MOTHER SPICE GOES TO CHAPLAIN CLASS

Every Thursday at the Louisa Sheriff's department. Here is one of the things she has learned....

Virginia law requires you to take a blood or breath test if you are arrested for a DUI. Virginia's "implied consent" law says that if you are lawfully arrested by an officer who has probable cause to believe that you have been driving under the influence, then you consent to taking a chemical test of your blood, breath, or both for the purpose of determining your blood alcohol content (BAC) or the presence of drugs. The test or tests must be taken within three hours of driving and in most cases, the officer will offer you the breath test first. If the breath test is unavailable or if you can't complete a breath test, then the officer will ask for a blood test.

You could be asked to take a preliminary breath test even before you have been arrested. This works like a field sobriety test. The officer will use the results to establish probable cause that you were driving under the influence. You do not have to take this preliminary test and if you refuse it, evidence of this refusal cannot be used against you later in court. Refusing it, however, probably won't work in your favor if the officer has some other reason to think you had been drinking. Based on that other reason, the officer could still arrest you and then you will be required to take a test under the law described in the paragraph above. You can read Virginia's implied consent law in the Virginia Code Annotated 18.2-268.2.
