COMMUNITY ACTION NAPA VALLEY (CANV) FOOD DRIVE

Thank you to residents who participated in the very successful CANV Food Drive, your generosity filled the barrel! A barrel will be placed in the clubhouse foyer again the second week of December to continue the Food Drive.

CHRISTMAS DECORATING SAFETY TIPS

Decorating your home, or yard is a fun, festive way to celebrate the holiday season.

When decorating the outside of your home, make sure decorations are well-ventilated, protected from weather and a safe distance away from flammable items.

Unplug electric lights, devices, and decorations before installing or replacing bulbs, changing parts or attempting other repairs. Secure lights, decorations, and cords to prevent wind damage. Never staple, nail through, or fasten electrical wires or extensions cords in any way that might damage the wire or insulation. This could cause electrical shock or fire. Turn off all lights and electrical decorations before leaving your home or going to bed.

RULES REMINDER

Multiple complaints have been received from residents regarding residents' cats who are roaming outside and onto other resident's premises. This is a reminder that keeping a pet in Vineyard Valley is contingent upon the pet owner complying with the pet rules and regulations below.

PETS: Residents must obtain special permission from the Management to keep no more than two (2) domesticated house pets in this Park.

No pet may invade the privacy of anyone's homesite, garden, flower beds, shrubs, yard, etc. The California Health and Safety Code 18603: 1608 states: Dogs, cats and other animals are not permitted to run at large in a Mobile Home Park.

With the exception of guide dogs, signal dogs for the hearing impaired, and service dogs, pets are not allowed in the Clubhouse, pool area, Mail Room or Hobby Building.

Pet litter must be removed <u>daily</u> from your premises. Pet owners are responsible for removing pet's litter <u>when walking pets.</u>

Residents are permitted to have <u>INDOOR CATS</u> ONLY. All pet owners must agree to keep their animals under strict control and to hold the Park and its employees harmless from any damage and/or injuries that may occur to any person as a result of any act of the pet, or any negligence or failure of its owner to fully control the pet.

Report any violation of these rules to the Park Management.

SWIMMING POOL REMINDER

The swimming pool closes December 1st and reopens April 1st.

50 YEARS of VINEYARD VALLEY

50 Years of Vineyard Valley. Who knew it had existed this long? Well, Mariam Hansen has been chronicling the ins and outs of our park, which she presented on a sunny early November afternoon in the clubhouse. Detailing with pictures and headlines revealed the story of how VV came to be and all the travails and scandals it has endured, with over 50 folks attending. It was very informative, covering efforts getting the park established and how in 1975 Dick McDonnell



came to own the park. The Floods were a big part of the presentation and how they almost finished the park several times (1986, 1995 & 2005). There was even a period when the park was uninhabitable for quite some time. But through it all, many of our current 'Old Timers' have endured and fought to keep moving forward. Mariam has chronicled this history in both VIVA and the Saint Helena Historical Society. It's a fascinating look and well worth the time.

Richard Henry Dana, Jr.

author of Two Years Before the Mast

Excerpted from They Left Their Mark: Famous Passages through Wine Country by Joan Parry Dutton

There were many illustrious Danas in the large and influential Massachusetts family, but Richard Henry Dana, Jr is the best remembered for writing *Two Years Before the Mast.* He was born in Cambridge and at Harvard he was suspended for six months for his role in a student "rebellion". In his third year he caught the measles, which damaged his eyesight. So he was not allowed to return to Harvard for a year. Frustrated, he signed on as an ordinary seaman on a trading voyage to the California coast in 1834–36. Upon



returning home, he graduated in 1837 at the head of his class at Harvard and entered Dane Law School at Cambridge. He began writing his book in 1838, thinking it might bring him business in maritime law. After graduating he worked in a law office, then was admitted to the bar in 1840.

That same year his book Two Years Before the Mast was published and it was a great success. (The term "before the mast" refers to sailors' quarters, which were located in the ship's bow.) Ten Thousand copies were sold the first year and it has never been out of print. For the 1869 edition he wrote a new chapter about his later voyage around the globe in 1859. The postscript is titled, "Twenty-Four Years After" during which he visited the Geysers. It is a brief but interesting reference:

"I must not pause for the dreary country of the Geysers, the screaming escapes of steam, the boiling cauldrons of black and yellow and green...not for the park-like scenery and captivating ranchos of the Napa Valley."

Dana went to the Geysers a day or so before Christmas in 1859. Why did he see no beauty in the Geyser region, which others exalted in? And how did he find the way to the Geysers when the trip was so hard and the route hard to find?

The answers are in the journal Dana kept on this trip to California. He wrote that on December 20, 1859 he went by steamer to visit the Mare Island Navy Yard at Vallejo. On board he met General Mariano Vallejo, whom he had met on his first voyage. The General remembered Dana and they talked. Also on board was George Yount, the famous pioneer, who invited Dana to visit Napa Valley. Also on board was ex-military governor of eastern North Carolina and later congressman from North Carolina Edward L. Stanly, also returning to his Napa Valley ranch. Governor Stanly offered to take Dana to the Geysers.

After overnighting in Vallejo, Dana took the morning stagecoach to Napa where Stanly met him with a buggy and a pair of mules. They reached Yount's Rancho Caymus toward evening and slept there. Dana wrote "Best of weather, wood fires and open doors. This is California winter." Little did he know that even California winter weather could change unpredictably. Stanly and Dana drove in the buggy up through the Napa Valley, past future Calistoga and to Knight's Valley. On the way Dana wrote:


"Evergreen oak and the common deciduous oak droops, almost like a willow, with mistletoe and has long pendants of their hanging grey moss all among the leaves. Very pretty. Trees are large and come right out of the sod, as in English parks."

They wanted to meet a Mr. McDonnell, one of the first guides to the Geysers. They reach the McDonnell home at night, but the guide was away. Another man named Brady

agreed to lead them. The next morning the three men set out on horseback and reached the Geysers in almost five hours. Dana was not impressed and the weather turned against them with heavy fog. It began to rain as they departed about 2:30pm. By 5pm it was dark, raining heavily with little visibility.

"Single file, but can see neither Stanly nor his horse, nor can I see the guide or his horse. We call out at intervals not to lose each other. Several streams to ford. Guide loses the trail (an Indian trail), says to follow the creek...See light! It is McDonnell's. Get lost in the yard. Glad to get to the fire, lights, change clothes and eat a warm supper. Mrs. McDonnell had nearly given up on us."

It rained hard all night and was still raining heavily the next morning. Brady said the creeks were too high for the buggy to pass, but Stanly insisted he get back to Napa City. Finally they made it over the creek. It was dark by the time they reached Yount's Ranch and decided they



"It's Christmas but Stanly must go on to Napa and telegraph is wife at Sacramento or she will panic. They've been so kind to me and all on my account that we came here—so I agree to move on and our whole day was spent on a rainy, muddy road to Napa City. Afternoon is too late for church. Spent afternoon and evening in tavern barroom (no fireplace in other rooms)..Stanly and I have some reasonable and agreeable conversations. All our journey we have had agreeable conversation. Stanly told anecdotes of Congressional life, politics, etc..."

The next day Governor Stanly was off to Sacramento and Richard Dana, Jr reached his quarters in San Francisco before dark.

Afterword: The Geysers is the world's largest geothermal field, containing a complex of 18 geothermal power plants, drawing steam from more than 350 wells, located in the Mayacamas Mountains approximately 72 miles north of San Francisco, California. Geysers produced about 20% of California's renewable energy in 2019. You can drive to the Geysers north on Hwy 128 to Knight's Valley. Look for the Geysers Road sign. There is a security gate, but you can see parts of the operation from the road.

Edward Stanly's ranch is now an Auberge Resorts property south of Napa in the Carneros area. Their construction loan was recently forclosed on. Visit https://auberge.com/stan-ly-ranch//



Royal We Tasting Room

St. Helena's newest tasting room, Royal We Wines, is the subject of this month's review. It is a collaboration of two "Royals" in the wine world, Thomas Rivers Brown and Matthew Wallace Hardin. Matt's family is a sixth-generation grower in Napa. Back in the 1850's, they were given a land grant

for much of Pope valley. Cattle Barons initially, they have diversified into grape growing as well. Matt is married to Alicia Reguschi, another Napa Valley royal. Thomas Rivers Brown, who arrived in Napa in the mid 1990's, has distinguished himself as being in the top echelon of wine makers. He has crafted 41 100-point wines from a plethora of wineries. His forte is Cabernet Sauvignon with softer tannins and steeped in single vineyards. Schrader To Kalon Cabernet is his signature wine. He and Matt have combined to form a partnership using their grape connections to make more affordable wines. Caterwaul is the main label but they have quite a few wines to play with.



The pair recently purchased the building at 929 Main Street here in St Helena, it formerly housed the tasting room for Yao Ming. They have remodeled it into a stylish and comfortable space with a half round bar in the middle and lots of area for sit down tastings. We started with a Sauvignon Blanc from the Matthew Wallace label. From the Adobe Vineyard in Pope Valley, this is a bright fruit forward SB showing some grapefruit—citrus notes. Very refreshing and quaffable. This was followed by Aston Estate Pinot Noir. A single vineyard from the Northern Sonoma Coast in Annapolis at 1200 feet elevation. This cool climate produced small dense grapes with a little more tannin than many Pinots. Bright Cherry-berry flavors showing a dark and dense style.

We started out the next portion of the tasting with two Cabernets. 2023 Matthew Wallace 'The Estate' from the Pope Valley Adobe Vineyard is small production of 250 cases. Some licorice notes on a core of black currant and medium tannins. Nice complexity leads to a lingering finish. Caterwaul Napa Valley is a multi-vineyard Napa Valley Cab. This is their retail horse with a 13,000-case production. Olive and perfumy on the nose leading to good berry fruit and med – full tannins.

We finished with two more Caterwaul Cabernet Sauvignons from the Regusci Vineyard in Stags Leap. 2023 Regusci was a bigger and bolder Cabernet with manageable tannins, Elegant and inviting with cassis and cherry notes. Our last wine was also from the Regusci Vineyard, a single block named RIV Stag's Leap. Beautiful and refined showing great fruit. Very refined and great finish. RIV stands for Regusci, 4th generation.

Royal We is a nice addition to tasting here in Saint Helena, A very comfortable setting, it would be an easy drop-in for a small tasting at \$25 or our six wines at \$50. They are also amenable to locals and may have hidden deals or discounts. If your looking for something new and curious about some local legends, stop in the new Royal We Wines.
