


MISSION STATEMENT

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Despite slogging through another year of the Covid 19 pandemic, our amazing staff have continued to work to keep everyone safe and healthy and to help our residents to find affordable, appropriate, permanent housing and, at last count, had successfully housed 157 individuals, 141 of them in 2021. This is no mean feat when the average rent for a one-bedroom apartment hovers around \$1,500, while the average income for many of our residents is only \$733.

We are so thankful for the private landlords that we partner with. We could not have achieved this without them.




REVENUE STREAM




