Heaven very unexpectedly. We had children, a life filled with purpose, and a bright future ahead.

I share a portion of my personal story in *Dream Big, Live Big!* by Margo Bush (available on Amazon, Bushpublishing.com and everywhere books are sold).

Within this widow woman's home was the very thing God would use to bring her deliverance, wealth, and prosperity—a **single pot of oil**.

Elisha didn't hand her money or pity. He gave her a strategy. God will always give you a divine plan before He gives you a financial breakthrough. The question He still asks today is:

“What do you have in your house?”

For the woman entrepreneur, this story reveals that your miracle is often hidden in what you already possess.

You may have an idea, a skill, a creation, a connection, or a product that seems small—but in God's hands, it's the **seed of overflow**.

Her obedience to follow divine instruction unlocked multiplication. She didn't wait for perfect conditions; she acted on faith.

Notice the Pattern:

- The Lord provided the seed.
- She assessed what she had.
- She followed divine strategy—borrow vessels.
- She shut the door—focusing on her assignment, not the opinions of others.
- She poured out until there were no more vessels.

The oil flowed in proportion to her capacity. When there were no more vessels—no more capacity—the Lord gave her the next step.

That's a business principle: **God will fill the space you make room for.**

Finally, the prophet said, “*Go, sell the oil, pay your debt, and live on the rest.*”

Her faith turned into a business—*The Oil Business*.

She moved from **poverty to profit**, from **desperation to destiny**. Notice that it wasn't until she was obedient to take the first step that she received the next step from the prophet.

“The steps of a good man (woman) are ordered by the Lord: and he (she) delighteth in His way.”

—PSALM 37:23 (KJV)

“Stalwart walks in step with God; his (her) path blazed by God, he’s (she’s) happy. If he (she) stumbles, he’s (she’s) not down for long; God has a grip on his (her) hand.”

Your “oil” is what God has gifted you to do. It might be your voice, your creativity, your writing, your singing, your networking, your coaching, your preaching, your ability to organize, write code, or develop software.

Whatever it is, **God will multiply what you pour in obedience to use what He has gifted you with.**

The miracle is not in waiting for resources—it’s in using what you already have. You don’t have to wait on Him—He is waiting for you.

Walk in the...

Power—authority and influence.

Persistence—perseverance and determination.

Potential—growth and untapped opportunities.

DEVOTIONAL

In the fast-paced world of business, creativity and vision often get celebrated, but God honors diligence. Proverbs reminds us that success is born not only from big ideas, but from consistent discipline, preparation, and faithful action.

The ant doesn't wait for motivation; it moves in wisdom. It doesn't need supervision or applause to stay productive. Its diligence today secures its future tomorrow.

Proverbs 6:6-11 is worth reading once a month to remind us that success will not happen if it is not met with diligence. It is so clear in the Passion Translation what is expected to be rich and not fall into poverty.

6When you're feeling lazy, come and learn a lesson from this tale of the tiny ant. Yes, all you lazybones, come learn from the example of the ant and enter into wisdom. 7The ants have no chief, no boss, no manager—no one has to tell them what to do. 8You'll see them working and toiling all summer long, stockpiling their food in preparation for winter. 9So wake up, sleepyhead. How long will you lie there? When will you wake up and get out of bed? 10If you keep nodding off and thinking, "I'll do it later," or say to yourself, "I'll just sit back awhile and take it easy," just watch how the future unfolds! 11By making excuses you'll learn what it means to go without. Poverty will pounce on you like a bandit and move in as your roommate for life."

—PROVERBS 6:6-11

For women in business, this is a divine reminder: your preparation in private determines your promotion in public. It's not just about working hard—it's about working faithfully, even when no one is watching. Procrastination may feel harmless in the moment, but it quietly steals potential, opportunity, and momentum. Every "I'll do it later" can cost you time, influence, or revenue that God intended to multiply.

Jesus illustrated diligence in the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30). A master entrusted his servants with resources while he traveled. Two of the servants invested and multiplied what they were given; the third buried his talent out of fear. When the master returned, he rewarded those who acted faithfully and wisely, but rebuked the servant who did nothing. The lesson is clear: God honors action, effort, and wise stewardship. In business, diligence—consistent work, faithful investment of time, and strategic planning—leads to growth and blessing. Waiting for perfect conditions or avoiding effort out of fear results in missed opportunities.

James 2:17 reminds us, "*Faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.*" Your vision, ideas, and dreams are important, but they must be paired with daily action. Showing up, putting in the work, and being consistent—even when it's challenging—activates God's favor and multiplies your results.

Diligence in business is also about preparation and attention to detail. The Proverbs ant doesn't leave food to chance; she anticipates the future and plans for it. Likewise, a diligent businesswoman builds systems, tracks finances, invests in learning, and plans ahead. She doesn't allow complacency or procrastination to determine her outcomes. Every task done faithfully, no matter how small, lays the foundation for long-term growth.

Let me share a story from my own experience: When I first took over our book publishing company, I had no idea how to grow a business. But I committed to showing up every day, learning every process, and being faithful in small tasks—sorting inventory, learning contracts, handling customer calls. The consistency of those actions built momentum. Within months, the business began to flourish, and within two years, we had expanded operations and cleared significant debt. Diligence turns seemingly ordinary actions into extraordinary results.

So, take note: the path to success is rarely sudden. It is built brick by brick, hour by hour, task by task. Faith without action is dead, and talent without diligence never reaches its full potential.

Key Principles of Diligence in Business:

- Show up consistently, even when motivation wanes.
- Plan ahead and anticipate challenges.
- Invest your time, talents, and resources on what produces business growth.
- Take action on the opportunities God places in your hands—don't wait around.
- Do not fear failure—learning is part of the process.
- Trust God to multiply your diligent efforts.

When you adopt a spirit of diligence, poverty cannot overtake you. Faithful effort becomes a magnet for opportunity, divine connections, and breakthrough. Be like the ant, the wise servant, and the faithful entrepreneur—consistent, prepared, and committed to the work God has entrusted to you.

SHE BUYS A FIELD

DEVOTIONAL

Proverbs 31:16 paints a picture of a woman full of courage, faith, and fruitfulness, with strategic vision and diligence. The word translated “field” here means land or country, showing that her vision is large. Sometimes the dreams you have seem too big—bigger than what you think you can do. They might feel challenging or even intimidating. If your dream doesn’t scare you, it’s not big enough.

This woman understood a critical principle: anything God calls you to do is usually bigger than you can accomplish on your own. That’s how you know it’s from Him—it will require faith and dependency upon the Master. Without Him, even the best plans and intentions fall short. But with Him, the vision is achievable, fruitful, and aligned with His Kingdom purposes for your life.

“By the fruit of her hands, she plants a vineyard”—her labor was not aimless. She was intentional, purposeful, and passionate about producing results, both naturally and spiritually. She understood that success is measured not only in profits but in the people her work impacts—customers, employees, partners, and community. Every action, every decision, every conversation was an investment in the fruit of her labor.

Your business is your vineyard. The relationships you build, the services you provide, the people you hire and influence—these are the living vines that grow and multiply under your stewardship. She steps into abundance because she has been skillful, invests diligently, and partners with God to learn Kingdom business so she will produce fruit that lasts.

God is calling you to set your heart on your field. What is it that God is calling you to do? Does it seem too big for you to build or accomplish on your own? Identify the big, God-sized dream He has assigned to you. It’s time to take ownership, to use your faith, and step into it. Labor faithfully. The vision is not just for your gain—it’s for fruit that produces a harvest in other people’s lives and expands His Kingdom.

Tips to step into your God-sized dream:

- Write it down—all of it.
- Craft it into a story that will read well.
- Read it out loud to yourself—let it come alive in you.
- Find someone you can trust (friend, sister, mother, spouse) to read it to.
- Take one action step each day that moves you into your God-given assignment.

We often look at this Proverbs 31 woman as someone impossible to attain—too special, too wonderful, amazingly blessed. In reality, this is exactly what God is speaking over us. He is saying you are a Proverbs 31 woman. You are the bride of Christ. He’s calling you out and up to a higher place to do Kingdom business with Him—household business, raising children to walk uprightly before Him, blessed in your marriage because you have spent time cultivating your relationships, walking in

wisdom, and not letting your emotions or feelings control your day. We are who He says we are—a Proverbs 31 Woman. Claim it, speak it, and build your faith around it. Let Proverbs 31 be your guiding light to fulfilling your God-sized dream.

When I was in my twenties and newly married, I had a bad habit of wearing my feelings on my shoulders. So many things my husband said, I took as a personal attack—what I wore, what I cooked, how I cooked. He was a kind and gracious man, but I had a problem with my own self-confidence. As a result, I would end up stomping away to my room like a child until I got over it.

One day, I was alone at home cleaning with the television on, listening to a preacher. I can't remember any other part of the message except one sentence that still rings in my ears today—forty years later. He said, *"If you don't stop wearing your feelings on your shoulders, God will never be able to use you."* From that day forward, I stopped that childish behavior—Glory to God! That is one time it felt as though God delivered me instantly. I walked free and never looked back.

Since then, I've ministered in every state at least once—most states several times, in the US except Alaska and Hawaii—and taught in Bible schools and churches in more than seven countries. I've been part of one of the most impactful children's ministries in my twenties, traveling coast to coast teaching in churches and children's workers conferences. I had a part on a wildly successful children's television show that impacted the world and taught for many years at a Bible College that trained ministers to go out and minister globally. I had the honor to pastor for fifteen years, sending more than sixty students to Bible school to fulfill their own ministry callings.

I'm so glad I obeyed God when I heard that preacher, took control of my feelings, and learned to follow Him. Look what I would have missed. Don't miss your calling in the marketplace or in ministry just because you're too scared to step out or take more territory. Your dream is not too big—it's not big enough. Your vision is not too large—it's not large enough. Your passion to prosper is not too small—it's not enough for all that God wants for you.

From this day forward, don't look at the Proverbs 31 woman as someone you can't attain—but as someone you already are. Speak over yourself who the Word says you are, not how you feel.

Proverbs 31:16–19 (Personalized):

16 “She [your name] sets her heart upon a field and takes it as her own. She [your name] labors there to plant the living vines.

17 She [your name] wraps herself in strength, might, and power in all her works.

18 She [your name] tastes and experiences a better substance, and her shining light will not be extinguished, no matter how dark the night.

19 She [your name] stretches out her hands to help the needy and lays hold of the wheels of government.”

This woman is confident, strategic in her life and family goals, and powerful in her community.

SHE STEPS INTO OVERFLOW

A slacker will know what it means to be poor, while the hard worker becomes wealthy.

—PROVERBS 10:4 (TPT)

DEVOTIONAL

How does wealth and riches come? And how does poverty creep in? The answer is simple—hard work brings wealth, and laziness invites lack.

Poverty rarely arrives in a rush; it sneaks in through the quiet door of procrastination. It begins with small, subtle thoughts like, “I’ll do that later,” or “I’ll call that client tomorrow.” Each delay, each moment of hesitation, slows the momentum that prosperity requires. Let that sink in: prosperity requires staying in motion. Diligence—prompt action—keeps you moving toward increase. Every time you stop, even for a little while, momentum stalls.

The Kingdom of God operates on divine principles, and one of them is reward through diligence. The King James Version says it like this: “*He*

becometh poor that dealeth with a slack hand: But the hand of the diligent maketh rich."

When you work with diligence, and take action on what God tells you to do, you position yourself for wealth and abundance. You won't automatically become rich—there are many right steps you must take to create wealth in your business. But when you apply the correct principles and strategies, wealth becomes your friend. Think of it like baking a cake: just putting an egg in the mix doesn't automatically produce a cake. There are other ingredients you must add, but you cannot leave the egg out either.

If we neglect the small things, delay action, or compromise truth, we invite loss. Integrity protects our business and positions us for overflow.

Kingdom-minded women don't neglect the small things, tell a "white lie to get a client to sign on," or delay what we know we should do—we compromise integrity—that's a breeding ground for lack in our business. Integrity is a part of the recipe for those who want to succeed in business. The Word calls this evil behavior, because it leads us away from God's way of doing business.

If you're struggling in your business, take an honest look at your actions. Are you diligent or always delaying? Are you working smart, with integrity, or are you busy worrying instead of building? **Worry is disguised procrastination.** It drains your energy and produces no fruit.

Ruth provides a perfect illustration of diligence, faith, and stepping into overflow. As a widow in a foreign land, she could have chosen despair, complaining, or waiting for someone else to provide for her. Instead, she went to work. Ruth got up early, went to the fields, and gleaned grain diligently from sunrise to sunset. She worked with integrity, humility, and perseverance.

Her hard work positioned her for divine favor. Boaz noticed her diligence, her faithfulness, and eventually she entered into a season of abundance and blessing. Ruth's story demonstrates that the hand of the diligent truly makes rich, and that faithful action opens the door for God's supernatural provision.

Notice the principles Ruth modeled:

She **showed up every day** and stayed consistent.

She **worked faithfully and with integrity**.

She **followed guidance** from Naomi while staying proactive.

She **trusted God's timing** and moved in faith.

Just as Ruth stepped into overflow by acting faithfully, we too must combine our dreams with action. As James 2:17 reminds us: "*Faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.*" Your diligence positions you to receive both natural and supernatural increase.

SHE'S READY

Then the Kingdom of Heaven shall be likened unto ten virgins, who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were wise, and five were foolish.

—MATTHEW 25:1 (KJV)

DEVOTIONAL

The Parable of the Ten Virgins is one of Jesus' strongest messages about stewardship, purpose, and preparation. It is faith in action—five of them were wise, and five were foolish. There was a reward for those five virgins who did not waste their time but stayed ready and prepared. Five were foolish because they slept through their season and were not prepared when the bridegroom came.

This story isn't just about the oil—it's about what you do with what God has given you. Your talents, your influence, your voice, your vision—those are your “lamps.” God expects you to be diligent with what He has placed in your hands, not bury it in fear, excuses, or procrastination.

Let's be real: too many women of faith are waiting for "the right time" or "more resources" to start. But God says, "*Use what's already in your hand.*" You don't need more—just faith as small as a mustard seed will move you forward with what you already have. Notice that the five wise virgins had to go buy more oil to stay prepared for when the time would come. Faith without action is dead. The five foolish women found themselves on the outside looking in.

In Genesis 12, God told Abraham, "*Get up and go.*" In other words—get moving. Stop sitting around waiting for something to happen. If it's a door you need opened, go knock on it—or if you know God has something behind it, go kick it down! If you need money, go learn how to earn more. If you need education, figure out how to get it.

We have no excuse today—with all the resources and technology available at our fingertips. Laziness and waiting on someone else to do it for us are causing an abundance of poverty, when prosperity is right at our door. Too many times, we whine about what we lack when we should be learning. The knowledge you need is right in front of you. I often hear people say they don't want to learn new things, yet they go about their day wondering why they aren't making enough money to pay the bills. But here's the truth: what you refuse to steward will eventually be taken and given to someone who will.

Stop waiting for a miracle—**go be the miracle.**

Stop waiting for things to change—**go make change happen.**

Look at the women in Scripture:

- Lydia, in the book of Acts, got saved and immediately opened her home as a church so Paul could preach there.
- Ruth went out and gleaned faithfully every day, positioning herself for favor and blessing.
- The woman at the well became the first woman evangelist—she ran out to tell everyone what Jesus had done.

What are you waiting for? If you think you're waiting on God, don't—He's already far ahead of you. He's waiting on you to step up and take hold of your assignment. God is always on the move—healing

someone, saving someone, finding a lost sheep, prospering someone who's faithful.

When I pastored, I thought I was reaching a lot of people. But in the marketplace—on the community mission field—I've touched and ministered to more people than ever came inside the four walls of my church. There's a great, untapped mission field in entrepreneurship. Don't get me wrong, I consider myself as much a minister in the marketplace as I did when I was pastoring. I still preach in churches, Bible schools, and coffee shops. One day, I asked the Lord about my mission and why I wasn't ministering every week like when I was pastoring. He said, *"You are—it just looks different. I've expanded your ministry into the marketplace so you have a broader reach."*

The definition of an apostle is “one sent on a mission”—called into the highways and byways as an advocate, champion, and promoter of His Kingdom. That sounds just like an entrepreneur leading a business—someone sent or given a vision to build something that has never been built, promoted, or proclaimed before. One who compels people. I may be doing business in the marketplace, but I’m doing Kingdom business for God.

Faith is not passive—it’s active. God blesses motion, not idleness. You can’t steer a parked car, and He can’t bless what you refuse to build. God won’t do for you what He’s already instructed you to do.

So, faithful and ambitious woman—this is your call: find out what you’re good at, what you love to do, and go do it. Work what God planted in you. The world needs the gift only you can bring. The Kingdom expands when you step into your assignment and have the courage to get up, show up, and rise up. If you can dream it, you can build it! You already have within you the ability to fulfill your God-given assignment.

So, girlfriend, **grow up, get up, and show up** every day to make the world a better place.

SHE FACES HEAVEN

But Daniel, brimming with spirit and intelligence, so completely outclassed the other vice-regents and governors that the king decided to put him in charge of the whole kingdom.

—DANIEL 6:3 (MSG)

DEVOTIONAL

When your mornings are given to prayer, success for Kingdom entrepreneurs doesn't come from hustle—it comes from hearing.

Daniel was not just a man of prayer—he was a man of power, purpose, and professionalism. His faith was not limited to the temple; it was evident in the marketplace. He carried himself with such spirit and intelligence that even in a foreign land, he was promoted to the highest levels of leadership.

Scripture says Daniel was brimming with spirit and intelligence. This wasn't mere talent—it was evidence of the divine working through him. His success flowed from diligence, discipline, and devotion. Daniel

demanded the best of himself, and his diligence created an atmosphere of excellence in every assignment. God's Spirit operated through his obedience, and his prayer life gave him divine wisdom to govern.

Daniel's morning–noon–night prayer rhythm didn't just shape his worship; it shaped his world. His devotion before God affected divine order in the boardroom, the budget, and every business decision he made.

You too can brim with that same spirit and intelligence. It comes from those sacred early morning hours before the Father. Out of private prayer come purpose, promise, and heartfelt pursuit—qualities that cause others to take notice. When you operate with excellence—showing up prepared, walking in integrity, and making Spirit-led decisions in your business—promotion flows from favor, and destiny becomes clear. His direction is divine direction, not just decision-making.

So, when are the ideal times to prostrate before the Lord and hear heaven's whispers?

The early mornings are the best time. Your mind is open, your heart is most sensitive, and heaven is speaking when the world is sleeping—you will hear heaven's whispers. Morning meditation becomes the moments when the Master is calling you for a meeting, and it's in those intersections that your pathways of purpose are divinely planned.

Psalm 143:8 declares,

“Cause me to hear thy lovingkindness in the morning; for in thee do I trust. Cause me to know the way wherein I should walk; for I lift up my soul unto thee.”

The Passion Translation reads,

“Let the dawning day bring me revelation of your tender, unfailing love. Give me light for my path and teach me, for I trust in you.”

Let me ask you a question: What if you started treating your mornings like a meeting with the King?

Think of Esther. Before she entered the palace, she prepared herself for days in advance. What if you began the night before—setting up your tomorrow like it was an important boardroom meeting with Heaven?

David did.

Psalm 5:3 (TPT) says, *“At each and every sunrise you will hear my voice as I prepare my sacrifice of prayer to you. Every morning I lay out the pieces of my life on the altar and wait for your fire to fall upon my heart.”*

Imagine walking into each day equipped with Heaven’s blueprint. You wouldn’t just survive your day—you’d command it. You would enter each day with peace and purpose. You wouldn’t be asking, *“Lord, where are You?”* or *“Why haven’t You shown up?”*—because you would already have met Him before the world woke up.

Here’s the wonder: the same Commander-in-Chief who spoke to Deborah to command armies is the same God who called Esther for a purpose in the palace, the same God who met Lydia for a mission, and the same God who is waiting for you in the morning.

What if you looked at each morning not as routine, but as a time of revelation? That’s exactly why the enemy tries to steal them with distractions and delays. He knows if he can take your mornings, he can control your momentum. But when you rise with God, no weapon formed against you shall prosper.

Don’t treat your mornings in prayer as ordinary, but as an opportunity where Heaven’s wisdom becomes your advantage. There is a divine mystery that unfolds when a believer learns to seek God early.

Mark 1:35 says, *“And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed.”*

Jesus modeled this. Every morning, He departed to a solitary place. He knew that miracles didn’t come from movement, but from how He spent His mornings. Every healing, every direction, every leading flowed from those early hours.

Before Jesus faced the crowds, He faced the Father.

Before He spoke to man, He spoke to the Master.

Before He handled problems, He sat in God's presence.

Before He gave direction to His disciples, He received direction for His destiny.

Before He dealt with Jewish leaders, He became a world leader in the secret place.

He took those early morning hours to be face-to-face with the Father—so He could go face-to-face with the world.

Like Daniel, your spiritual life and professional life should flow together seamlessly. Pursue His presence so that your life reflects both spirit and intelligence for your purpose. The world may be watching your work, but Heaven is backing your movements.

Your early morning prayer life is where your purpose gets polished and your destiny becomes defined.

ALABASTER Box

And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment, And stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment.

—LUKE 7:37–38 (KJV)

DEVOTIONAL

This woman had a reputation. Everyone in the city knew who she was—a sinner, a prostitute, a woman whose name was whispered in judgment. But one day, she heard that Jesus was nearby, dining in the house of a respected religious leader. Something deep inside her refused to stay hidden any longer. She ran to Him—desperate for forgiveness, peace, and a new life.

Her heart was so broken over her past that she didn't care what others thought. She pushed past shame, rejection, and fear of opinion. She entered the home uninvited, fell at His feet, and began to worship—

weeping, washing His feet with her tears, and pouring out her most expensive perfume. She gave Jesus everything she had because she understood who He was: her Savior, her Peace, her Redeemer—the Great I Am.

Many women in business today have their own version of this story. Some were delivered from addiction. Others came out of incarceration, abuse, or years of lack and struggle. Some started a business because no one would hire them. But now, they stand as successful entrepreneurs—women clothed in grace, walking in freedom and favor, because of Jesus.

Like the woman with the alabaster box, you know what it feels like to be forgiven much. You know what it feels like to be restored when others counted you out. That's why your success is not just a business accomplishment—it's a testimony. It's worship.

Every sale, every client, every opportunity is a chance to pour out your gratitude before the Lord. Never lose that sense of reverence. Don't let your success make you forget your Savior. Whether your sins were great or small, the price He paid was the same—and your worship should always reflect the depth of your gratitude.

The religious leaders in that room were too proud to recognize who sat before them. But this woman saw clearly what they could not: Jesus is the Great I Am—the only One who can take a broken life and make it beautiful.

I love the song “*Alabaster Box*” by CeCe Winans, inspired by the story of this woman. Written by Janice Sjostrand, the lyrics paint a picture of deep, personal worship—the kind that flows from a heart that remembers where God found her. One line stands out to me:

“You don’t know the cost of the oil in my alabaster box.”

This line reminds us that true worship always costs something. It's the surrender of pride, the breaking of self, the pouring out of everything we are in gratitude for all He's done.

A dear friend of mine was delivered out of sex trafficking, and her husband was set free from a life of drugs, addiction, and sin. Their gratitude is so evident every time I see them. They were both so far from

God, yet when He found them and set them free, they gave all of themselves to Jesus.

To them, these words mean everything: *“You don’t know the cost—you have no idea the cost. If you only knew the price that Jesus’ blood paid for me, and how grateful I am that He came looking for me and found me in my wretched state.”*

What does this have to do with business? Everything. If you only knew the price He paid for your success, prosperity, and abundance, you would never entertain a lack-minded thought again.

SHE HAS A KINGDOM-MINDSET

But seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

—MATTHEW 6:33 (KJV)

DEVOTIONAL

True prosperity begins with focus. Matthew 6:33 calls us to *seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness*. This is not just a spiritual suggestion—it is a divine life and business principle that governs success in the way we should walk out our lives on this earth. When the Kingdom is first, every decision, strategy, and relationship becomes aligned with God's Kingdom.

Seeking the Kingdom first means making God your ultimate life and business partner. It means consulting Him in the early morning, making prayer a part of your *life*, not just a time you set aside. It's allowing your daily communication with Him to guide your decisions, contracts, and investments. It's seeking His wisdom over every opportunity and prioritizing integrity over immediate gain.

A Kingdom mindset shifts the focus from what is *urgent* to what is *eternal*—from chasing outcomes to following divine direction. When the Kingdom is first, “all these things”—resources, opportunities, favor, and influence—are added. Wealth, promotion, and business growth are not accidental; they flow naturally when your actions and words are rooted in God’s righteousness.

It is the alignment of faith, work, and strategy that creates sustainable success.

A woman with a Kingdom mindset approaches her work with intentionality, stewardship, and vision. She recognizes that her business is not just a source of income—it is a platform for Kingdom outcome that will outshine her income. Her life is focused, ready to serve her community, and impact nations. Her decisions are informed by skill and intelligence, her words carry authority, and her actions reflect both God’s principles and Kingdom purpose.

Kingdom-minded decisions often look counterintuitive in the natural—they may require patience, generosity, or risk. But God’s promise is clear: when His Kingdom comes first, He will provide the resources, connections, and favor needed to fulfill your God-given life and business dreams.

A Woman with a Kingdom Mindset—The Shunammite Woman (2 Kings 4:8–37)

The Shunammite woman beautifully models what it means to live with a Kingdom mindset. She was a woman of means, but more importantly, she was a woman of discernment. When the prophet Elisha often passed through her town, she recognized that he was a man of God and chose to create space for the presence of God in her home. She didn’t wait for instruction—she acted from revelation.

She said to her husband, “*Let’s make a small room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, a table, a chair, and a lamp.*” (2 Kings 4:10) Her generosity wasn’t driven by what she could gain, but by her desire to honor God’s Kingdom and presence.

Her hospitality became the doorway to her miracle. Though she had no son and her husband was old, the prophet declared, “*About this time next year, you will hold a son in your arms.*”

When her son later died suddenly, this woman didn't panic. She didn't speak words of defeat. Instead, she declared, "*It is well.*" That is the language of a Kingdom mindset. She believed that if God gave her the promise, He was also faithful to sustain it.

She sought the man of God again—not from desperation, but with determination. And God honored her faith. Her son was raised from the dead.

The Shunammite woman teaches us that when we make room for God's Kingdom first—when we sow into what honors His presence—He multiplies back life, blessing, and abundance beyond what we can imagine.

Kingdom women don't chase opportunities; they create space for God, and opportunity comes chasing them.

SCRIPTURE REFERENCES

If God gives such attention to the appearance of wildflowers—most of which are never even seen—don’t you think he’ll attend to you, take pride in you, do his best for you? What I’m trying to do here is to get you to relax, to not be so preoccupied with getting, so you can respond to God’s giving. People who don’t know God and the way he works fuss over these things, but you know both God and how he works. Steep your life in God-reality, God-initiative, God-provisions. Don’t worry about missing out. You’ll find all your everyday human concerns will be met.

8 Now there came a day when Elisha went over to Shunem, where there was a prominent and influential woman, and she persuaded him to eat a meal. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he stopped there for a meal. 9 She said to her husband, “Behold, I sense that this is a holy man of God who frequently passes our way. 10 Please, let us make a

small, fully-walled upper room [on the housetop] and put a bed there for him, with a table, a chair, and a lampstand. Then whenever he comes to visit us, he can turn in there.”

11 One day he came there and turned in to the upper room and lay down to rest. 12 And he said to Gehazi his servant, “Call this Shunammite.” So he called her and she stood before him. 13 Now he said to Gehazi, “Say to her now, ‘You have gone to all this trouble for us; what can I do for you? Would you like to be mentioned to the king or to the captain of the army?’” She answered, “I live among my own people [in peace and security and need no special favors].” 14 Later Elisha said, “What then is to be done for her?” Gehazi answered, “Well, she has no son and her husband is old.” 15 He said, “Call her.” So Gehazi called her, and she [came and] stood in the doorway. 16 Elisha said, “At this season next year, you will embrace a son.” She said, “No, my lord. O man of God, do not lie to your maidservant.”

17 But the woman conceived and gave birth to a son at that season the next year, just as Elisha had said to her.

18 When the child was grown, the day came that he went out to his father, to the reapers. 19 But he said to his father, “My head, my head.” The man said to his servant, “Carry him to his mother.” 20 When he had carried and brought him to his mother, he sat on her lap until noon, and then he died. 21 She went up and laid him on the bed of the man of God, and shut the door [of the small upper room] behind him and left. 22 Then she called to her husband and said, “Please send me one of the servants and one of the donkeys, so that I may run to the man of God and return.” 23 He said, “Why are you going to him today? It is neither the New Moon nor the Sabbath.” And she said, “It will be all right.” 24 Then she saddled the donkey and said to her servant, “Drive [the animal] fast; do not slow down the pace for me unless I tell you.” 25 So she set out and came to the man of God at Mount Carmel.

When the man of God saw her at a distance, he said to Gehazi his servant, “Look, there is the Shunammite woman. 26 Please run now to meet her and ask her, ‘Is it well with you? Is it well with your husband? Is it well with the

child?'" And she answered, "It is well." 27 When she came to the mountain to the man of God, she took hold of his feet. Gehazi approached to push her away; but the man of God said, "Let her alone, for her soul is desperate and troubled within her; and the Lord has hidden the reason from me and has not told me." 28 Then she said, "Did I ask for a son from my lord? Did I not say, 'Do not give me false hope'?"

29 Then he said to Gehazi, "Gird up your loins (prepare now!) and take my staff in your hand, and go [to the woman's house]; if you meet any man [along the way], do not greet him and if a man greets you, do not [stop to] answer him; and lay my staff on the face of the boy [as soon as you reach the house]." 30 The mother of the child said, "As the Lord lives and as your soul lives, I will not leave you." So Elisha arose and followed her. 31 Gehazi went on ahead of them and laid the staff on the boy's face, but there was no sound or response [from the boy]. So he turned back to meet Elisha and told him, "The boy has not awakened (revived)."

32 When Elisha came into the house, the child was dead and lying on his bed. 33 So he went in, shut the door behind the two of them, and prayed to the Lord. 34 Then he went up and lay on the child and put his mouth on his mouth, his eyes on his eyes, and his hands on his hands. And as he stretched himself out on him and held him, the boy's skin became warm. 35 Then he returned and walked in the house once back and forth, and went up [again] and stretched himself out on him; and the boy sneezed seven times and he opened his eyes. 36 Then Elisha called Gehazi and said, "Call this Shunammite." So he called her. And when she came to him, he said, "Pick up your son." 37 She came and fell at his feet, bowing herself to the ground [in respect and gratitude]. DEVOTIONAL

God's desire for your life is not partial prosperity—it's complete prosperity. Spirit, soul, and body. In 3 John 1:2, the Apostle John reveals the divine will of God for every believer: that we would *prosper in all things and be in good health*, even as our soul prospers.

Too many believers stop short, believing this verse speaks only of spiritual growth. But it's much bigger than that. God is saying, "As your inner life flourishes, everything connected to you will flourish too."

Your **soul**—your mind, will, and emotions—is the control center of your life. When your soul prospers, your decisions become sharper, your emotions steadier, and your faith stronger. A prosperous soul

attracts divine ideas, strategies, and resources that align with God's Kingdom. Prosperity doesn't begin in your bank account—it begins in your belief system.

When your inner life is thriving, your business life will thrive. A calm, faith-filled soul can hear God clearly. It's not tossed by fear, worry, or lack. Instead, it's anchored in divine confidence. From that place, creativity flows. Wisdom flows. Strategy flows. And abundance follows.



A prosperous soul doesn't strive—it strategizes with the Spirit. You stop asking, *"How will this happen?"* and start declaring, *"God is faithful to complete what He started in me."*

Psalm 5:8 reminds us, *"Lead me, O Lord, in Your righteousness because of my enemies; make Your way straight before me."* God smooths the road ahead when we seek His direction. He removes obstacles, clarifies steps, and aligns our pace with His will.

When your soul prospers, your next step isn't just forward—it's forward in *favor, fulfillment, and freedom.*

THE PROVERBS 31 WOMAN

The Proverbs 31 woman is a living example of soul prosperity manifesting in every area of life. She was not driven by hustle but by harmony—her faith, wisdom, and diligence worked together to produce abundance.

Scripture says she *"rises while it is yet night"* (v.15), meaning she starts her day in alignment with purpose. She *"considers a field and buys it; out of her earnings she plants a vineyard"* (v.16). That's strategic entrepreneurship, not happenstance.

Her prosperity flowed from her inner life—strength, vision, and faith. She didn't operate out of fear of the future but out of confidence in her God. *"She is clothed with strength and dignity, and she laughs without fear of the future."* (v.25 NLT)

This woman was wealthy in wisdom, rich in purpose, and generous in spirit. Her abundance was not only financial—it was emotional, spiritual, and generational. Her family, employees, and community all benefited from the overflow of her prosperous soul.

That's the Kingdom way. When your soul prospers, your business prospers. When your business prospers, others are blessed. And when others are blessed, God is glorified.

You are that woman. You are the modern Proverbs 31 entrepreneur—filled with faith, guided by vision, and empowered by wisdom. When your soul is aligned with Heaven, abundance isn't forced—it flows.

HER MILLION DOLLAR CHALLENGE

And Elisha said unto her, What shall I do for thee? Tell me, what hast thou in the house? And she said, Thine handmaid hath not any thing in the house, save a pot of oil..

—2 KINGS 4:2 (KJV)

DEVOTIONAL

Every year, I challenge my students to take what I call **The Million Dollar Challenge**—a challenge rooted in the principles found in 2 Kings 4:3–7. In this story, the prophet Elisha charged the widow woman to take bold, obedient action in faith—and it unlocked her blessing.

I'll never forget when my own coach challenged me to make **\$10,000 in 10 days**. At first, I thought it was impossible. But I quickly learned something powerful: when you decide to believe in what God has placed within you, your capacity expands. You begin to see possibilities where there once were only limitations.

The truth is—most people are living far below their God-given potential. If you only knew what was already inside of you, you would stop struggling and start thriving.

When I first started my business journey in 2010, I had no idea I could do what I'm doing today. But I made a decision to stop making excuses. I worked harder than ever to learn, to grow, and to connect with people who could teach me. I stopped thinking small.

I once heard a great businessman say, “Stop thinking small. It’s just as hard—if not harder—to think small as it is to think big. Go after big deals, big projects, and big money.”

That’s the power of mindset—**90% of making money is mental.**

The widow woman had to step out of her comfort zone. She had to move past fear—fear of failure, fear of what others might say, and fear of her own self-doubt—and she had to **obey every instruction** from the prophet.

Step 1: Elisha gave her instruction that was simple, yet challenging:

“Go up and down the street and borrow jugs and bowls from all your neighbors. And not just a few—all you can get.”

That command stretched her faith. It forced her to take action, to ask, to move, and to trust that God would meet her.

Just like the widow woman, your blessing will begin to flow when you move in obedience and expectation. Realize that this woman had not seen yet what was about to happen. She went merely on obedience and trust. She could have said, “But...” or “What if...” She didn’t do any of those things, which I am sure she was tempted to—but instead she started knocking on doors. You’ll find out how much you trust God and His word, when He begins asking you to take action. Why? Because He knows how much you are capable of and what is already inside of you—more than you ever imagined.

Step 2: Lock the Door and Pour

“Then come home and lock the door behind you, you and your sons. Pour oil into each container; when each is full, set it aside.” 2 Kings 4:4 (MSG)

After gathering every jar she could find, Elisha gave the widow a strange instruction—*lock the door and begin to pour*.

Why? Because not every miracle happens in public. Some blessings are born behind closed doors. Where it’s just you and God. He will do more for you than you ever imagine when you get alone with Him and obey.

This was the moment where her *faith met her action*. She had done the uncomfortable part—asking neighbors for jars—but now she had to trust God in private. The prophet told her to shut the door because faith requires focus. When God is about to multiply what’s in your hand, He doesn’t need an audience—He needs your obedience.

The widow woman and her sons worked together. She poured, and they brought the vessels. It was a family effort, an act of unity and agreement. Sometimes your miracle requires partnership. You can’t do it all alone—but you also can’t let just anyone in the room.

When I think back to seasons where God was multiplying my work—businesses, students, or opportunities—He often had me *“lock the door.”* Not physically, but spiritually. I had to quiet the noise, ignore the opinions, and focus on my obedience to Him.

There’s a time for visibility and a time for *privacy*. A time to market your business and a time to go silent and build behind the scenes. The widow’s pouring season wasn’t about showing off; it was about stewarding. She poured until every single jar was filled—and only then did the oil stop.

Here’s the truth:

As long as she had room, the oil kept flowing.

As long as you keep showing up—creating, serving, giving, building—God will keep multiplying what’s in your hands. But once you stop making room, once you stop pouring, the flow will begin to stop. It’s not too late to start that business. It’s not over just because things didn’t work out the first time. Make room again for your abundance is drawing

near. Start pouring out what God has gifted you with you to change the world.

Step 3: Sell the Oil and Live on What's Left

"When all the jugs and bowls were full, she said to one of her sons, 'Another jug, please.' He said, 'That's it. There are no more jugs.' Then the oil stopped. She went and told the story to the man of God. He said, 'Go sell the oil and make good on your debts. Live, both you and your sons, on what's left.'"

—2 KINGS 4:7 (MSG)

Once the miracle had happened, the widow did the right thing—*she went back to the man of God for direction*. That's wisdom. Too many people stop after the miracle, but true stewardship begins when you ask God, *"What do I do next, Lord?"*

The Prophet gave her clear instruction:

Go sell. Pay. Live.

That's a three-part strategy for prosperity and purpose.

1. Go Sell the Oil.

The miracle wasn't just meant for survival—it was meant for the marketplace. The oil represented value, and Elisha told her to *monetize the miracle*. That's a word for someone today: what God gave you is valuable. Your skills, your story, your products, your wisdom—that's your oil. Don't let it sit on a shelf. Go sell it. Go share it. Go release it to the world.

2. Make Good on Your Debts.

Before she could live in overflow, she had to bring order. God blesses what's in alignment with His principles—and part of that is financial integrity. Paying off debt wasn't just about money; it was about *freedom*. God doesn't want you bound. He wants you *free* to live, give, and serve fully.

3. Live on What's Left.

This is the part that speaks to me every time—she didn't just have enough to pay her bills. She had enough to *live a full life*. Financial security for the widow woman and her children. Think about it—that was a lot of oil to live the rest of her life on—it was her overflow. That means God didn't just meet her need; He provided for her future. The same God who fills your jars will give you *financial security and sustainability*.

The widow went from *crying out for help* to *running her own oil business*. She became the solution to her own problem because she obeyed the Solution Maker. *God won't do for you, what He's already told you to do.*

That's how the blessing works—it multiplies what you have, eliminates what binds you, and creates a storehouse for your abundance.

DEVOTIONAL

Divine connections are one of the greatest catalysts for growth. God will often use relationships, meetings, and moments of favor to unlock the next level of your destiny. Proverbs 18:16 teaches us that **a generous gift opens doors**—not just physical doors, but doors of opportunity, influence, and favor.

A generous “gift” doesn’t have to be a lot; it can also be your **skill, service, honor, or time**—something of value that you bring to the table. God designed your gifts to make room for you—to place you before people who can expand your knowledge, sharpen your business acumen, and elevate your vision.

As a businesswoman, become sensitive to divine timing and divine placement. There are “**very important people**” God has already positioned along your path—mentors, investors, clients, and teachers—who carry something you need to expand. Listen to God leading you into their presence, and to come prepared, both spiritually and professionally.

As the new year of 2022 approached, I sought the Lord about the next steps for my life and business. I pursued a clear direction for how to expand and move forward. During that time, the Lord impressed upon my heart to begin attending a specific ministers meeting every time they gathered in their hometown. I knew it was a divine instruction and assignment.

So I obeyed; month after month, I attended those meetings. In the natural, nothing remarkable seemed to be happening—no major breakthroughs, no dramatic shifts—just powerful teaching and a consistent time in God’s presence. But each time I went, I took a generous gift, sowing into the Word and honoring the prompting of the Holy Spirit. What I didn’t realize then was that God was preparing the ground beneath my feet for a greater season of expansion.

By the end of the second year, the Lord began to speak clearly to me about my next assignment—and it was big. It was time to take the business to a new level, a level that required bold faith and even bolder confidence. Looking back, I see how every trip, every teaching, and every act of obedience positioned me for that moment. God was building capacity in me long before I saw the new assignment.

It pays to obey, even when you don’t understand what the Lord is doing. Every step of obedience plants a seed for your next season. You may not see it right away, but God always sees ahead—and when the time is right, He reveals the purpose behind the preparation.

Generosity unlocks favor. Honor opens hearts. When you bring your best—not just what’s convenient—you demonstrate the Kingdom principle of **seedtime and harvest**. Sometimes your best is—you. You just showing up produces favor. When you sow your time, respect, and money, your return multiplies in influence and prosperity.

Don’t be afraid to invest in relationships that stretch you. Attend that conference, reach out to that leader, enroll in that course, send that

thoughtful gift or thank-you note. Each act of generosity becomes a bridge that God uses to connect you to the people who will help expand your business and sharpen your understanding of wealth and riches.

Seek the Lord's leading. He knows exactly who you need to meet, when you need to meet them, and how to prepare for that moment. Your gift will do wonders—not because of manipulation, but because of divine favor and obedience.

One of them was Lydia, a businesswoman from the city of Thyatira who was a dealer of exquisite purple cloth and a Jewish convert. While Paul shared the good news with her, God opened her heart to receive Paul's message.

—ACTS 16:14 (NIV)

DEVOTIONAL

Lydia's story is short but packed with powerful lessons for women in business. She was a **businesswoman**, a dealer of exquisite purple cloth—a highly valued commodity in her time—and a woman of faith, a Jewish convert, open to God's direction.

Let's take a closer look at the **purple cloth Lydia dealt in**. Purple dye was extremely rare and expensive, made from the secretions of certain sea snails. Thousands of snails were needed to produce even a small amount of dye, and the labor to extract it and dye the fabric was painstaking and time-consuming. Only the wealthy or elite could afford garments of this color, making it a symbol of **royalty, power, and prestige**.

In many ways, Lydia's purple cloth mirrors the **Blood of Christ**. Just as the dye was rare, costly, and required great effort to produce, Jesus' sacrifice was precious, costly, and purposeful. He gave His life willingly, shedding His blood to purchase our freedom and clothe us with righteousness. The richness of the purple represents the **worth and value of His sacrifice**—a gift that is priceless, transformative, and eternal.

When Paul shared the good news with her, God opened her heart to receive the message. Lydia's openness led to transformation—not just in her spiritual life, but also in her business and her household. She didn't just hear the message; she acted. Acts 16:15 records that she and her household were baptized, and she invited Paul and his companions to stay in her home.

Here's the lesson for you as a woman in business: **God opens doors when hearts are open**. Lydia's business success wasn't the only thing that mattered—her willingness to respond to God's leading multiplied her influence and impact.

Too often, we rely only on our skills, networks, or strategies. But God wants to partner with you. He can open hearts, opportunities, and doors in your business that no human effort can achieve alone. Like Lydia, your **faith and responsiveness** can create pathways for divine favor and Kingdom impact. Openness to God's guidance is your greatest business strategy.

Ask yourself:

- Are you open to God's leading in your business today?
- Are there opportunities He's placing before you that require faith to step through?

DEVOTIONAL

In early 2011, I took a trip to Zimbabwe in South Africa. What was meant to be a ministry trip quickly turned into a moment that tested my faith and courage. I was taken to the police station without explanation, surrounded by officers questioning my every move. I remember sitting there, heart pounding, feeling completely out of control—but not without hope.

The Lord reminded me of Isaiah 54:17: “*No weapon formed against thee shall prosper.*” In that moment, I didn’t just quote it—I lived it. I whispered it under my breath like a battle cry until peace filled that room. Within hours, I was released without harm, without charge, and without fear. God had already gone before me.

Starting, running, and growing a business requires that same kind of courage. It's not for the faint of heart. There will be moments when you feel surrounded—by financial pressure, critics, or unexpected setbacks. But the woman of God rises in authority, not anxiety. She knows that Heaven is invested in her success.

No weapon—no failed deal, no rejection, no betrayal—can prosper when your life and business are built on the Rock. You are not a victim of circumstance; victory is your covenant promise. God's promises are your defense strategy, and His Word is your legal right to prosper.

DEVOTIONAL

I don't know what someone has told you about money, but here is the truth—**learning how to make money is a mindset.**

However you grew up and whatever you were told about money, has set your compass for how you view money. How money flows, how to make it, and how to keep it. I'll tell you right now—it's better to have money than not to have money. It's better to learn how to prosper than to live in a constant state of "barely getting by." It's better to live in overflow than to live on Barely-Get-Along Street. And you can have lots of money, and still have a **lack mindset.**

Yes, having wealth brings its own set of challenges—but so does *lack*. The difference is, God can give you the wisdom to handle abundance just as He's given you the grace to survive in scarcity.

I like to say it like this: There is a **Kingdom Wealth Code**, and it's perfectly suited for women who want to merge their love for God with their desire to grow a wildly successful business. Making a lot of money serving people is part of God's divine wealth principles—it focuses on the God-given design for prosperity.

Abraham is our father of faith, and he lived an extraordinarily abundant life. Solomon was so wise and rich that his life became our pattern for success throughout the book of Proverbs. John prayed for his beloved friends to prosper—and you can do the same: pray for your family to prosper, your friends to prosper, and your business to prosper.

God wants all of you—your spirit, soul, body, and finances—to thrive. You were **designed to prosper**. Deuteronomy 8:18 tells us that it is our covenant right and that He gives us the power to get wealth. *Claim it!*

There's a formula for success, just like there's a formula for staying poor. Prosperity doesn't happen by accident—it's learned, practiced, and stewarded.

If you've ever been told that money is evil, it's time to unlearn that lie. The Word of God says the **love of money** is the root of evil—not money itself. Money is a tool, and in the hands of Kingdom-minded women, it becomes a weapon for war—war against the devil.

DEVOTIONAL

Divine connections are one of the greatest catalysts for growth. God will often use relationships, meetings, and moments of favor to unlock the next level of your destiny. Proverbs 18:16 teaches us that **a generous gift opens doors**—not just physical doors, but doors of opportunity, influence, and wisdom.

A generous “gift” doesn’t have to be a lot; it can also be your **skill, service, honor, or time**—something of value that you bring to the table. God designed your gifts to make room for you—to place you before people who can expand your knowledge, sharpen your business acumen, and elevate your vision.

As a businesswoman, become sensitive to divine timing and divine placement. There are “**very important people**” God has already positioned along your path—mentors, investors, clients, and teachers—who carry something you need to expand. Listen to God leading you into their presence and come prepared, both spiritually and professionally.

As the New Year of 2022 approached, I sought the Lord about the next steps for my life and business. I wanted a clear direction for how to expand and move forward. During that time, the Lord impressed upon my heart to begin attending a specific couples’ ministry meeting every time they gathered in their hometown. I had been there before, but this time, I knew it was an instruction—a divine assignment.

So I obeyed. Month after month, I attended those meetings. In the natural, nothing remarkable seemed to be happening—no breakthroughs, no dramatic shifts—just powerful teaching and a consistent time in God’s presence. But each time I went, I took a generous gift, sowing into the Word and honoring the prompting of the Holy Spirit. What I didn’t realize then was that God was preparing the ground beneath my feet for a greater season of expansion.

By the end of the second year, the Lord began to speak clearly to me about my next assignment—and it was big. It was time to take the business to a new level, a level that required bold faith and divine confidence. Looking back, I see how every trip, every teaching, and every act of obedience positioned me for that moment. God was building capacity in me long before I saw the opportunity.

It pays to obey, even when you don’t understand what the Lord is doing. Every step of obedience plants a seed for your next season. You may not see it right away, but God always sees ahead—and when the time is right, He reveals the purpose behind the preparation.

Generosity unlocks favor. Honor opens hearts. When you bring your best—not just what’s convenient—you demonstrate the Kingdom principle of **seedtime and harvest**. Sometimes your best is—you. Your just showing up produces favor. When you sow your time, respect, and money, your return multiplies in influence and prosperity.

Don’t be afraid to invest in relationships that stretch you. Attend that conference, reach out to that leader, enroll in that course, send that

thoughtful gift or thank-you note. Each act of generosity becomes a bridge that God uses to connect you to the people who will help expand your business and sharpen your understanding of wealth and riches.

Seek the Lord's leading. He knows exactly who you need to meet, when you need to meet them, and how to prepare for that moment. Your gift will do wonders—not because of manipulation, but because of divine favor and obedience.

FOR SUCH A TIME AS THIS SHE LIVES

For if thou altogether holdest thy peace at this time, then shall there enlargement and deliverance arise to the Jews from another place; but thou and thy father's house shall be destroyed: and who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this?

DEVOTIONAL

Most of us are familiar with the story of Esther, and this powerful verse in Esther 4:14. It has inspired movies, plays, and countless retellings, including *One Night with the King* (2006), where a young Jewish woman hides her origins while the Persian king searches for a bride.

But for today's devotional, let's step back to Esther 4:3 and focus on Mordecai, her uncle and guardian. His faith and courage in the face of danger are lessons every businesswoman can learn from:

"And Mordecai told them to answer Esther: 'Do not think in your heart that you will escape in the king's palace any

more than all the other Jews. For if you remain completely silent at this time, relief and deliverance will arise for the Jews from another place...”

—ESTHER 4:13-14A (NKJV)

Notice this: Mordecai gave Esther a choice. She could obey God and step into the divine purpose for which He had positioned her—or remain silent and safe. God had placed her in the palace for such a time as this.

The same is true for you as a woman in business: God has positioned you where you are for a divine assignment. He has given you gifts, vision, and opportunities, but obedience is required to see them fulfilled.

Perhaps you've had ideas, dreams, or business opportunities that seemed too risky, too hard or too scary. Fear, self-doubt, or timing may have held you back. Verse 14 reminds us:

“If you remain completely silent at this time, relief and deliverance will arise from another place...”

God's work will still be accomplished—with you or without you. But when you step forward in obedience, you become the vessel of His blessings and provision. Acting on God's guidance moves you into prosperity, fulfillment, and a destiny uniquely yours.

Ask yourself: What is God calling me to do today? What dream, idea, or business opportunity has He placed in my heart that I've ignored? Your obedience opens doors for deliverance, influence, and Kingdom impact.

What a freeing statement for every woman in business!

When you try to build your business or pursue your marketplace calling solely in your own wisdom and strength, it becomes exhausting—spiritually, mentally, and physically. You were never meant to carry that weight alone—you were never meant to **Do Business Alone**. You have the ultimate business partner—**Jesus Christ**—who gives you success, strategy, and strength for every season. There is a supernatural supply that only He can bring and it is so much better than all we can do on our own. He opens doors where doors are closed. He provides clients when

there seems to be no supply. He negotiates contracts when you have come to the end of all talks.

He knows the plans He has for you. He knew your name before anyone else did. As Jeremiah reminds us, *“Before I formed you in your mother’s womb, I knew you.”* (Jeremiah 1:5) No matter your past—whether you were planned, unplanned, adopted, or left to figure things out on your own—God personally crafted you for a divine assignment. Every challenge, every opportunity, every season is shaping you for divine destiny.

“And who knows but that God has placed you in the royal palace for just such a time as this?”

—ESTHER 4:14 (TPT)

The King James translation says, *“For if thou altogether holdest thy peace at this time, then shall there enlargement and deliverance arise to the Jews from another place; but thou and thy father’s house shall be destroyed: and who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this?”*

You’re not too late, too young, too old, or too far gone. The phrase *“for such a time as this”* highlights divine timing and purpose—God’s intentional placement of Esther (and you) to fulfill a specific purpose at the exact right moment in time. The same God who called Esther into her divine assignment has positioned you in your business, career, ministry, or marketplace to fulfill a divine purpose. You were approved, anointed, and appointed to walk this journey of divine assignment on your life.

Stop striving in your own strength and start partnering with the One who never fails and never runs out of ideas or clients. He will guide you in all of your business decisions if you will take the time to ask Him. Ask Him to open new doors, to lead you into wisdom and wealth. When your dream feels bigger than you, then you know you are right on track.

Esther had a bigger assignment than she could do on her own. It took faith instead of fear, obedience instead of opposition, and strategy instead of stubbornness.

Paul said:

“I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.”

—PHILIPPIANS 3:14 (KJV)

“Well done, thou good and faithful servant,” is our prize. When you can say, “*I’ve done all that God has asked me to do,*” then you can go home and be with the Lord. Until then, get busy fulfilling your dreams and following His assignment on your life.

Jesus will be the author and finisher of your faith—go with Him. Your assignment is not done yet. You still have some business to do with God. Whether you are in ministry or in the marketplace, your calling to help people is no less than someone standing in the pulpit. Your pulpit is the marketplace. Your service is to people. The product(s) you offer are meant to make someone’s life more successful and easier.

Press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling, be found faithful doing what God has assigned you to do. **Mark my word:** if you press toward that mark—it will lead to divine destiny.

Open new doors of wisdom, favor, and divine strategy. Like Esther, I want to fulfill my purpose "for such a time as this." I press toward the mark, knowing that You will finish what You started in me.

DEVOTIONAL

What are you doing with the 24 hours you've been given?

How are you investing the time God has entrusted to you?

Every woman—whether a billionaire in her mansion, a student in her dorm room, or a mother raising her children—has one equal gift from Heaven: **time**. How we use it, steward it, and master it determines the outcome of our future.

Time is Heaven's democratic gift.

No one gets more. No one gets less.

The difference between success and stagnation is stewardship of time.

Every hour wasted is a piece of your destiny delayed.

Moses prayed in Psalm 90, “*Help us to remember that our days are numbered...*” He continues, “*Set Your wisdom deeply in our hearts so that we may accept Your correction.*”

I like to say it like this:

“Lord, set Your wisdom deep in my heart so I may accept Your correction and know Your direction.”

You cannot continue walking your own path, using time however you want, and expect to fulfill your divine purpose. God’s correction keeps you aligned with His direction—and His direction leads you straight into success, clarity, and calling.

Recently, I met a beautiful young woman from China who came to America to chase the “American Dream.” Her success was obvious—wealth surrounded her home. Yet inside, her heart was empty. Her soul was aching. Why? Because you cannot spend all your time building success while ignoring the One who created you for fellowship.

Time is the opportunity you’ve been given to draw closer to God, pursue your divine purpose, and make a Kingdom impact.

Time is the currency of destiny.

How you steward your time is how you steward your life.

If your hours are spent scrolling, binge-watching, or in distraction—yet your finances are in shambles, your business is stagnant, and your client list is empty—something must change.

Life doesn’t get better by chance; it gets better by *change*.

Jesus modeled this for us. He spent time with the Father **first**—before decisions, before ministry, before the crowds. If you misuse your mornings, you’ll misuse your miracles.

Have you sought His direction today?

Have you asked for His counsel, His wisdom, His strategies?

Mastering your time is mastering your life.

Daniel understood this.

“He kneeled upon his knees three times a day, and prayed...”

—DANIEL 6:10–11

He scheduled his prayer life like an unbreakable appointment.

That discipline produced the spirit of excellence that promoted him.

Paul understood it too:

He disciplined his time, mastered his thoughts, and conquered his emotions.

That's how he wrote over half the New Testament.

“[24]Isn’t it obvious that all runners on the racetrack keep on running to win, but only one receives the victor’s prize? Yet each one of you must run the race to be victorious. [25] A true athlete will be disciplined in every respect, practicing constant self-control in order to win a laurel wreath that quickly withers. But we run our race to win a victor’s crown that will last forever. [26] For that reason, I don’t run just for exercise or box like one throwing aimless punches, [27] but I train like a champion athlete. I subdue my body and get it under my control, so that after preaching the good news to others, I myself won’t be disqualified.”

—1 CORINTHIANS 9:24-27 (TPT)

Athletes have strict training and routines. They rise early, train when they are tired, resist the temptation to quit, and endure discomfort—because they stay focused—on the prize. When your focus is broken, your business will be broke. Champions do what it takes to win, while others are losing at life.

If you want champion-level success in business, you must develop champion-level mastery.

HOW TO MASTER YOUR TIME

1. Focus

Stay focused on winning. Champions don't talk about quitting. Take every thought of defeat captive.

2. Discipline

Train your body and your emotions to obey your assignment. Winners don't train like amateurs—they train like champions.

3. Consistency

Practice self-control daily. Subdue your body, discipline your mind, command your focus. Don't let your feelings lead—you lead them.

When you master your focus, you'll control your future.

When you steward your time, you'll steward your wealth.

When you control consistency, you'll increase your currency.

Stop saying you don't have enough time. The only thing that is different between those who have more and those who don't is how they have chosen to spend the 24 hours in their day.

You want success? Spend each hour on actions that create success. Value each hour like a champion athlete values each workout and training. Like, there is a prize at the end of the day—because there is. Stop scrolling and practice self-control. Stop complaining and become consistent. Stop the destructive talk and be disciplined.

DEVOTIONAL

Your business journey is not just about building a successful company—it's also about fulfilling the high calling God has placed on your life—your mission in the marketplace.

I was a pastor's wife for twenty-eight years until my husband suddenly died. A year before his passing, I woke up one morning with Jesus standing by my bed. When I saw Him, I immediately left my body. The next thing I knew, I was standing on the edge of a building ledge with Jesus, looking out over the city. Across the street, I saw a set of high-rise buildings, but one particularly stood out to me. It was an eight-story building divided into two sections—four stories on the bottom and four stories on the top.

There was a group of people on the bottom four floors whom I recognized. I asked Jesus, “*Who are they, Lord? Why are they all there?*” He said, “*Those are all the people I sent you to. They are out doing the will of My Father because you obeyed My call to go pastor in the place I called you.*” I then asked, “*Who are all those people in the top four floors?*” They were different from the ones below—a group of businessmen and women at an event or party. Some had cocktails in their hands. Most of the men were wearing suits, and the women were dressed in corporate casual attire. Jesus said to me, “*Those are all the ones I am now sending you to—and if you will go, they will come to know Me.*”

As Jesus finished that sentence, He was suddenly gone and I turned to find a pair of pink tennis shoes in the middle of the floor. I ran over and began to put them on. As I did, I was back in my body and heard myself gasp for air before I was gone again.

This time, I was on a dirt road. Jesus was on my left and Bill (my husband) was on my right as we walked down a country dirt road. Soon, we came to a fork in the road, and Bill turned to walk down the road on the right while Jesus and I turned left down the road. I began to cry out to Bill, “*Please don’t leave me! I don’t want to walk this road by myself! Please, please don’t leave me!*” The powerful presence of Jesus walking beside me kept me moving forward with Him, though I kept turning and calling after Bill.

Then Bill turned around, and with a calm, confident, peaceful voice, he said, “*I have finished my race. I have done everything that the Lord has asked me to do, and I have won my reward. But your race is not finished yet—you have more to do. Go with Jesus; He will be the author and finisher of your faith.*” As he spoke those words, Jesus’ steady walk ahead turned my body forward, as though we were on an escalator. That was the last thing I heard from Bill before I returned to my body—wide awake in my bed.

Jesus talked to me about many things that day, but I have never seen Him like that again. One year later, almost to the day, Bill went home to be with the Lord. He finished his race here on earth—I was forty-nine.

Philippians 3:14 encourages us to press forward, stay focused, and persevere toward the prize that God has set before us. Your destiny was already planned in the heart of God before you were ever born. He knew

you when He formed you in your mother's womb. God's plan for your life—whether you are called to the marketplace or ministry—is a divine call to serve and minister to people.

If you're in bookkeeping, you're helping people with their financial future. If you're a cook or own a restaurant, you're feeding the hungry. If you're a coach, teacher, or professor, you're empowering people to grow and become all God has called them to be. If you're a manager, executive, leader, speaker, politician, or surgeon—you are a *sent one* into that industry to impact it for the Kingdom of God.

This verse reminds us that success is more than achievements or accolades—it's about divine destiny. You were handpicked by God to do what you do, to influence your industry, to be in that place for *such a time as this*. You are not there by chance; you are divinely appointed by the Creator to walk in His purpose.

"For if thou altogether holdest thy peace at this time, then shall there enlargement and deliverance arise to the Jews from another place; but thou and thy father's house shall be destroyed: and who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"

—ESTHER 4:14 (KJV)

Are you where you are because *thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this*? Every ethical decision, every step of diligent work, every faithful act in your business, every action of love for family or church, contributes to the fulfillment of your high calling. Challenges and setbacks may arise, but the call remains the same—to press forward despite circumstances, trusting God and committing your ways to Him.

Matthew 25:21 affirms:

"Well done, thou good and faithful servant: thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things: enter thou into the joy of thy lord."

When we stand before Jesus, we will give an account of all we have done for Him. I want to hear those words: *"Well done, thou good and faithful servant."* I have committed my life to fulfill all that God has

called me to do in the marketplace and in ministry. I don't want to go to my grave with anything left undone, that God had on His agenda for me.

Don't get me wrong—I'm not perfect. I can be slow to obey. But somehow, I find the courage to get back on that dirt road and walk alongside Jesus. It's a much better place to be.

Pressing toward the prize means setting your eyes on God's purpose, not temporary comfort or fleeting success. It's a daily commitment to take bold, faithful steps, knowing that one day you will hear, *"Well done, good and faithful servant."*

Your faithfulness today shapes the Kingdom impact you will make and the prosperity you will hold.

- I press toward the mark of my high calling in Christ Jesus, and I will finish my race with joy—faithful, fruitful, and full of purpose.



SHE MEANS BUSINESS

Who could ever find a wife like this one—she is a woman of strength and mighty valor! She's full of wealth and wisdom. The price paid for her was greater than many jewels.

—PROVERBS 31:10 (TPT)

DEVOTIONAL

The Hebrew word used to describe this virtuous wife is “*khayil*.” There is no English word that fully captures its meaning: **military strength**—implying might, valor, and victory. This word is often used in connection with **military prowess**.

This woman is not timid or passive. She is a **warring wife**—strong in spirit, morally righteous, excellent, wealthy, full of substance, integrity, abilities, and strength; mighty like an army.

Let's look at how various translations ask this question in Proverbs 31:10:

- “Who can find a virtuous woman?” (KJV)
- “An excellent woman [one who is spiritual, capable, intelligent, and virtuous]—who is he who can find her?” (AMP)
- “A good woman is hard to find, and worth far more than diamonds.” (MSG)
- “A wife of noble character who can find? She is worth far more than rubies.” (NIV)

Isn’t that a beautiful picture of who God calls you to be? You are the virtuous woman, the Proverbs 31 woman He has paid for. You’re not trying to become a virtuous woman; the Lord is speaking over you, who you already are.

That word *greater* in Hebrew denoted **her worth**—a worth purchased by the **sacred Blood of the Lamb of God**, her Bridegroom. You were bought with a price no man can touch. You are worth more than rubies (to Him), more than diamonds, more than any physical product on earth is worth. The entire chapter of Proverbs 31 talks about who you are and who He has made you—not who you are ‘not’ and need to become. That sacred Blood of Christ bought for you a covenant that **speaks. He is speaking over you—Woman of Wealth and Wisdom, Strength and Mighty Warrior. You’re not trying to become this woman; you are who He says you are.**

As a new bride, getting ready to meet your Bridegroom, as you enter through those church sanctuary doors to walk down the aisle to say those very important two words, ‘I do,’ you take on everything that your new husband is and has. His name, his riches, his debt, his children, his family—everything. You become ‘One Flesh’ in the eyes of your friends and family, the court’s, and the Lord.

After the untimely death of my husband—my lover, best friend, a great father, and faithful pastor—I was heartbroken and felt alone for the first time in my life. We had been in full-time ministry from the day we said, “I do.” Together we pastored churches, ministered throughout the US, and taught in Churches and Bible Schools around the world. We worked in our businesses together, but I had never run a successful business on my own before, yet God said to me,

“Take this publishing house and grow it. I will be your business partner, and together we will grow it.”

I hate to admit this, but there were months when I didn’t let Him be my partner. I tried to handle things on my own—until desperation drove me to surrender. Too often, we wait until all else fails before talking to the Master business builder, the One who knows all things and cares about our success more than anyone else ever could.

He wants us to succeed even more than we want to. He wants us to *fulfill* our dreams more than we want to. He is working on our behalf, even when we don’t think anything is going on. He’s behind the scenes, for our success. We have a covenant with Him—so we are not trying to become this successful businesswoman. He is already calling us a virtuous woman worth more than rubies—*khayil: mighty, wealthy, excellent, morally righteous, full of substance, integrity, abilities and strength, mighty like an army*.

HOW TO BE A PROVERBS 31 WOMAN

1. Agree with God.

Proverbs 31 is not just a description—it’s a confession. Speak it over yourself daily as your divine identity.

2. Ask Him to reveal to you His covenant promises.

Deuteronomy 8:18 promises, “It is He who gives you power to get wealth.” Invite Him to guide your business decisions and show you the path to wealth and riches.

3. Act in faith in the Word—no matter how you feel.

Don’t allow fear, emotions, or limited thinking to hold you back from what Jesus has already paid for you. Your breakthrough is on the other side of obedience to His Word.

In 2009, I asked the Lord to send me a business coach. I had no money—a mountain of debt from a very expensive funeral bill, no life insurance policy—but God answered. Suddenly, out of nowhere, two weeks after that desperate prayer, a businessman called to offer me a job opening for Him on stage during his national business conferences.

How good is God to pay me for what I needed to learn, instead of me paying? Even through my grief, I believed God would supply abundantly. I didn't know how, but He always pays — He has never left me without.

Why? Because I took **Deuteronomy 8:18 and 3 John 2** literally:

*“But thou shalt remember the LORD thy God: for it is he that **giveth thee power** to get wealth, that he may establish his covenant...”*

—DEUTERONOMY 8:18 (KJV)

“Beloved, I pray that in every way you may succeed and prosper and be in good health [physically], just as [I know] your soul prospers [spiritually].”

—3 JOHN 2 (MSG)

*“Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive **them**, and ye shall have **them**. ”*

—MARK 11:24 (KJV)

Take Him at His Word and begin to speak this virtuous woman's poetic promise over your life and business as a confession of faith. Your dreams and visions are important to Him—He says you can and you are. Declare it. Do it. Dominate it, and watch what will begin to happen for you. As you pursue your purpose, He has already been calling you—*khayil*.

Write out Proverbs 31:10–31 in your journal and personalize each verse. Replace “she” and “her” with your name. Declare it daily. Example— [your name] is a woman of strength and mighty valor, full of wealth and wisdom.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. In what areas have you tried to run your life or business without letting God be your partner?
2. What does Proverbs 31 mean to you personally?
3. What step of faith is God asking you to take today toward your own prosperity?

PRAYER PROMPT

“Heavenly Father, create in me a clean heart, O God—a woman of virtue and valor. Thank You for making me a woman of strength and might like an army, worthy of Your blood and full of wisdom. A businesswoman full of grace and love toward all mankind. Teach me to depend fully on You as my divine business partner—making me strong and confident in the boardroom. I seek Your wisdom to lead and grow what You have assigned me to do on this earth. Teach me how to better take hold of my covenant rights with honor and humility, reclaiming all that the enemy has stolen. I take my seat at the table and dine with You boldly and humbly, knowing that every good and perfect gift comes down from the Father of Lights. Everything I have flows from Your hand of favor and mercy. You are establishing Your covenant of wealth and prosperity in my life so that everything I do brings glory to Your name.

In Jesus’ name, Amen.”

SHE WALKS IN GREAT BLESSING

Great blessing and wealth fills the house of the wise, for their integrity endures forever.

—PSALM 112:3 (TPT)

DEVOTIONAL

“Great blessing and wealth fills the house of the wise...”

The Message Translation says, “Their **houses** brim with wealth.”

The New International Version says, “Wealth and riches are in their **houses**.”

Notice it says **houses** in both translations. That's real estate, income, and wealth building.

Second, it says ***GREAT blessing and wealth fills the house...*** That word **great** means: notably large in size; huge; elaborate; ample; remarkable in magnitude, degree, or effectiveness.

Why...does great blessing and wealth fill the house? Because of wisdom.

Psalm 112:1 tells us why:

“Praise ye the LORD. Blessed is the man that feareth the LORD, that delighteth greatly in his commandments.”

When you delight yourself in the Lord, wisdom abounds, and the man (or woman) who fears the Lord obtains great blessing and wealth. Why is this so important for us to see? Because we *all* have a mindset about money (wealth)—how to make money, how money works, the relationship we have with money and wealth, and what we have heard all of our lives growing up about money. It shapes our relationship with money.

Over 75% of the small business owners and entrepreneurs I have coached throughout my career come to me with a definite ***lack mindset*** about money, and don't realize it. They definitely don't realize that they are hindering their own business and financial growth. This includes people who have money and those who don't. Even some pastors I coach—who preach regularly on giving and abundance—have a deep-rooted seed that somehow, for some reason, **great blessing and wealth are not for them**. They believe God is no respecter of persons, but for one reason or another, they feel it's not meant for *them*.

Where does this '*lack mindset*' come from?

It is a deep-rooted belief that was heard, seen, or told by family, friends, the enemy, or your own inner critic. It is a seed planted that sounds like this:

- “Don't you wish we were born into a wealthy family?”
- “You'll have to work for every penny you ever make.”
- “You'll never get ahead.”
- “Being rich is for other people, not me.”
- “You'll never be smart enough to be rich—you don't have enough education.”

- “You wouldn’t know what to do with money if you had it.”
- “Wealth and riches are for other people, not me.”
- “We’re blessed—but having money or talking about making money isn’t humble.”
- “God doesn’t like that, so I shouldn’t talk about having money.”
- “If I get money or do something great, I won’t take any credit for it because that’s pride.”
- “We’ll always be blessed just enough to make it and that’s okay—I don’t deserve more than that.”

It’s okay to make money, have money, and build a wildly successful business, ministry, church, and organization. Just remember who taught you, opened doors for you, and surrounded you with favor. “And you shall remember the Lord your God, for *it is* He who gives you power **to get wealth**, that He may **establish His covenant** which He swore to your fathers, as *it is* this day.

She is filled with blessings and wealth, not only because she is gifted, but because she is grounded.

Her business flourishes not only because of strategy, but because of stance—a **stance** rooted in integrity, honor, generosity, and righteousness.

Integrity is the invisible currency of the Kingdom. It is what clients remember, partners respect, and Heaven rewards.

The Psalmist reveals the secret: **Blessing and wealth fill the house of the wise BECAUSE her integrity endures.**

Others, but most of all heaven sees her faithfulness in the little things.

They witness her truthfulness, her fairness, her refusal to cut corners or compromise.

Her yes means yes—her no means no.

Her business dealings are pure and right.

She honors the Word above the world.

She puts Scripture before sales.

She chooses character over shortcuts.

She understands that **integrity is a seed—and God always multiplies it.**

She is not only a businesswoman—she is a minister of reconciliation in the marketplace.

She carries in her the gospel as she works; therefore her ethics, her attitude, her conversations, and her compassion guide her business dealings. She is a Proverbs 31 Woman. She is a seller of purple like Lydia, clothed in the precious blood of Jesus.

She is generous—quick to give, quick to help the poor, quick to minister to the broken.

She is diligent, not distracted—devoted, not divided.

She chases hard after God; because of that she never has to chase success—**it chases her.**

Wealth takes up residence in her home.

Blessing is her fountain—she overflows with wisdom.

An entrepreneurial woman of faith doesn't succeed by manipulation, striving, or networking alone—**but because of her virtue, vigor, and vision.**

In Jesus' name, Amen."
