### **Board Policies:**

Administrators are waiting to receive some information from Legal regarding changes to board policies by new state law requirements. Affected policies include residency, entrance age, homeless students, background/criminal history, educational records, teacher appreciation grant, and student transportation. The policies will be brought to the September meeting.

### **District Calendar Update:**

A community survey will be sent out for the 2020-21 calendar. We had some discussion about the start date which then impacts the semester lengths. More discussion will take place in September.

### **K-6 Science Material Fees:**

\$12.00 has been designated yearly for K-6 science fees. Of that \$12.00 – all of it needs to be spent in the school year it is collected. \$8.00 per student has been designated as consumable – students must be able to “walk out” with the item. The \$4.00 material fee may be spent on either materials/equipment that stay with the school or on consumables.
