THE FIRST SUNDAY

On the first Sunday of the month we acknowledge the people who are celebrating birthdays, baptisms, wedding anniversaries, or any other special milestones.

The vestry has also indicated that the first Sunday of the month, in accordance with the church canons, (rules, by-laws) is when any monies placed in the offering plate that are not identified, as a pledge, will go into the discretionary account. The vicar's discretionary account is used for the special needs of the church and greater community. For example, the homeless family we supported, to stay at the hotel those few nights, came out of this fund, as well as some of the Christmas gifts given to the family in December.

If people in our church family are in financial need or have an emergency these funds are also available. The distribution of these funds can be confidential, only known by the vicar. People may contribute to this fund by cash or check -- please put discretionary fund on the memo line.

"MISSION" TO "FULL" CHURCH STATUS

The Church of the Incarnation is currently a mission church, a church that has needed the financial support of the Diocese of Virginia to remain open. It is under the authority of the bishop, as well as the Committee for Congregational Missions (CCM), which are required to review our budget, mission, and ministry objectives. The priest in a mission is called a vicar, because s/he works at the request of the bishop in consultation with the mission and has a one-year renewable contract.

When a church achieves full church status, the priest is called a rector; s/he works under the bishop but has permanent status in the congregation. The priest and congregation determine budget, priorities and no longer need the approval from the bishop or CCM.

To qualify for full church status a mission must be financially independent and show long-range viability to be a self-sustaining church. The vestry must submit to the regional council, the CCM and the bishop a petition for a change of status. Even though the expectation is that a mission must show a minimum of three years of self-sufficiency and vitality, we will submit our paperwork this year in hopes that in November of 2019 the diocesan convention may approve our request. At that time, we will have submitted three years of budgets indicating no diocesan financial support, although we will have only completed two years. So, if we do not receive full church status in 2019, we would certainly be eligible in 2020.

PLEDGING AS A SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINE

The vestry and I would like to extend a special THANK YOU, for everyone who made a 2019 pledge. In the Old Testament it was expected that believers would give an animal or grain offering, a sacrifice to God. In the New Testament Jesus asks us to give God our very best – first, and not all that we have, but to work toward giving our best ten percent first.

Everyone filled out their financial contribution but many did not turn the pledge card over and fill in their gifts of time and talent. Both sides of the pledge card are equally important and everyone, no matter what age can participate. For example, there is a line indicating participation in Sunday worship. You do that already—let's make sure we give ourselves that credit. Most people participate in fellowship and refreshments, it is listed as well.

If you didn't fill out both sides of your pledge card, please pray about how God is calling you to mission and ministry at The Church of the Incarnation, fill it out another one and turn it in. If you are new to the church and need a pledge card, they can be found in the brochure rack next to church front and side doors.
