

The next round of surgery was focused on this tissue. While I waited for lab results from the 1st round of surgery, Satan immediately began his assault, trying to get me to give up and cave in to fear. This I know, for the Bible tells me so." I repeated these words over and over. His peace comforted me and helped me endure the pain, the unknown, and to resist the fear.

As I write these words, I have to smile because I go back tomorrow afternoon for a follow-up visit. I have worn bandages on my face (nose) for the last 3+ weeks. Occasionally when I peek at the wound when we change the bandage, Satan tempts me to give in to fear and says, "This does not look right. You will have an ugly scar on your face. Everyone is going to notice this!" I have been comforted by the Holy Spirit's reminder, "Jesus carried visible scars as well. They were proof of His time on the cross." His words comforted me and assured me that my scars will become part of my testimony and my journey with Christ Jesus. So, I see this book now as part of my growth and journey. I can even smile at God's perfect timing. I declare and will continue to declare boldly for all to hear, "I am Walking in Victory with Jesus." I will not fear or walk in embarrassment (shame), but will carry my scars joyfully and willfully share my testimony when others ask, "What happened there?" I praise you Lord Jesus that you are with me now as I type these words. You will be with me tomorrow in the Doctor's office. You are with me Jesus always until the moment this life ends, and I join you in heaven for all eternity!

May you find peace, joy, and comfort in these pages. In your own moments when Satan tries to get you to give up, cave in to doubt, fear and unbelief, simply sing these words that many of us learned as a child, "Yes, Jesus loves me. Yes Jesus loves me. This I know, for the Bible tells me so!"

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COVID 19:

A Desperate Act by Satan and a Defining Moment

In early March 2019, I joined Os Hillman and over 200 Kingdom-minded Change Agents at the Culture Shaper's Summit in Washington DC. I left there with a sense of excitement and a fire in my spirit. I began to pray and ask God, "What do you want me to do?" Months went by without an answer. As I greeted 2020, suddenly I learned along with the rest of the US and most of the world about the Coronavirus (COVID 19). According to an article in the American Journal of Managed Care (AJMC) dated January 1, 2021, entitled "A Timeline of COVID-19 Developments in 2020", we know the following facts about the pandemic: January 9, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) reports mysterious outbreak in Wuhan, China; January 20, 3 US Airports begin screening for Coronavirus; January 21, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) confirms the first US case; January 31, WHO issues a Global Health Emergency; February 3, US declares a Public Health Emergency; March 11, WHO declares COVID 19 a pandemic; March 13, President Trump declares COVID 19 a National Emergency. The article goes on to indicate that as 2020 ended, the US surpassed 20 million infections and more than 346,000 deaths. Globally, cases rose to 83,832,334 and 1,824,590 deaths. As of July 26, 2021, the numbers are: 194M cases and 4.16M deaths. While most of the world including the US rushed to create vaccines to prevent infections, vaccine development and distribution faced challenges. Here in the US, we fell short of President Biden's ambitious goal of at least one dose of the vaccine into the arms of 70% of American adults by July 4th. Sadly, low levels of vaccinations coupled with the outbreak of a more deadly strain (Delta) have ushered in a new "global surge" as many hoped we were nearing the end of the pandemic. The Delta strain is more contagious, more deadly and has already spread to 124 countries as drug companies scramble to come up with booster shots and new approaches just as government leaders and health experts try to create a strategy to combat and defeat this new enemy.

What are we to make of all this? I suggest that it was and continues to be a "Defining Moment" for mankind. Mike Van Hoozer, fellow Houstonian and Brother in Christ, wrote an amazing book entitled, "Moments: Making Your Life Count For What Matters Most." In 2010, I joined Mike and a group of other men once a week for coffee and a discussion of his book. It was a powerful learning experience that I will always remember. I've listed his book in the Recommended Reading in the Appendix. In his book, he defines moments and outlines 8 major categories of moments (Mountaintop, Valley, Defining, Missing, Courageous, among others). I am sure many of us have come to see COVID 19 as a "Defining Moment" in our lives. Yes, COVID 19 changed almost every domain of life for the entire world. Many "normal" activities came to a halt. It seems we are all eager to return to "normal." I urge you to see COVID from a spiritual perspective. We know from John 10:10 that Satan only comes to steal, kill and destroy. I suggest that COVID 19 is a last-ditch desperate attempt by Satan to derail or prevent God's Great Awakening in the world and in the Marketplace. Consider how COVID 19 has changed your

world. Were you impacted by the following: infection; sickness; hospitalization; loss of loved ones; testing; vaccinations; layoffs or furloughs; loss of income and financial lack; hunger; children at home instead of school; social isolation; anxiety or depression; suicidal thoughts?

The global impact of COVID cannot be underestimated and it is not over yet! Like you, it has impacted my house and family in many ways. Yes, COVID 19 was a "Defining Moment" for the world and for me and my house. Are you satisfied with your response to this challenge over the last 18 months? Karen and I decided early on that we wanted COVID to have a positive impact on our lives. We have chosen to learn from it - to draw closer to God and be better off because of it. As Mike suggests in his book, "Seize the Moment" and grow in your faith walk and draw closer to God. We have taken this approach. How about you? Has COVID caused you to become angry with God and withdraw? Are you walking in EGO (Edging God Out)? I have witnessed many people including Christians do this. I have experienced many of the effects of COVID's assault including furlough and total loss of income. Suddenly my 25+ year tenure as an Executive Coach was over. Soon after COVID hit, I was led by the Holy Spirit to begin a "Personal Sabbatical" and learn to rest after working nonstop for over 60 years. I am now 16 months into my journey – learning to Be Still, rest and trust God more than ever before. Yes, I was side-lined, but I learned to redirect my focus and assist Karen with household activities including grocery shopping, cooking, dishes, and caring for our Miniature Poodle (Joshua) as she cares for her 88year-old mom (Queen Esther) who is now bed-bound and slips daily into the darkness and confusion of dementia. I praise God that I am at a place where I can praise God for the last year. In late January 2021, God answered my question, "What do you want me to do?" He told me it was time to start writing again. I was excited to hear this instruction and began to sit with my fingers on the keys. I was led to work on this SERIES combining my earlier work: Daily Devotionals, Coaching Tools, Audio Books, Presentations and Kingdom Life Study Lessons. I've come to fully embrace the name a former client and Brother in Christ called me "Barnabas" which Scripture tells us is translated as "Son of Encouragement." Yes, I have a new excitement and enthusiasm for this new season in my life as a full-time Christian writer. As we approach the twentieth anniversary of September 11, 2001, there are few people who have a more vivid memory of where they were and what they were doing than those of us who were working as Flight Controllers on that day in our profession. As I reflected on the impact 9/11 made in our industry over the last twenty years, it occurred to me, that out of the tears and ashes of those dark days, the new American Airlines was resurrected. That event, and all the repercussions of it, brought each of us together here today. Each of us who were working that day can tell detailed stories of the events and impact it made upon us. At times, it seems it was just like yesterday, and at other times, like it was a lifetime ago. I still remember specific details of the conversations I was having with some of the flights I was diverting that morning, while the rest of the shift seemed to be a blur. It was however the following day, after a sleepless night of prayer and worry, amid the deafening silence of our normally noisy Operations Control Center, that my life was forever changed. As I looked at the anxious and fearful faces in that quiet Ops Control Center on September the 12th, it fully occurred to me our world and my life would never be the same. I had NO idea how true that revelation would be! It was in that silent

moment, I thought, "Dear God! We desperately need you here" and to my surprise, I heard God's soft still voice clearly say to me, "that's why I placed you here."

At that moment, I couldn't remotely comprehend what that revelation would mean, but I have never forgotten the profound peace that washed over me. On that day, the heading of the flight plan of my life and ministry changed forever. It became the "soul purpose" and calling of my life, which has provided me the opportunity to bring the *ministry of presence* into our profession. The ministry of presence didn't visibly exist in our industry prior to its darkest days, which affirmed St. Paul's words that "God causes all things to work together for good to those who love Him, and are called according to His purpose (Romans. 8:28)." The ministry of presence certainly proved to be a priceless blessing through the mega-merger challenges after 911 and most recently through the unprecedented challenges of COVID in our industry. From that faithful day long ago has arisen, "The Chaplains Corner." These occasional "Spiritual First Responder" articles provide Chaplain PIREP's (Pastoral Information Reports) with spiritual course guidance for your personal flight plans, as we care for one another on life's journey. May God's continued protection and provision be with you on your journey!

Yes, we are in a fight for our family, our community, our nation and the world. While others may see you as a mild-mannered and peace-loving person, we are a world at war with the forces of evil and darkness. Mighty Man and Awesome Woman of God, your divine destiny and the lives of others are depending on you to suit up, show up and fight! Are you ready for the battle? Paul tells us in 1 Timothy 6:12, "Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses."

The purpose of this volume is to show you how to do this. In this volume, we will study Spiritual Warfare: The Battle in Your Mind; How to Win the Spiritual Battle for Your Mind; Stand Firm in the Face of Adversity; and Satan's Weapons of Choice: Fear and Shame. Earlier, I made posed the question, "Do you have a Kingdom Warrior mindset?" I pray that this volume will help you to develop this mindset, understand the enemy (Satan), become disciplined in the use of weapons of spiritual warfare and learn to fight. The good news is that you win, every believer wins. Satan won the ultimate victory on the Cross. Satan is a defeated foe, but we must RISE UP and fight. Are you ready? I pray that the Holy Spirit will transform you into a mighty warrior in God's Kingdom Army. Sound the shofar. The battle has started. Put on your mantle of faith and fight the good fight! When you stand before the throne, may you echo the words Paul wrote in 2 Timothy 4:7 "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."



Spiritual Warfare: The Battle in Your Mind

Since Adam and Eve fell from grace in the Garden of Eden, Christians have had to walk in full combat gear to deal with the battle that constantly rages in their minds. Our peace in this life and even our eternal salvation hangs in the balance as the battle or spiritual warfare between God and Satan, righteousness and sin, faith and fear, and love and selfishness are continuously set before us. This battle will test our faith, obedience, and faithfulness (2 Corinthians 10:3-6). When we give in to doubt fear, shame and condemnation and make ungodly choices the spiritual warfare can wreak havoc and destruction in our lives.

Why Satan Uses Spiritual Warfare

Satan uses spiritual warfare to cause us to disobey God's Word and become separated from Him. The attack is his attempt to steal, kill and destroy our joy, peace, health, finances, and divine destiny. By derailing us through seemingly innocent questioning of God's Word and His ways, he can manipulate and control us with his lies and deception that God's promises are not true. If he is successful, our rebellion and disobedience will erode our personal relationships with God, spouse and family, friends and co-workers.

Early Warning Signs of Spiritual Warfare

There are early warning signs of spiritual warfare that will lead to disobedience and rebellion. These include the following:

Pride and Arrogance (Satan's Calling Cards)

- 1. An independent spirit supported by "innocent questioning" of God's Word and His ways.
- 2. Intense attitude of discontentment and dissatisfaction.
- 3. Desire for personal recognition and elevation of personal status over others.
- 4. Distortion of the thoughts and views of others especially leaders (God).
- 5. Critical, prideful, and judgmental attitude leading to self-exaltation.
- 6. Attempts to give recognition and attention to others who are disenchanted.
- 7. Justification and rationalization of opposition to leaders or significant others.
- 8. Emphasis on or exaggeration of minor points or issues.
- **9.** Break off and formation of splinter groups (Us vs. Them).
- 10. Increased focus on self or "Me-man" and a tendency to become easily offended.

Renew Your Mind Before the Battle Begins

Prior to accepting Jesus Christ as our personal Savior and surrendering our lives to him, all of our education and training was based on the world's way of thinking and doing things. As born-again Christians, God wants to transform our lives by changing our thinking (renewing our minds) so that our thinking lines up with His Word and reflects His ways and thoughts. As we line up our thinking with His Word, our minds are renewed, our lives transformed, and we are empowered to live out our destiny and His will for our lives. Apostle Paul tells us, "Do not be conformed to this world (this age), [fashioned after and adapted to its external, superficial customs], but be transformed (changed) by the [entire] renewal of your mind [by its new ideals and its new attitude], so that you may prove [for yourselves] what is the good and acceptable and perfect will of God, even the thing which is good and acceptable and perfect [in His sight for you]." (Romans 12:2, AMPC). The renewal experience is miraculous and life-changing and positions us to receive God's best as He honors our obedience and love for Him with His written promises and blessings. Ask yourself: "Why is Satan more successful in getting us to believe him and his lies more than we believe God's truth about who we are in Christ and what He wants for our lives?"

Think Like God: Practice these Critical Daily Disciplines

I believe that there are 4 critical disciplines that every new and born-again Christian must practice in order to change from a worldly thinker to a Godly thinker. Practicing these disciplines helps to ensure that our thinking, emotions, decisions, actions, habits, character and destiny reflect the love and will of Christ for our lives. They include:

- 1. We must practice daily making the Bible the final authority in our lives and be committed to living a Christ-centered life.
- **2.** We must make it a daily practice to pursue an intimate, personal, and trusting relationship with God by *praying*, *listening*, *and talking* to Him on a daily basis.
- 3. We must practice depending on the Holy Spirit to lead and guide us in every area of our lives.
- **4.** We must practice reading, studying and/or listening to the word of God on a daily basis, making sure that we obtain sound doctrine and training in our faith.

Remember: Satan is a Liar

Many Christians believe that living a Christ-centered life (seeking God's will in every area of our lives) is impossible. By using deception, lies and fear, Satan has done an outstanding job of convincing Christians that living a Christ-centered life is beyond the bounds of possibility. For that reason, the thought of making the Bible the final authority in our lives may sound radical,

unrealistic, and unachievable. Quite the contrary! For Christians, it is normal, realistic and possible and what every Christian should be trained and prepared to do! The Bible is 66 books of love letters inspired and written by God to us, his children, to help shape our thinking so that we can walk down a path of righteousness, love, compassion and blessings. Jesus gave us this promise, "But seek (aim at and strive after) first of all His kingdom and His righteousness His way of doing and being right), and then all these things taken together will be given you besides." (Matthew 6:33, AMPC). Listen to this message and meditate on the following:

A Way Out (Christ Is Our Escape)

To build and develop an intimate, personal and trusting relationship with the Lord we must spend time alone with Him, talking and listening to Him, just as we do in all of our other relationships. How much time do you spend alone with the Lord each day? Your spouse? Your children? Your family? Your friends? The quality of the time we spend with the Lord is directly related to the depth of intimacy and trust we have in Him.

Reading, studying and listening to the word of God helps to develop our faith (belief) in Him and in believing that ALL of His word is true and applies to us and our Christian lives. Gaining understanding and confidence in God's word gives us wisdom and a bold inner strength which anchors our heart, mind, body and soul. The Book of Proverbs is known as the Book of Wisdom and we read, "The beginning of Wisdom is: get Wisdom (skillful and godly Wisdom)! [For skillful and godly Wisdom is the principal thing.] And with all you have gotten, get understanding (discernment, comprehension, and interpretation). and then "Happy (blessed, fortunate, enviable) is the man who finds skillful and godly Wisdom, and the man who gets understanding [drawing it forth from God's Word and life's experiences], (Proverbs 4:7; 3:13, AMPC).

Why is Conforming to the World's Way of Thinking so Easy?

Look around you...every available media source is dominated by Satan as he aggressively seduces and captures our thoughts with negative, insightful, and lewd words and images through television, radio, music, books, billboards, newspapers, and magazines. As Christians, we must constantly be renewing our minds with the word of God on a daily basis and fight the good fight of faith; we must adamantly refuse to conform to the world's way of thinking and doing things. We must maintain our confidence in God, His word and in His love for us. We must embrace our responsibility as Christians to be a light in this world of darkness. We must be willing to invite God and the Holy Spirit to lead and guide us as they will and not as we will. We must stop walking around deceiving ourselves as we try to deceive others with our pious, phony attitudes and behavior. We must step back and examine whether we are being authentic or counterfeit, obedient to God or obedient to Satan, faithful to God and His word or walking in unbelief, a source of light, hope and encouragement or a hypocrite? Apostle Paul writes, "For once you

were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord; walk as children of Light [lead the lives of those native-born to the Light]. For the fruit (the effect, the product) of the Light *or the Spirit* [consists] in every form of kindly goodness, uprightness of heart, and trueness of life. And try to learn [in your experience] what is pleasing to the Lord [let your lives be constant proofs of what is most acceptable to Him]. Take no part in *and* have no fellowship with the fruitless deeds *and* enterprises of darkness, but instead [let your lives be so in contrast as to] expose *and* reprove *and* convict them. (Ephesians 5:8-11, AMPC).

Commit to a Fresh Start: Live a Life that is Pleasing to God

1. Speak to God now and rededicate your life to God through Christ Jesus or if you are not a Christian and want to give your life to Jesus, pray this prayer and ask Jesus to come into your life according to this promise in Romans 10:9, AMPC, "Because if you acknowledge and confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and in your heart believe (adhere to, trust in, and rely on the truth) that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."

"God, I recognize that I have not lived my life for You up until now. I have been living for myself and that is wrong. I need You in my life; I want You in my life. I acknowledge the completed work of Your Son Jesus Christ in giving His life for me on the cross at Calvary, and I long to receive the forgiveness you have made freely available to me through this sacrifice. Come into my life now, Lord. Take up residence in my heart and be my king, my Lord, and my Savior. From this day forward, I will no longer be controlled by sin, or the desire to please myself, but I will follow You all the days of my life. Those days are in Your hands. I ask this in Jesus' precious and holy name. Amen."

- 2. Pray and ask God in Jesus' name to help you surrender every area of your life to Him one day at a time.
- 3. Pray and ask God in Jesus' name to turn your heart towards Him.
- **4.** Make the decision that **the Bible will be the final authority in your life**. This means that from this day forward, the Bible, God's word will be your chosen instruction manual for all decisions in your life, *not* your emotions and *not* what your friends and family say is the right thing to do in any given situation.
- **5.** Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to help you evaluate and assess your words, thoughts and behavior, THEN: **Confess your sins, repent and ask God for forgiveness**.
- **6.** Pray and ask God to help you honor your commitment to change any words, thoughts or behavior that does not line up with His word.
- 7. Pray and ask God to send you an **Accountability Partner** who is as committed to pleasing Him as you are; one who will pray with and for you and help and support your spiritual growth and development.

Overcoming Disobedience and Rebellion

What are the antidotes to an independent spirit, disobedience and rebellion? We must immediately become a good custodian of our mind and our thought life. We must replace our thoughts and words with God's words and strive to:

- 1. Honor God in all that we do (1 Samuel 2:30, Proverbs 15:33, Colossian 3:23).
- 2. Be obedient to God's Word by submitting to authority (Titus 3:1-3, 1 Peter 2:13-17).
- **3.** Be loyal (2 Samuel 22:25-26, Proverbs 14:22).
- 4. Be faithful (Proverbs 28:20, Luke 16:10-12).

- 1. Be strong in the Lord and draw our strength from Him (Eph 6:10).
- 2. Put on God's complete armor and resist the strategies of the devil (Eph 6:11).
- **3.** Understand the battle is supernatural and our true enemies are demonic spirits (Eph 6:12).
- **4.** Dress for battle in God's armor; resist Satan and stand your ground (Eph 6:13).
- **5.** Base our actions on truth, integrity, and moral correctness (Eph 6:14).
- 6. Prepare for battle and hold onto the gospel of peace (Eph 6:15).
- 7. Hold onto and walk in our faith (Eph 6:16).
- 8. Trust in our salvation and in the power of God's Word (Eph 6:17).
- 9. Pray at all times, especially in the Spirit (Eph 6:18).
- **10.** Keep watch and be alert for the next attack (Eph 6:18).



Soldiers Telling War Stories

"The seventy-two returned with joy and said, 'Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name.' He replied, 'I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven.'" (Luke 10:17-18, NIV)

Telling stories is an integral part of manhood and serves a vital role in males' rites of passage. Men have gathered around the fire and told stories for thousands of years. These stories often deal with their struggles or battles in the major arenas of life (marriage, children, sex, money, work, hobbies, religion, and politics). They use these stories to recount detailed descriptions of their struggle, acts of sacrifice, courage, conquest, sorrows, and the agony of defeat.

In the verses above we see Jesus and the disciples telling stories of the "Great Spiritual War." Scripture tells us the disciples were filled with joy as they told of their success in casting out demons. With 72 disciples, the storytelling must have gone on for hours. I can only imagine the sense of wonder and excitement that they felt hearing each other's story of attack and victory as they cast out demons. Each story proved that God's Word, faith and righteousness will defeat sin and evil. Their stories must have served to build their courage and confidence in their mission. After listening to their stories, Jesus shared the ultimate war story and recounted the day, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven." Can you imagine the look on their faces as Jesus relates the details of God casting Satan (Lucifer, Son of the morning, see Isaiah 14:12), fallen angel, liar, accuser, and father of demons, out of heaven?

Jesus has given us power, dominion, and authority. He gave us victory on the cross and covered us with His blood. We have His armor and His Word. Are you using them to confront Satan, demonic spirits and win battles? Do you have any war stories? If not, I encourage you to get busy and join the battle. Soon, you will have your own stories to share and encourage other men.

Lord, thank you for sharing the most important story of all time – the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. I find confidence. hope, and courage in your Word. Give me boldness to face Satan knowing that with you I win every battle every time. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

What Business Do We Have with You?

"Just then there was a man in their synagogue with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, saying, 'What business do we have with each other, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to destroy us? I know who You are--the Holy One of God!' And Jesus rebuked him, saying, 'Be quiet, and come out of him!'" (Mark 1:23-25, NASB)

In this verse, we see that the demonic spirit knew of Jesus and recognized Him as the Holy One of God, as he posed the questions, "What business do we have with each other? Have you come to destroy us?" I'm intrigued that the demonic spirit: (1) recognized Jesus instantly from a distance (2) knew who Jesus was – the Holy One of God (3) understood that holiness, truth and light had nothing in common with darkness, sin and lies (4) was probably aware that Jesus had defeated Satan in the wilderness (5) understood Jesus' power and authority over evil. In the next verse, we read that the spirit instantly came out of the man. He obeyed Jesus' spoken command!

As I read this passage, I can't help but wonder, "Does Satan know who I am?" Has he talked about me and warned his children of darkness, that I am a holy man of God? Do the forces of evil see the Light of Jesus within me from a distance? Do they see me as a threat and fear me? Are they actively planning an assault to undermine and derail my kingdom efforts? Are they plotting a way to rob me of my divine destiny? As a soldier in Jesus' Kingdom Army, I pray that I walk in the level of anointing, dominion and authority we see in Jesus in this verse.

Child of God, I encourage you to join me today. Put on the whole armor of God, live by faith and boldly declare to Satan and his demons that you have no fear. Starting today, speak to every demon you encounter. Ask them, "What business do we have with each other?" Then boldly command them to go in the name of Jesus. Give them something to talk about!

Lord, thank you for your grace and the power of your Word. Help me to live a holy life, walk in your anointing and power, and to overcome every demonic spirit and evil that comes against me. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Back Off Satan!

"He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. 'Get behind me, Satan!' he said. 'You do not have in mind the things of God, but the things of men.'" (Mark 8:31–33, NIV)

In this passage Jesus has just shared his imminent fate with the disciples and told them that soon He must die on the cross and rise again. Peter's response to Jesus' news was one of stern disapproval. Quickly Jesus looked past Peter as he responded to his rebuke. He instantly recognized what was going on in the spiritual realm and instead of speaking to Peter, He spoke directly to Satan. Just as Satan used Eve in the Garden of Eden to tempt Adam into sin, he was attempting to use Peter to deter Jesus from His mission. Jesus was able to look beyond Peter's rebuke (fear and doubt) and see how Satan was trying to use him to thwart God's plan.

As Christians, we must realize Satan, the opportunist, will often attempt to use those closest to us to try and cause fear, doubt, and unbelief. He will use husbands, wives, family members, friends, coworkers, and trusted advisors. He will attempt to use the very people who know our hopes, dreams, fears, and insecurities to attack us. Remember doubt knocks at your door with a mild demeanor and starts off with a seemingly innocent question, "Do you really believe. . .?" Naively, we open the door and invite doubt in. Soon it turns into a menacing monster called fear. The next time someone tries to get you to question the Word or promises of God, carefully check to see whether their words line up with God's Word.

Child of God, I encourage you to ask the Holy Spirit to always reveal who is really talking and what is at stake. Don't be afraid to boldly say, "Back off Satan. Get behind me!"

Lord, thank you for your Spirit of truth and light. Grant me spiritual wisdom and discernment and the ability to recognize and boldly confront Satan's lies and schemes. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Window of Opportunity

"When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left him until an opportune time." (Luke 4:13, NIV)

Thieves look for "windows of opportunity" or the best time to enter, get what they came for, and leave undetected. They look for moments when you're not around, tired, distracted, vulnerable, or unaware of your surroundings. They look for open windows and unlocked doors when people are asleep or at work. They look for ways to disarm your security system. In public, they approach without warning while you're standing next to your car with your arms full of shopping bags.

Every time you defeat Satan, the original thief, it's important you remember the truth of this verse. He will come again. He is the ultimate opportunist who will return at a more favorable time to accomplish his destructive mission. Ask yourself: (1) What are the open and unsecured windows in my life? (2) When and where will Satan come after me? (3) What lie will he tell me? (4) What temptation will he use to entice me to sin? (5) Are my defenses down because of unresolved anger, hurt and unforgiveness? (6) Am I emotionally and spiritually vulnerable? (7) Have I been backsliding and turning away from God, trying to find comfort in the world?

Child of God, I encourage you to ask God to reveal any potentially open window in your life. Close it and secure it today. Be bold and put a sign up, "This house is covered and protected by the blood of Jesus. Everyone who lives here is armed with the Word of God and ready for a fight!"

Lord, thank you for the power and strength of your Word. I call you Lord and submit my life to you. I will close every window of opportunity for sin in my life. I will stand on the power of your Word and fight the thief who only comes to steal, kill, and destroy. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Satan Is Crushed Under My Feet

What powerful imagery in this verse! Paul refers to God as peace (shalom, prosperity, wholeness, completeness). Another translation says, "The God who gives peace..." Our peace will come and Satan will be crushed, pressed, squeezed and destroyed. We stand victorious over Satan.

This verse should excite and encourage every Christian. Jesus' blood on the cross settled the battle for power between God and Satan, light and darkness, good and evil. On the cross, Jesus' blood anointed and empowered every Christian to defeat Satan. Satan has been, and will always be defeated. It's time for every Christian to grasp the meaning of this truth and walk it out. We are victors, conquerors, and winners, not losers. The biggest lie Satan can tell you is that he has power over you. Satan cannot make you do anything. He can talk and roar. He can try to intimidate you with an endless string of "What if ..." lies. Remember you have the power within you to resist and defeat him. You must learn to say, "Discussion over! Case closed! Satan you lose! You lost when: (1) God threw you out of heaven into the depths of hell (2) Jesus died and shed His blood for me on the cross (3) Jesus was resurrected and defeated death (4) Jesus kicked open the gates of hell; (5) Jesus ascended to the throne. Satan, you are the ultimate loser!"

Child of God, give God praise and thanksgiving today for giving you power, dominion, and authority. Thank Him that it is written "nothing can harm you." (Luke 10:19). Do not walk in fear anymore. Find comfort in God's promise, "Submit yourselves to God, resist the devil and he will flee from you." (James 4:7).

Lord, thank you for Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Because of your blood Jesus, I win every battle every time and Satan is crushed under my feet. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

"Behold! I have given you authority and power to trample upon serpents and scorpions, and [physical and mental strength and ability] over all the power that the enemy [possesses]; and nothing shall in any way harm you." (Luke 10:19, AMP)

This is one of my favorite verses in the New Testament. As a Speaker, I'm often in front of Christian men, speaking on topics of faith. A popular topic, "Acting in Boldness" comes from my personal mission statement, "find your passion, live by faith and act in boldness." I explain that as Christian men, the Bible tells us we are Sons of the Most High God. I cite Scripture that shows that we: (1) are spirit beings created in the very image and likeness of God (2) have been given authority, power, and dominion over all the earth (3) are anointed and blessed for success, prosperity and wholeness in every area of our lives (4) have a mouth that is a divine instrument and we can use it to speak blessings over our lives daily (5) win or lose the battle with Satan in our minds (6) must renew our minds daily and set our mind on God (7) must commit to use the Word of God as the final authority for every decision in our lives (8) are the spiritual leader of our families (9) must be vigilant and alert to spiritual warfare and attacks by Satan (10) have kingdom armor and weapons that we must use in our battle with Satan (11) must understand that fear is not from God but is a demonic spirit whose intent is to steal, kill and destroy us (12) can expect Satan to use doubt, unbelief and fear to tear down our defenses and gain access into our lives (13) live in Christ and He lives in us (14) are more than conquerors and the outcome of every battle was established on the cross.

Child of God, I encourage you to live by faith and trust in God's Word and act in boldness. Trample upon serpents, scorpions and Satan's demons, knowing that nothing shall in any way harm you!

Lord, thank you for your Word. Teach me to walk in faith in the full authority, power and dominion that you have given me. Help me stand firmly and boldly on your Word knowing that I can live my life free from fear and harm. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Wrestling in Prayer

"Epaphras, who is one of you and a servant of Christ Jesus, sends greetings. He is always wrestling in prayer for you, that you may stand firm in all the will of God, mature and fully assured." (Colossians 4:12, NIV)

I have always loved words. I love the sound of words, pictures that words paint and feelings they express. Literature has always captured my mind, heart, and soul. As a teenager, I explored the world through plays and poetry. In college, I read a vast array of authors, playwrights and philosophers. Now, I spend hours reading my Bible and seldom read anything that is not faith-related. Reading my Bible, I use cross references and multiple translations to fully grasp the meaning. Here, my mind is drawn to the phrase, "wrestling in prayer." Paul says Epaphras is "always wrestling in prayer for you..." Webster's Dictionary defines "wrestle" as: means to contend, as in a struggle for mastery; grapple with; to force into submission.

As I reflect, I wonder, "Who is Epaphras wresting with? Who is his opponent?" The Holy Spirit reminds me that every Christian is engaged in daily spiritual battle. He takes me to Paul's words in (Eph 6:12-13, NASB), "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore, take up the full armor of God, so that you will be able to resist in the evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm." Now, it is clear that Epaphras wrestled in prayer for the young church in Colosse. He went to battle and waged spiritual warfare with Satan on their behalf. The Holy Spirit reminds me we are called to pray for fellow believers.

Child of God, are you praying regularly for others? Is this part of your regular prayer vigil? I encourage you to ask God to speak to you about the people in your life who need prayer. Be willing to fight the fight of faith on their behalf. Be prepared to engage Satan. Wrestle in prayer for them that they may be able to stand firm in the will of God for their lives.

Lord, thank you for teaching me the power of prayer. Teach me to be vigilant and courageous in my prayer life as I pray for others. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Violent Faith

(Be Bold, Get Up and Fight)

"But no one can enter the strong man's house and plunder his property unless he first binds the strong man, and then he will plunder his house." (Mark 3:27, AMP)

This verse creates powerful images of brute force and violence. It's part of a passage where Jesus is responding to allegations that He is demon possessed and therefore, able to cast out demons. He begins His response this way, "How can Satan drive out Satan? And if a kingdom is divided and rebelling against itself, that kingdom cannot stand." He goes on to tell a parable about spiritual warfare and the struggle between good and evil. He presents the image of a strong man of God engaging in violence. The man of God goes to battle with Satan and binds him to defend his property. Notice Jesus' reference to "brute force and violent faith." I often cite this verse in talks to Christian men. I start with the fall of Adam in the Garden and recount his utter leadership failure. I talk about Abraham, Jacob, Joshua, Gideon, Elijah, David, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Paul and Peter. I go on to make the point that many modern Christian men are not mighty men of valor but are spiritual wimps and sissies. I give examples that illustrate our timidity and weakness. I explain the ways that Satan so easily defeats us. I go on to challenge them to walk as Mighty Men of God with courage, confidence and strength.

Are you a timid or courageous Child of God? I encourage you to commit today, to walk in the Lord's strength and might. Put on your full armor of God. Pick up your sword of faith and march bravely into battle. Engage Satan, the enemy, with a forceful and violent faith. Bind him and take back all that he has stolen from you!

Lord, thank you for your Word. I will no longer be afraid of Satan. I will put on my armor, pick up my sword of faith and walk bravely into spiritual battle with Satan. I will bind Satan and reclaim all that he has stolen from me. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Stand Firm in the Face of Adversity

"Or do you think Scripture says without reason that he jealously longs for the spirit he has caused to dwell in us? But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says: 'God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble and oppressed.' Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you."

(James 4:5-7, TNIV)

"Be alert and on your guard; stand firm in your faith (your conviction respecting man's relationship to God and divine things, keeping the trust and holy fervor born of faith and a part of it). Act like men and be courageous; grow in strength!" [Ps. 31:24.]

Lessons from the Classroom of Adversity

"And though the Lord gives you the bread of adversity and the water of affliction, yet your Teacher will not hide Himself any more, but your eyes will constantly behold your Teacher. And your ears will hear a word behind you, saying, This is the way; walk in it, when you turn to the right hand and when you turn to the left." (Isaiah 30:20-21, AMP)

Many famous people in science, politics, entertainment, arts, and business failed miserably before they ever achieved success. Examples include Henry Ford, R. H. Macy, F.W. Woolworth, Soichiro Honda, Harland Sanders, Walt Disney, Bill Gates, Albert Einstein, Thomas Edison, Orville and Wilbur Wright, Winston Churchill, Abraham Lincoln, Charlie Chaplin, Fred Astaire, Lucille Ball, and Vincent Van Gogh. Their lives are proof that success never teaches us as clearly or profoundly as adversity or failure.

After a very painful divorce, I had to learn how to be a godly man and godly husband. When I married Karen (my sweetheart and God send), I was determined not to repeat the same mistakes and learn from my failure. I knew I did not know how to succeed without God. Since this was Karen's first marriage we had to learn together. We committed to have a Christ-centered marriage, pray and seek God daily, turn to the Bible and use it as the final authority for all of our decisions. In the midst of conflict and difficulty, I learned to cry out, "Lord help me and come quickly. I need you Jesus." I'm amazed at the peace that comes as the Holy Spirit shows up to lead and guide us to a place of love, respect, acceptance and surrender.

I encourage you to ask God to help you with the relationships in your life or situations that are causing you pain and stealing your joy and peace. Two verses before this passage, Isaiah tells us, "the Lord longs to be gracious to you..." Isaiah and Jesus promised us help is waiting in the wings. The next time you're experiencing challenges, be still and cry out to the Lord. Ask the Holy Spirit to intervene. Tell Him what you need. The Spirit of God longs to be gracious, to comfort you, help you and lead you to a place of victory, peace, and rest!

Lord, thank you for allowing trials to come into my life so I might grow stronger in my faith. Soften my heart and remove all pride and arrogance from me. Holy Spirit, lead me in humility in times of difficulty and help me obey your instructions. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

The Secret to Peace

"I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need." (Philippians 4:12, NASB)

I'm drawn to Paul's powerful testimony here. He says that he has "learned the secret of being filled and going hungry..." The secret Paul refers to is having peace, joy, and contentment that is independent of your circumstances. Paul learned how to hold onto his peace. Every day we have the option to choose how we will respond to situations. We are free to choose joy or sadness, anger or acceptance, fear or courage, hope or despair. Paul encourages us to choose peace in spite of our circumstances.

Looking back on my life, I see that I spent decades in a state of "emotional highjack" where I was controlled or led by my emotions. I allowed my circumstances to determine my mood, thoughts, actions, and decisions. I give God praise that the Holy Spirit has shared Paul's secret with me. As I grow spiritually it becomes easier to control my emotions, to set my mind, heart, and spirit on God's Word, His promises, and to live by faith. I am learning to look beyond immediate situations and say, "I don't care what it looks like, I refuse to walk in fear, doubt, and unbelief." I've learned to encourage myself by going deeper into God's Word. I've resolved that I will not be moved by what it looks like. In the midst of trial, I use my mouth to call forth things that are not as though they were, and I thank God for them before they happen.

Child of God, how about you? Are you struggling with your circumstances? Do you allow your emotions to lead you to a place where you begin to question God's Word and His promises? Do you believe the facts of your situation more than you believe God's Word? I encourage you to trust God and His grace. Hold onto your peace, joy, and contentment no matter what happens!

Lord, thank you for your grace that sustains me each day. Jesus, your love and grace hold the secret of peace. I will trust in you Jesus and hold onto my peace, joy, and contentment no matter what. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

A Willing Spirit

"Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. 'Simon,' he said to Peter, 'are you asleep? Could you not keep watch for one hour? Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the body is weak.'" (Mark 14:37-38, NIV)

In this passage, Jesus has just returned to the disciples after spending time alone in prayer asking God to prepare Him for what He was about to face on the cross. Knowing the challenges that were ahead for both himself and the disciples, He specifically instructs them to, "Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation." While Jesus admonished them for not keeping watch and praying instead of falling asleep, He declared, "The spirit is willing, but the body is weak."

How often do you face the same agonizing dilemma that Jesus addressed, and that Paul describes, "I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do – this I keep on doing." (Romans 7:17-18). What are the areas of your life where the spirit is willing, but your body and mind are weak? Where can Satan cause you to stumble and fall into temptation? In the hours leading up to His arrest, as a man, Jesus suffered and struggled to face His fate. He didn't just tell the disciples what to do in a time of personal crisis. By spending time alone before God in prayer, Jesus demonstrated and modeled how to resist and overcome temptation.

Child of God, I encourage you to make a decision today to trust God in the midst of whatever test or trial you might be facing. Pray and ask Him for help, with the confidence that Jesus knows your struggles. Through your faith, He will give you the grace to overcome every challenge and test. Remember, it is Jesus who will strengthen you with His grace. In Him, you will have a willing spirit, strong mind and body to face every trial.

Lord, thank you for being my Rock, my Fortress, and my Shield of strength. Jesus, help me to have a willing spirit, a strong body and mind to resist every temptation. In you Jesus, in your grace, I win every battle, every time. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Down, But Never Out

(I Am Ready for a Fight)

We all face hardship, trials, temporary setbacks and difficulties in both our personal and professional lives. God's Word tells us that trials and temptations will come, but this verse encourages me. I'm comforted and have confidence that when I: (1) face hardship and pressure from every side, I will not be crushed (2) encounter difficult situations, people around me are out of control and things do not make sense, I will not feel despair (3) am surrounded by others who refuse to step up and carry their load or fail to honor a commitment, I will not feel alone (4) encounter "Goliath-sized" problems and experience a setback, I will not be defeated or destroyed (5) am under attack by every weapon in Satan's arsenal, I may be wounded, but I will not give up (6) grow tired and weary, I will not cave in or quit (7) feel like everything is hopeless, I will not take my eyes off Jesus and the Word of God.

I know that I win every time as long as I walk in the love and grace of God. As a Child of Light, I will not be intimidated, controlled or manipulated by forces of darkness. I will pursue and take hold of every promise God made to me in His Word. I know that I will never walk alone, that the Spirit of God and His angels are with me. I'm always armed and ready and refuse to back down from Satan. When spiritual warfare comes, I say to Satan, it is written, "Greater is He who lives within me than you who are in this world." Satan, I put you on notice, "I'm coming after you. Get ready for a fight. The victory is mine and the battle has already been won. I refuse to walk in fear. I find confidence knowing that you may knock me down, but you will NEVER knock me out!"

Lord, thank you for your Word of Truth and Grace. Jesus, your sacrifice on the cross settled the battle with Satan for all time. Satan, with Jesus on my side, you lose. I will not give up, cave in or quit no matter what. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Do You Have Walk-on-Water Faith?

"When the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were terrified, and said, 'It is a ghost!' And they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying.' Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid.' Peter said to Him, 'Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water.' And He said, 'Come!' And Peter got out of the boat, and walked on the water and came toward Jesus." (Matthew 14:26-29, NASB)

I'm always drawn to Jesus and Peter's interaction in this passage. Jesus tells the disciples not to fear, and Peter responds, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." Jesus answers Peter with a single but powerful word, "Come!" Without hesitation or further discussion Peter obeys, puts his trust in Jesus and steps out of the boat. His actions defied reason and natural laws. Peter walked on water! Soon he becomes distracted by the raging wind and waves and takes his eyes off Jesus. In that moment, Satan introduces fear, doubt, and unbelief and Peter begins to sink. He cries out to Jesus and Jesus grabs his hand and saves him!

President Franklin D. Roosevelt exhibited great faith and reverence for God in his Inaugural Address on March 4, 1933. His speech contains a reference to fear that has been repeated often. He said, "...This great Nation will endure as it has endured, will revive, and will prosper. So, first of all, let me assert my firm belief that the only thing we have to fear is fear itself – nameless, unreasoning, unjustified terror which paralyzes needed efforts to convert retreat into advance." What is less known or quoted is the last sentence of Roosevelt's speech where he said, "In this dedication of a Nation we humbly ask the blessing of God. May He protect each and every one of us. May He guide me in the days to come?"

Child of God, I encourage you to model the thinking and behavior of Peter and President Roosevelt. Have faith and trust God. Don't worry about logic, common sense, natural laws or peer pressure. Refuse to allow fear, doubt and unbelief to stop you. Remember, God is with you. Keep your eyes on Jesus and boldly step out of the boat. Exercise "Walk-on-Water Faith" and expect a miracle!

Lord, thank you for showing me the power of your Word. Jesus, remove all fear, doubt, and unbelief from my heart and help me trust you at all times. Give me "Walk-on-Water Faith" that I may boldly step out of the boat and come to you. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

A Thorn to Keep Me Humble

"And to keep me from being puffed up and too much elated by the exceeding greatness (preeminence) of these revelations, there was given me a thorn (a splinter) in the flesh, a messenger of Satan, to rack and buffet and harass me, to keep me from being excessively exalted." [Job. 2:6.] (2 Corinthians 12:7, AMP)

This verse leads to one of the most frequently quoted passages in the New Testament. In verse 9 Paul says, "And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness." God's grace was a gift to Paul to help him deal with his thorn. Many theologians have written and speculated about the nature of Paul's thorn. Although Paul fails to give us specifics, he tells us it caused him great pain and anguish. While he recognized the purpose of the thorn was to keep him humble, he goes on to tell us he asked God to remove it three times.

Thinking about thorns, I recall Adam and Eve's sin in the Garden of Eden. We see in Genesis 3:9-19, that God cursed the serpent to crawl on his belly in dust among thorns and thistles; told Eve she would have to endure the pain of childbirth (thorn) then God tells Adam that because of his sin, the ground will be cursed and produce thorns. Work becomes hard, filled with sweat and sorrow, because of his disobedience. Based on these passages, scholars point to the thorn as a symbol of the curse (empowerment to fail). Life, especially our work, becomes difficult, hard, and painful!

Life is full of thorns. Almost daily we face sticky and prickly situations, people with issues, complex challenges that poke and prod us and make work life difficult. We've coined expressions for these situations. We say, "He sure is acting like he has a burr (thorn) under his saddle" or "My coworker is a real thorn in my side." Every Christian should accept that there will be thorns in life. What thorny situations are you facing? Is someone's prickly behavior causing you pain and making life difficult? Maybe you're the one going around with a "burr" under your saddle? I encourage you to pray and ask God to show you His purpose for the thorn. Like Paul, walk in humility. Trust God's grace. His grace is bigger than any thorn.

Lord, thank you for your grace. Jesus, help me to humble myself, to rely on you and trust in your grace every time I face difficult situations in my life. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Joy at the Finish Line

(Refuse to Give Up, Cave In or Quit)

"Moreover [let us also be full of joy now!] let us exult and triumph in our troubles and rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that pressure and affliction and hardship produce patient and unswerving endurance. And endurance (fortitude) develops maturity of character (approved faith and tried integrity). And character [of this sort] produces [the habit of] joyful and confident hope of eternal salvation." (Romans 5:3-4, AMP)

Paul encourages us to greet troubles with joy knowing that pressure and hardship lead to spiritual growth and maturity. As Christians we do seem to have grasped the fact that we must run the race set before us. But it seems many of us think the race is a 100-yard dash! We must change our thinking if we are to succeed and overcome life's trials. The race of faith is never a short sprint. It's always a race of endurance. Think of it as a "super marathon," certainly not a 5K race in perfect weather.

I want to emphasize the challenge we face and prepare you by saying, "Get ready for the toughest race of your life." It's imperative that when you get: (1) to training camp, you resolve to get spiritually fit and build strength and conditioning (2) out of the car and head to the track, you understand this is a race of endurance (3) to the starting line, you have the proper mindset to persevere (4) out of the blocks, you focus and find your stride (5) bumped, tripped, stumble and fall, you get back up and keep running (6) dehydrated and thirsty, you call on Jesus for a drink of living water (7) muscle cramps and your legs ache, you remember Jesus' suffering on the cross (8) tired and discouraged, you call on Jesus for more grace (9) disoriented and out of your lane, you ask Jesus to direct your steps; (10) on the verge of collapse feeling like you can't take another step, you surrender and let Jesus carry you (11) an opportunity to look into the crowd, you look for Jesus' face cheering you on (12) to the finish line, you see Jesus' banner that reads, "With me, all things are possible."

Child of God, as you cross the finish line, I encourage you to listen for the roar of applause and cheers from the saints. Have joy at the finish line. Be glad that you did not give up, cave in, or quit but finished the race of faith!

Lord, thank you for your grace to run the race you have set before me. Jesus, if I get tired and want to give up, fill me with your grace, help me to persevere and keep running. Give me joy at the finish line, knowing that victory is mine. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

A Foolish Thing

(Counting vs. Trusting)

"David was conscience-stricken after he had counted the fighting men, and he said to the LORD, I have sinned greatly in what I have done. Now, O LORD, I beg you, take away the guilt of your servant. I have done a very foolish thing." (2 Samuel 24:10, NIV)

David's success and reputation as an anointed warrior was unparalleled. He always sought the Lord and depended on Him for victory. Suddenly things changed and David gave into fear. He took his eyes off God and ordered Joab, his commanding officer, to count the troops. David made a decision to quit trusting God and focus on what he could do in his own strength.

For me, the issue was not counting soldiers but counting dollars. Suddenly, contracts ended, and the phone quit ringing. My days became silent and still. Within a few months my income dropped to less than a third of what it had been. At least the Lord revealed to me that this season was coming and that He was going to use this season to teach me some important life lessons. He taught me to acknowledge Him as my only Source, that everything else was just a resource. He taught me how to be a better steward over all that He gave us. He wanted me to see that, like David, I had the wrong perspective. He showed me that when I turned to my earning power, bank account and reserves for my sense of well-being, I failed to trust Him. He reminded me of His Word, in Philippians 4:19 that says, "My God will meet all your needs according to his glorious riches in Christ Jesus." I came to understand that, like David, I had sinned greatly and done a foolish thing! While this is normal thinking and behavior for unbelievers, it is not the way God wants me to think or live. He wants all of me (heart, mind and spirit). He wants me to trust Him as my Source for everything. He wants me to reject fear, doubt, and unbelief.

Child of God, what fears are keeping you from trusting and obeying God? Are you relying on God's strength or your own? I encourage you to ask God to reveal any area of your life where you have sinned greatly and done a foolish thing.

Lord, thank you for your grace, mercy and provision. Jesus, help me to trust and rely on you for everything. I know that you are faithful to always meet my needs. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

You of Little Faith

(Giving in to Fear)

"Without warning, a furious storm came up on the lake, so that the waves swept over the boat. But Jesus was sleeping. The disciples went and woke him, saying, 'Lord, save us! We're going to drown!' He replied, 'You of little faith, why are you so afraid?' Then he got up and rebuked the winds and the waves, and it was completely calm. The men were amazed and asked, 'What kind of man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey him!'" (Matthew 8:24-27, NIV)

As I read these verses, I think of all the times as an Executive Coach and Ministry Leader my clients and peers have recounted similar situations when suddenly a storm appeared and either they or their employees or volunteers panicked and were overcome by fear based on the circumstances. Careful review of these verses reveals crucial points about Jesus' servant leadership behavior. Jesus: (1) examined the disciples' thoughts and emotions and understood their actions were motivated by fear and concern for their personal safety and welfare (2) resisted the urge to respond emotionally out of anger or frustration (3) recognized what needed to happen to restore their sense of well-being (4) demonstrated a sense of urgency and took immediate action (5) showed total confidence in His ability to quiet the storm (solve the problem) and meet their emotional and spiritual needs (6) remained silent when it was all over so that the disciples could process and reflect on what happened and learn from their experience.

As leaders are you and your team in the midst of storms that seemed to blow in without warning? Are the raging winds and waves a serious threat to your production capability, quality, customer base, profit margin, employee morale, goals and objectives? When you face storms and your team is emotionally high jacked, I encourage you to read and study the Gospels. Pay close attention to the words and actions of Jesus, the greatest model of servant leadership in human history. Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you how to lead like Jesus. Ask Him to show you how to: walk in faith; assess the situation; control your emotions; show a sense of urgency by taking action; model confidence; use the storms as a learning opportunity. The Spirit of God will teach you. Lead like Jesus and prepare to be amazed.

Lord, thank you for teaching me valuable lessons on leadership as I study the Gospels and the life of Jesus. Thank you for giving me a servant leader's heart and helping me "lead like Jesus." Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

A Moment of Truth

"The LORD therefore be judge and decide between you and me; and may He see and plead my cause and deliver me from your hand. When David had finished speaking these words to Saul, Saul said, 'Is this your voice, my son David?' Then Saul lifted up his voice and wept. He said to David, 'You are more righteous than I; for you have dealt well with me, while I have dealt wickedly with you.'" (1 Samuel 24:15-17, NIV)

In the verses leading up to this passage, we read that Saul's back was turned to David. In an instant David could have taken his life. Instead, he reached out and cut off the bottom of Saul's robe. A few minutes later, overwhelmed with shame and sorrow, David calls out to Saul and confesses what he had done. These verses capture part of their conversation.

For me, this moment was played out the day I sat on my Dad's bed as he lay dying of cancer. For the first time in decades, we sat, held each other, talked, cried, and shared from our hearts. The weight of years of regret, guilt, anger, hurt, disappointment, struggle and conflict, suddenly disappeared and no longer mattered. We silently agreed to let go of our broken past, celebrate and enjoy each another in the moment. In the moment, we: (1) created a new reality with new rules of behavior — a reality free of expectations, promises, apologies, excuses and regrets (2) chose to forgive, love, and cherish each other unconditionally as father and son (3) chose to accept and overlook each other's brokenness, faults, and differences. We were finally at peace. In the moment, I came to understand David and Saul's interaction as I recalled Paul's treatise on love written to the church in Corinth. His words showed me God's heart. They softened my heart, became real and changed me. . . "love bears, believes, hopes, and endures all things." (1 Co 13:7-8) Most of all, in the moment of truth with my Dad, I learned that love never fails.

Child of God, I encourage you to ask God to show you the truth of His love regarding a difficult relationship in your life. Remember, God is love and His love will never fail you!

Lord, thank you for your unconditional love and the healing power of your love. Jesus, help me to show forgiveness, love and compassion to others. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Job Search Is a Journey in the Wilderness

"For the Lord your God has blessed you in all that you have done; He has known your wanderings through this great wilderness. These forty years the Lord your God has been with you; you have not lacked a thing." (Deuteronomy 2:7, NASB)

Job search and career transition (promotion, transfer, and relocation) are often times of intense trial, emotional upheaval, and financial strain that test your self-confidence, faith, and the very fabric of your marriage, family and work relationships. For Christians, it can be compared to the time the Israelites spent in the wilderness. It's a time of radical change and discomfort as you face an uncertain future and deal with the unknown. Life in the wilderness is different. The rules and consequences are more severe. Like the Israelites, you may long for the certainty of Egypt (your old job) even though you were very unhappy there.

In the wilderness, you will face challenges and tests every day. Will you trust God, walk in faith, refuse to believe Satan's lies, and resist the urge to murmur and complain? Remember God doesn't like complaining, so be careful that you don't turn an 11-day journey into a 40-year trek! How long you spend in the wilderness depends on your level of trust and dependence on God and the lessons He wants you to learn. Use your time in the wilderness to draw closer to God. Start every day: (1) feasting (studying and meditating) on His Word (2) confessing His Word over your life (3) being still in prayer as you seek His will and plans for your life (4) giving thanks and praise for His goodness (5) thinking of your work as worship to God (6) asking Him to lead you to a place where you can take your faith to work and honor Him.

Child of God, celebrate your freedom in the wilderness and trust God to provide for you. Believe in His Word and His promises. Rely on His goodness, faithfulness and grace. With confidence and expectant hope, allow His spirit to lead you to your promised land (ideal job). Once you're there don't forget to praise Him!

Lord, thank you for the transitions in my life, for opening doors and for closing them. Soften my heart and draw me closer to you during times of change. Seal my lips to complaining and replace them with songs of joy, thanksgiving, and praise. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Satan's Weapons of Choice: Fear and Shame

Now let's take a closer look at Satan's weapons so you can know what to expect. Fear and doubt, condemnation and shame are Satan's key weapons he uses against us. Fear is his main weapon. He uses lies and deception to create fear. First, we will look at fear then we will address the issue of shame. The word "fear" appears 356 times in the Amplified Bible; the word "afraid" appears 167 times, and the phrases "do not fear", "fear not" or "be not afraid" appear 71 times. The frequency of these phrases shows us that everyday life will present circumstances and situations which can generate fear, doubt, worry and unbelief.

Fear is Satan's Main Weapon

Fear is a doubt and unbelief in God and in His Word; belief in the lies of Satan; a state of dread, uneasiness, worry or anxiousness.

- 1. Fear is faith in reverse or faith contaminated.
- 2. Fear is when we believe our circumstances are bigger than God.
- **3.** Fear equips and empowers us to fail; it paralyzes us and causes us to make poor decisions and choices.
- 4. Fear works like a magnet and attracts and draws the very thing that we fear.
- 5. Fear comes from Satan; it is a demonic spirit; it is NOT an emotion or feeling.
- **6.** Fear is demonstrated and activated by the words we speak; words that are in agreement with Satan's lies which ultimately lead to spiritual and physical death and destruction.
- **7.** Fear is fueled by our negative emotions: selfishness, anger, hurt, despair, greed, envy, jealousy, and insecurity.
- 8. Fear is overcome by faith in God, His Word and walking in integrity and faithfulness.
- 9. Fear keeps you in bondage to sin, addiction, strongholds and generational curses.
- **10.** Fear produces despair and hopelessness, and constant, prolonged fear leads to spiritual and physical death, destruction, and eternal torment in hell.
- 11. Fear is the belief that God does not really love us and that God's promises are not true.
- 12. Fear is based in selfishness and is an expression of our desire to preserve or protect self.
- 13. Fear gives Satan power and the opens the door for him to operate in your life.
- 14. Fear destroys your confidence while faith builds it.
- 15. Fear brings worry, torment and unrest while faith brings peace and contentment.

What Does Scripture Say About Fear?



As mentioned earlier, the words "fear", "afraid", "do not fear", "fear not" or "be not afraid" are used more than 350 times in the Bible. Cleary God does not want us to walk in fear, doubt, worry and unbelief. He knows that fear can lead us to become disobedient and separate us from Him. Here are some key verses about fear. For additional understanding, listen to the audio messages below:

1. NOW THE serpent was more subtle and crafty than any living creature of the field which the Lord God had made. And he [Satan] said to the woman, Can it really be that God has said, You shall not eat from every tree of the garden? ... But the Lord God called to Adam and said to him, Where are you? He said, I heard the sound of You [walking] in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself. (Gen 3:1, 9-10, AMP].

Victory Over Fear

We must come to believe in and trust God's Word and His promises to us. Stand on these truths:

- 1. For [the Spirit which] you have now received [is] not a spirit of slavery to put you once more in bondage to fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption [the Spirit producing sonship] in [the bliss of] which we cry, Abba (Father)! Father! (Romans 8:15, AMP).
- 2. As it is written: 'For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.' No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. (Romans 8:36-37, NIV).
- **3.** And my God will liberally supply (fill to the full) your every need according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." (Philippians, 4:19, AMP).
- **4.** Fear not [there is nothing to fear], for I am with you; do not look around you in terror and be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen and harden you to difficulties, yes, I will help you; yes, I will hold you up and retain you with My [victorious] right hand of rightness and justice. [Acts 18:10.] (Isaiah 41:10, AMPC).
- 5. HE WHO dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall remain stable and fixed under the shadow of the Almighty [Whose power no foe can withstand]. I will say of the Lord, He is my Refuge and my Fortress, my God; on Him I lean and rely, and in Him I [confidently] trust! (Psalms 91:1-2, AMP).
- 6. Yes, though I walk through the [deep, sunless] valley of the shadow of death, I will fear or dread no evil, for You are with me; Your rod [to protect] and Your staff [to guide], they comfort me. (Psalms 23:4, AMPC).
- 7. [Elisha] answered, Fear not; for those with us are more than those with them. (2 Kings 6:16, AMPC).
- 8. And he said, O man greatly beloved, fear not! Peace be to you! Be strong, yes, be strong. And when he had spoken to me, I was strengthened and said, Let my lord speak, for you have strengthened me. (Daniel 10:19, AMPC).
- **9.** According to the promise that I covenanted with you when you came out of Egypt, so My Spirit stands and abides in the midst of you; fear not. (Haggai 2:5, AMPC).

What Does Scripture Say About Shame?

It is important that you understand what God's Word says about shame and why pride and shame are co-conspirators that are detestable to God. Look for the connections between shame, fear, pride and disobedience.

1. When pride comes [boiling up with an arrogant attitude of self-importance], then come dishonor and shame, But with the humble [the teachable who have been chiseled by trial and who have learned to walk humbly with God] there is wisdom and soundness of mind. (Proverbs 11:2, AMP).

Shame is Prevalent in the Workplace

If there was ever a place where Satan will attack us, and attempt to get us to walk in shame, it is in our self-esteem and our self-worth that are tied to the work we do. I have witnessed both leaders giving the news and employees who have been disciplined or terminated walk in shame, embarrassment and humiliation. The most extreme case I ever witnessed involved a man who maintained a charade for almost two years. After he got laid off, he was too embarrassed and ashamed to tell his wife and family. As a result, he got up every day in his suit and tie and came to the Career Center, all the while telling his wife, he was going to work. He took monthly withdrawals from his savings and IRA accounts to pay his bills. One day, he confessed his charade to me and begged me to help him find a way out of his predicament.



Victory Over Shame

Introduction

God's Word tells us that we have victory, that we are more than conquerors. We have victory over shame and condemnation, because of the blood of Jesus and what He did on the cross. God's Word promises us that He has dealt with our shame. Celebrate your freedom from shame through God's grace, mercy and forgiveness. Rest in confident hope in these verses:

- 1. But there is forgiveness with You, That You may be feared *and* worshiped [with submissive wonder]. (Psalm 130:4, AMP)
- 2. Seek the LORD while He may be found; Call on Him [for salvation] while He is near. Let the wicked leave (behind) his way And the unrighteous man his thoughts; And let him return to the LORD, And He will have compassion (mercy) on him, And to our God, For He will abundantly pardon. (Isaiah 55:6-7, AMP)
- **3.** FOR I WILL BE MERCIFUL and GRACIOUS TOWARD THEIR WICKEDNESS, AND I WILL REMEMBER THEIR SINS NO MORE. (Hebrews 8:12, AMP)
- 4. This is why I suffer as I do. Still, I am not ashamed; for I know Him [and I am personally acquainted with Him] whom I have believed [with absolute trust and confidence in Him and in the truth of His deity], and I am persuaded [beyond any doubt] that He is able to guard that which I have entrusted to Him until that day [when I stand before Him]. (2 Timothy 1:12, AMP)



Jesus Became Our "Shame-Substitute"

Introduction

As born-again Christians, we must remember that Jesus died for our sins on the cross. He took on the sin of the world and God, who is holy and righteous, was forced to turn away from Jesus. God turned away from Jesus, but He promises to never turn away from us. Jesus took on the hatred and rejection, ridicule and abuse, the shame that we deserved. He became our "Shame-Substitute." He despised shame and how Satan used it to defeat man. In Him, we are victorious, free from shame and condemnation. Study and meditate on these passages and allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you about any area of shame in your life.



- **a.** About the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud [agonized] voice, 'ELI, ELI, LAMA SABACHTHANI?' that is, 'My God, My God, why have You Forsaken Me?' (Matthew 27:46, AMP)
- **b.** As it is written and forever remains written, 'BEHOLD I AM LAYING IN ZION A STONE OF STUMBLING AND A ROCK OF OFFENSE; AND HE WHO BELIEVES IN HIM [whoever adheres to, trusts in, and relies on Him] WILL NOT BE DISAPPOINTED [in his expectations].' (Romans 9:33, AMP)

- c. He made Christ who knew no sin to [judicially] be sin on our behalf, so that in Him we would become the righteousness of God [that is, we would be made acceptable to Him and placed in a right relationship with Him by His gracious lovingkindness]. (2 Corinthians 5:21, AMP)
- d. When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your flesh (worldliness, manner of life), God made you alive together with Christ, having [freely] forgiven us all our sins, having canceled out the certificate of debt consisting of legal demands [which were in force] against us and which were hostile to us. And this certificate He has set aside and completely removed by nailing it to the cross. (Colossians 2:13-14, AMP)
- e. For indeed Christ died for sins once for all, the Just and Righteous for the unjust and unrighteous [the Innocent for the guilty] so that He might bring us to God, having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the Spirit; (1 Peter 3;18, AMP)
- f. Looking away [from all that will distract] to Jesus, Who is the Leader and the Source of our faith [giving the first incentive for our belief] and is also its Finisher [bringing it to maturity and perfection]. He, for the joy [of obtaining the prize] that was set before Him, endured the cross, despising and ignoring the shame, and is now seated at the right hand of the throne of God. (Hebrews 12:2-3, AMPC)

Summary

Remember, Jesus despised shame and defeated shame on the cross. Whenever you feel ashamed, you must remember that shame is from Satan, and he uses it to attack us and get us to give up and quit. It is deigned to get us to doubt God's Word and His promises and question our "worthiness" and whether or not God's Word is really true. Do not believe the lie.

Self-Reflection and Application

Be still and ask the Holy Spirit to speak to you about this lesson. To show you what changes He wants you to make in your life.

- 1. What did you learn from this lesson?
- 2. What are the lies that you have believed regarding shame?
- 3. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal the areas of your life where you have been walking in shame?
- 4. What changes do you need to make to walk out this victory over shame in your life?

Guilt vs. Shame

Guilt and shame are NOT the same thing. Guilt is about what you *did*; shame is about who you *are*. Shame is a powerful emotion caused by a sense of failure, a mistake or the belief that you have failed in the eyes of others. Satan will introduce shame and condemnation (despair) to get you believe that you are a failure or mistake. Shame and condemnation are not from God. They are tools used by Satan to destroy you, cause you to walk in fear and hide from God. We must also understand that shame and pride go hand in hand. Shame will make you run and hide from God and turn your back on His Word. In shame, you will believe Satan's lies that you are not worthy of God's love and that His promises will not come true in your life. We MUST remember that conviction is from God and will lead to repentance and godly sorrow (See 2 Co 7:11). In contrast, shame will cause you to turn away from God and cause you to doubt your divine destiny. Unfortunately, the church has perfected phoniness as a way of covering shame just as Adam and Eve tried to cover their nakedness in the garden.



Developing Faith That Believes

How can we develop faith that believes and what does it look like? A good example of this kind of faith is found in Luke 1:28-38 "And he came to her and said, Hail, O favored one [endued with grace]! The Lord is with you! Blessed (favored of God) are you before all other women! But when she saw him, she was greatly troubled and disturbed and confused at what he said and kept revolving in her mind what such a greeting might mean. And the angel said to her, Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found grace (free, spontaneous, absolute favor and loving-kindness) with God. And listen! You will become pregnant and will give birth to a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus. He will be great (eminent) and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to Him the throne of His forefather David, And He will reign over the house of Jacob

throughout the ages; and of His reign there will be no end. [Isa. 9:6, 7; Dan. 2:44.] And Mary said to the angel, How can this be, since I have no [intimacy with any man as a] husband? Then the angel said to her, The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you [like a shining cloud]; and so the holy (pure, sinless) Thing (Offspring) which shall be born of you will be called the Son of God. [Exod. 40:34; Isa. 7:14.] And listen! Your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is now the sixth month with her who was called barren. Overcoming Fear: Live by Faith and Win Every Battle All the Time

What Is Faith?

Faith is a belief and trust in God, His Word (the Bible), and Jesus Christ.

- 1. Faith in God equips and empowers us to succeed and prosper.
- 2. Faith comes from God; He chooses and calls us into a relationship with Him.
- **3.** Faith in God is demonstrated and activated by the words we speak; words that are in agreement with God's Word.
- **4.** Faith in God is fueled by unconditional love, compassion and a willingness to serve others and put their needs before our own.
- 5. Faith in God will cancel out, overcome and conquer fear; it will always defeat Satan.
- 6. Faith in God and His Word will set us free from bondage, guilt and condemnation.
- **7.** Faith in God gives us courage, confidence and expectant hope.
- 8. Faith in God leads to our salvation, victory and eternal life in heaven.
 - a. "So faith comes by hearing [what is told], and what is heard comes by the preaching [of the message that came from the lips] of Christ (the Messiah Himself)." (Romans 10:17, AMP).
 - **b.** "NOW FAITH is the assurance (the confirmation, the title deed) of the things [we] hope for, being the proof of things [we] do not see and the conviction of their reality [faith perceiving as real fact what is not revealed to the senses]." (Hebrews 11:1, AMP).
 - **c.** "By faith we understand that the worlds [during the successive ages] were framed (fashioned, put in order, and equipped for their intended purpose) by the word of God, so that what we see was not made out of things which are visible." (Hebrews 11:3, AMP).

What is Fear?

Fear is a doubt and unbelief in God and in His Word; belief in the lies of Satan; a state of dread, uneasiness, worry or anxiousness.

- 1. Fear equips and empowers us to fail; it paralyzes us and causes us to make poor decisions and choices.
- 2. Fear works like a magnet and attracts and draws the very thing that we fear.
- 3. Fear comes from Satan; it is a demonic spirit; it is NOT an emotion or feeling.

- **4.** Fear is demonstrated and activated by the words we speak; words that are in agreement with Satan's lies which ultimately lead to spiritual and physical death and destruction.
- **5.** Fear is fueled by our negative emotions: selfishness, anger, hurt, despair, greed, envy, jealousy, and insecurity.
- 6. Fear is overcome by faith in God, His Word and walking in integrity and faithfulness.
- **7.** Fear keeps you in bondage to sin, addiction, strongholds and generational curses.
- **8.** Fear produces despair and hopelessness, and constant, prolonged fear leads to spiritual and physical death, destruction, and eternal torment in hell.
 - a. "NOW THE serpent was more subtle and crafty than any living creature of the field which the Lord God had made. And he [Satan] said to the woman, Can it really be that God has said, You shall not eat from every tree of the garden? ... But the Lord God called to Adam and said to him, Where are you? He said, I heard the sound of You [walking] in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself." (Gen 3:1, 9-10, AMP].
 - b. "And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were terrified and said, It is a ghost! And they screamed out with fright. But instantly He spoke to them, saying, Take courage! I AM! Stop being afraid! And Peter answered Him, Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water. He said, Come! So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water, and he came toward Jesus. But when he perceived and felt the strong wind, he was frightened, and as he began to sink, he cried out, Lord, save me [from death]! Instantly Jesus reached out His hand and caught and held him, saying to him, O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" (Matthew 14:26-31, AMP).

Trusting God and Overcoming Fear

- **1.** God's love, mercy and grace for us is so great that He gave His only Son, Jesus Christ to die for our sins.
- 2. God defeated Satan in heaven and Jesus defeated Satan on earth when He died on the cross.
- **3.** The blood of Jesus was shed on the cross for our sins giving us reconciliation with God, deliverance and redemption from our sins, and healing from sickness.
- **4.** We can overcome all temptations and trials, and nothing is impossible for us through Christ who strengthens us.
- 5. Jesus came and died on the cross to give us peace (prosperity, happiness, health, wholeness and completeness) in every area of our lives; on the other hand, Satan's mission is to steal, kill and destroy.
- **6.** We are heirs to every promise in God's Word; He always honors us when we honor Him; He will never leave us or forsake us.
- 7. Through our faith in God and His Son, Jesus Christ we have dominion, power and authority over all the earth and over all the power of Satan, our enemy.
- **8.** Walking in obedience to God's Word guarantees His protection, provision and favor.

- **a.** "For God did not give us a spirit of timidity (of cowardice, of craven and cringing and fawning fear), but [He has given us a spirit] of power and of love and of calm and well-balanced mind and discipline and self-control." (2 Timothy 1:7, AMP).
- **b.** "For [the Spirit which] you have now received [is] not a spirit of slavery to put you once more in bondage to fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption [the Spirit producing sonship] in [the bliss of] which we cry, Abba (Father)! Father!" (Romans 8:15, AMP).
- c. "As it is written: 'For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.' No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us." (Romans 8:36-37, NIV).
- **d.** "And my God will liberally supply (fill to the full) your every need according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." (Philippians, 4:19, AMP).
- e. "Fear not [there is nothing to fear], for I am with you; do not look around you in terror and be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen and harden you to difficulties, yes, I will help you; yes, I will hold you up and retain you with My [victorious] right hand of rightness and justice. [Acts 18:10.]" (Isaiah 41:10).
- f. "HE WHO dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall remain stable and fixed under the shadow of the Almighty [Whose power no foe can withstand]. I will say of the Lord, He is my Refuge and my Fortress, my God; on Him I lean and rely, and in Him I [confidently] trust!" (Psalms 91:1-2, AMP).

Our Words Serve as the Final Witness and Set Spiritual Laws in Motion

- 1. The world (flesh) and the kingdom of God (Spirit) operate according to laws and principles that work every time. (Gen 8:22).
- 2. Both God and Satan exercise power through **SPOKEN WORDS**. (Gen 1:26,3:4-5).
- **3.** God's words are true, eternal and unchanging; His Word is LIVING WORD (BIBLE and HOLY SPIRIT) (John 1:14).
- **4.** Satan's words are lies, deception and a twisted version of the truth. (Gen 3:4-5).
- **5.** We have a choice of speaking blessings or curses with our words on a daily basis. (Pro 18:20-21; James 3:10).
- **6. BLESSINGS:** Encourage, praise, empower self/others to succeed; follow obedience. (Pro 28:20).
- 7. CURSES: Discourage, put down, empower self/others to fail; follow disobedience. (Jer 11:3).
- **8. EXPRESSION:** "Sticks and Stones Can Break My Bones, but WORDS can never hurt me." This is a lie, and deception of Satan's (Worldly Thinking) that causes hurt, pain, divorce, sickness and death.
- 9. Words are spiritual containers that contain the rich substance of our faith. (Rom 10:17).
- **10.** Words are fundamental elements of our faith; our spoken words activate God's laws. (Isa 55:11).
- 11. As children of God's, created in His image, our mouths are a **DIVINE APPARATUS**; God's Word teaches us how to use our mouth as a tool for power, authority and dominion. (Mat 17:20).

- **12.** We must **SPEAK** God's WORD to release the power He has given us (thinking is NOT enough). (Acts 4:31).
- 13. We must confess and declare our faith with our mouths. (Mat 10:32; Luke 12:8).
- 14. Words are the Building Blocks we use to pave the roads we walk to our Destiny. (Pro 10:31).
- 15. Words lead to our destiny. (Pro 18:20-21).

Words → Thinking → Emotions → Decisions → Actions → Habits → Character → Destiny

Summary

What fears are you facing in your personal or professional life? Remember, fear is not from God. It is from Satan. As Christians, we can overcome fear and defeat Satan every time by standing on God's Word and trusting Him. By taking the following steps you can consistently overcome fear in difficult situations, trials, and tests.

- 1. Read, study, meditate on the Word of God and trust in God and His Word.
- 2. Examine yourself. Learn where your fear comes from. Why is this fear so strong?
- 3. Encourage yourself. Be courageous and bold since the battle has already been won.
- 4. Refuse to speak curses over your life.
- **5.** In every situation, look beyond the surface and discern the presence of spiritual warfare; put on the whole armor of God.
- 6. Use God's Word against Satan; speak the Word---remember thinking is not enough.
- 7. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you walk in the strength and power of the Spirit.
- 8. Listen and obey the voice of the Holy Spirit.

"But what does it say? The Word (God's message in Christ) is near you, on your lips and in your heart; that is, the Word (the message, the basis and object) of faith which we preach, [Deut. 30:14]" (Romans 10:8, AMP)

To understand this verse, it's helpful to start with John 1:1, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was God." Reading on, it says, "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us (John 1:14). Above, Paul tells us that the Word (Jesus) is close to us, on our lips and in our heart. Later in verse 17, Paul tells us that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God (teachings of Christ).

Let's trace the process. God's Word (Jesus) is preached aloud, we hear it with our ears, then welcome and receive it in our hearts. We believe in the Word (Jesus), confess our faith aloud with our mouths and we are saved. Next, the Holy Spirit comes to take up residence in our hearts, pouring the love of God into us.

We study and meditate on the Word. God's Word renews our minds. The Holy Spirit speaks to us and reveals the truth of the Word. We grow in wisdom and discernment. We talk with Jesus in prayer and learn to walk with Him and others in love. We speak like Jesus and confess the Word over our life and the lives of others. When we stumble or fall Jesus picks us up. When we ask for forgiveness, we encounter grace. Jesus gives us grace to overcome every test and temptation. We grow in faithfulness and holiness. We are transformed and become new creatures in Christ. Suddenly, one day as we look in the mirror, what started with our ears, heart and mouth is now complete. I praise God that I am learning to surrender all of me to Jesus. In Him, I live. He is no longer near, He is here! Are you hurting and lost? Come, let me tell you the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Messiah, who lives in me. Everything changes for all eternity when He comes.

Lord, thank you for sending us your Word in the form of your Son, Jesus Christ. Jesus, I receive your love, grace and truth. Holy Spirit, come live in me and rule my life. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

James' details the characteristics of the Christian life. He addresses the hypocrisy of empty claims of faith without works and gives us practical real-world advice on how to put our faith into action. I remember the day this passage came to life. Sitting in the audience, I felt the anticipation and pride of a parent. Memories of band recitals, award ceremonies, football and volleyball games; only this was very different. It was not my child, but a Sister in Christ whom God had graced me to disciple and teach. This was her "coming out party"— her first public testimony of the amazing things God had done in her life.

The room was a buzz with fellow Christians who wanted to hear her secret. Her title, "Too Blessed to Be Stressed," drew them in. She spoke of the recent miracle in her life. Recounted that she had died in an accident in her pool and how God gave her a second chance at life! As she spoke, the crowd was silent and still as the Holy Spirit ministered to every person in the room. She went on to describe the growth in her faith walk and how she now felt God's presence in her life every day. She shared her new outlook and how she saw life in a totally new way. She challenged the audience to celebrate life each day. She closed with, "Look for God's presence in your life in the small things, then you too, will realize that you are too blessed to be stressed!"

Child of God, I encourage you to examine your life. Remember the times that God lifted you up and carried you when you were too tired to go on. Be joyful and thankful for God's grace, mercy and favor. In the face of trials and challenges, I pray that you will declare, "I am too blessed to be stressed!"

Lord, thank you for your blessings and favor. Holy Spirit, help me remember the fullness of Jesus' mercy and grace each day and may peace and joy rein in my life. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

The Body of Christ Meets Reality TV

"Strip yourselves of your former nature [put off and discard your old unrenewed self] which characterized your previous manner of life and becomes corrupt through lusts and desires that spring from delusion;" (Ephesians 4:22, AMP)

Reality TV has made "makeovers" the latest fad. We have TV shows that feature guests who get a physical makeover; home remodels; financial overhauls and learn to live on a budget; diet and cooking transformations. Some people put their marriage and family relationships on full display and attempt to learn functional relationship skills in front of a vast TV audience. Looking at the state of the Body of Christ, I am convicted that we must change our look, thinking and behavior and submit to a complete "spiritual makeover" in our daily lives.

Why do we need a spiritual makeover? A quick read of Barna data and review of the current state of affairs in the church reveals rampant failure to teach the Word of God and live according to God's Word. Homosexuality and same-sex marriage have invaded the pulpit and are promoted as an acceptable way of life. Divorce rates among Christians equals that of the world. Barna stats show that Church membership, attendance and offerings are on a decline, with only 20% of Christians tithing regularly. Sadly, a large number of Christians say that messages and programs are not relevant and do not address their needs. There has been an increase in scandals involving sexual abuse, immorality, and misuse of funds among pastors and church leaders. Thirty percent of pastors regularly engage in Internet pornography. Every day, Christians are on display before a vast audience that includes God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, saints, angels of heaven, friends and family, plus Satan and all the powers of darkness.

Child of God, is it time for you to invite God to perform a "spiritual makeover" in your life? Ask God to speak to you about any area of your life that is not pleasing to Him. Allow the Holy Spirit and his crew of divine assistants (Love, Mercy, Grace, Forgiveness, Wisdom, Discernment, Truth, Light, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, and Faithfulness) to take charge. Trust God, He created makeovers!

Spring of Living Water

"Jesus answered, 'Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." (John 4:13-14, NIV)

Here, we see Jesus asking the Samaritan woman at the well for a drink of water. As they talk, the woman comes to realize the man she is talking to is Christ the Messiah. After leaving the well, she goes back and tells friends and neighbors about her conversation with Jesus. Soon, they come out to hear Jesus preach the Gospel. Jesus and His disciples stay there for two days and many are saved.

In this passage, Jesus makes the comparison between natural water and spiritual or "living water." Natural water flowed from the well that had been dug centuries earlier by Jacob. Jesus points out that everyone who drinks natural water will soon become thirsty and forced to return and drink again. Jesus offers the woman and her neighbors, the Samaritans, "living water." Jesus explains the "living water" that He offers them will provide nourishment and quench their thirst for all eternity.

The world, driven by a spirit of darkness, attempts to satisfy our soul's deepest thirst by supplying us with power, money, possessions, sex, fame and recognition. None of these satisfy us for long. Soon, the hunger and thirst return and we crave for more. As a Christian, I am comforted to know that I have lifted His cup to my lips. I have tasted the "living water" that comes only from the Spirit of God and His Word. I have access to a free-flowing spring that never runs dry. The water is sweet, and it nourishes and soothes my soul. Best of all, I can dip into this spring and fill my cup to overflowing for myself and my entire house for all eternity. Are you thirsty? If so, I encourage you to drink from Jesus' cup and taste the "living water" that comes from Him. It is all you will ever need!

Lord, thank you for giving me "living water" that flows freely like a spring from your Son Jesus Christ. Your "living water" nourishes and sustains me with eternal life. Holy Spirit, teach me to share my cup gladly with others so they may also drink. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Justified by Grace

Paul's indictment of mankind is very clear when he says, "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Grace (Jesus) enters in and changes everything. It is by God's grace, (His unmerited favor and good will) that we are justified, declared innocent, acquitted and absolved from our guilt of sin. The Bible has much to say about God's grace and favor. These words are used 448 times in the Amplified translation. Webster's defines the word "favor" as: something done or granted out of goodwill, rather than from justice or for remuneration; an act of kindness; goodwill or the state of being approved or held in high esteem; to hold or possess favor.

I confess that I am overwhelmed by God's grace. I find it hard to understand why some Christians see God as an angry and stern Heavenly Father who sits watching and waiting to punish us for even the slightest mistake? God showed us His ultimate unconditional love and grace by sending Jesus to die on the cross that we might be redeemed and freed from sin. Jesus chose to die for us to show us His love and obedience to God. He took on our guilt, sins and the punishment that we deserved. He died and went to Hell, so we don't have to go.

Child of God, the next time you are feeling upset with God, disappointed that a prayer has not been answered, or upset that you are facing challenges; I suggest that you stop and remember one word, "Grace." By faith in Jesus, we were saved by grace and became righteous. Jesus died on the cross that we might have life and salvation for all eternity. We were declared innocent, acquitted and absolved from sin, and washed clean by the blood of Jesus. Remember, you have freedom, victory and eternal salvation because of His grace. Let this truth sink in, feel the joy rise up in your heart and give God praise for His grace.

When doubt, fear and unbelief increased; grace, expectant hope and faith increased even more.

When death and destruction increased; grace and eternal life increased even more.

I give praise to God that His grace is new every day. I am comforted to know that Jesus lives within me and His grace increases even more than any need or test I will ever face!

You will have everything you need." (James 1:2-4, NIV)

James uses strong language to address the hypocrisy he saw in the daily life of fellow Christians. His letter serves as a primer on Christian living. His words are very confrontational and challenging as he calls us to put our faith into action. Sadly, many Christians are good at talking the talk, but stumble and fall when it comes to walking it out. As James points out, the proof of our faith is in our actions, and in the fruit that we bear.

As Christians, we must reject worldly thinking and actions and greet our trials and tests with joy. To the world, this advice sounds crazy. When trials come, the world reacts with worry, anxiety, fear, and agitation. I praise God that others who have known me for years say they see the difference in how I respond to everyday situations. I have more joy and peace in my life than ever before. Yes, I have days where I get angry or frustrated for a few minutes, but the Holy Spirit steps in and quickly helps restore my peace. Often, I find myself welcoming challenges as an opportunity for spiritual growth, and promotion. God's grace has made joy my welcome mat.

Child of God, ask God to speak to you today about your joy. Are you walking in joy and peace in spite of your circumstances? Do you trust God's grace to continue in the midst of every trial? Do you have faith that God will use your trials to develop you into the person that He wants you to be? Commit today, to live by faith. By His grace, make joy your welcome mat and walk into your divine destiny!

Lord, thank you for this lesson on living by faith. Holy Spirit, help me greet every trial and test with joy and peace, knowing that God's grace is all I need. Finish the work in me that you have started. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

The Word Became Flesh

[Isa. 40:5]" (John 1:14, AMP)

John, Chapter One is one of my favorites in the entire Bible. John's words are spellbinding and have captured the heart, mind and spirit of Christians for over 2,000 years with this verse, "In the beginning [before all time] was the Word (Christ), and the Word was with God, and the Word was God Himself." John tells us the Word (Christ) came to earth to live with us. This one sentence forces every Christian to radically examine their beliefs, concepts, understanding, opinions, and emotions about Jesus Christ.

Jesus, Son of God, came and lived on earth. He ate and slept, worked with his hands as a carpenter, played with other children, went to church, studied and learned, laughed and cried, felt disappointment and hurt, like all of us. Jesus was both man and God. This very fact should override and cancel every lie that Satan will ever tell you; that Jesus does not understand what you are going through and cannot relate to your situation.

I find great joy and comfort in this verse. I'm reassured and find confidence knowing that Jesus Christ, my Lord and Savior, knows what I am going through. Jesus knows the hurt of betrayal and rejection by family and friends. Jesus knows the joy of love and deep connection with friends who have shared challenges and celebrated victory. Jesus knows we often desire to do what is right because our spirit is willing, but we fail because we're tired and give up. Jesus knows that we can believe in Him enough to step out of the boat one minute and sink into doubt and fear the next. I confess, I'm comforted because Jesus knows me. Most of all, I find peace and joy that I know Him. Do you know Him? If not, I encourage you to invite Jesus Christ, the Living Word, to become flesh and live in you too!

Lord, thank you for sending your Son Jesus Christ to live within me. Jesus, you gave me the Holy Spirit so that I am never alone. With your grace, I have everything I will ever need. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

In Weakness, I Am Strong

"So for the sake of Christ, I am well pleased and take pleasure in infirmities, insults, hardships, persecutions, perplexities and distresses; for when I am weak [in human strength], then am I [truly] strong (able, powerful in divine strength)." (2 Corinthians 12:10, AMP)

In this verse, God's kingdom thinking, and Satan's worldly thinking collide. Paul's words in this verse defy the world's thinking and turn it upside down. In other words, what the world sees as strength is weakness, and what is weakness to the world is our strength. Notice, Paul goes so far as to say he is "well pleased and even take pleasure" in times of trouble. Another translation states that "he is content and finds delight in weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions and difficulties." Why? Because Paul learned that when he is weak in human strength, he is strong, able, powerful in divine strength! Paul has discovered that when we are at the point of giving up, caving in and quitting, God's grace (His divine strength) shows up and carries us to the finish line.

Whenever we feel weak and impotent and are on the verge of saying, "I can't" His divine strength (grace) interrupts and reminds me, "With Christ, I can do this and will not fail." When we cannot see a way out, His grace shows us a way and leads our escape. When we are insulted or harassed and persecuted, His grace steps in and enables us to walk in humility, love and compassion, even Christ-like forgiveness. When we feel afraid or insecure, hurt or confused, His grace infuses us with God's love and enables us to walk in His divine wisdom and discernment, confidence and hope, courage and boldness. Child of God, ask God to show you the areas of your life where you are weak, feeling helpless and on the verge of giving up. In the moment, surrender your weakness to God. Allow Him to show up in His divine strength and walk in His grace!

Lord, thank you for the strength and power of your grace and your Word. Holy Spirit, teach me that when I surrender my life to you, I move from human weakness to divine strength and grace. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Understanding Mind and a Hearing Heart

[James 1:5.] It pleased the Lord that Solomon had asked this." (1 Kings 3:7-10, AMP)

God first spoke to me about this verse in late 2009. I was struck by the humility of Solomon's request. His first thought was to ask for God's help, so he could effectively judge and rule God's people. The next verse reveals that because he honored God with his request, God not only answered his prayer by anointing him with great wisdom and discernment, but also blessed him with great riches and wealth. From that day forward, I began to pray and ask God to grant me an understanding mind and hearing heart before every call and meeting.

I praise God that I have witnessed God answer my prayer as He peels away multiple layers of complexity and distraction and reveals hidden truths that lead to solutions, personal breakthroughs and destruction of generational curses and strongholds.

Child of God, are you judging the world, others, and your challenges with your own mind and heart, or a mind and heart from God? Are you operating outside the limits of your own understanding? Can your spiritual ears hear the cries of others' pain, sadness, hurt and disappointment? Do you feel their despair with a heart that has been fine-tuned by God's love? Are you able to perceive answers and solutions that have been hidden but are suddenly revealed? Are you able to discriminate between truth, lies and deception? Do you see the inner intentions, motives and desires of others? If you're still operating in your own strength, then I encourage you to get on your knees in prayer. Like Solomon, ask God to grant you an understanding mind and a hearing heart!

Lord, thank you for this powerful lesson on humility, honor, wisdom and discernment. Like Solomon, I am unable to face the world and its problems in my own strength. Holy Spirit, grant me an understanding mind and a hearing heart at all times. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Scripture Is Fulfilled

The confidence and boldness of Jesus' message captures my attention. Jesus understood the historical and cultural significance of His time on earth. He understood that His power and anointing came from God. Jesus knew both "Why" and "What" God sent Him to do. Jesus was (still is) God's messenger to the lost, sick, poor and oppressed. Jesus came for one reason, to share the "Good News of the Gospel" and share God's love, mercy and grace for His chosen people.

As a Christian, each of us must ask God to reveal His mission, purpose and perfect will for our lives. To accomplish His will, we need to walk in obedience and submit to His grace (anointing, power and might). Like Jesus, we must act in faith with confidence and boldness. We spend time packing and rechecking our bags to make sure we didn't forget key items (cell phone charger). We prepare for emergencies and create contingencies. We even evaluate and critique the trip afterwards and discuss what worked and what did not work, and whether or not we would ever go back or recommend the destination to friends and family.

I think I would struggle with Jesus' commandment to the disciples, "take nothing for the journey." As I reflect on my potential hesitation and resistance, the Holy Spirit revealed the truth of Jesus' teaching. He was trying to equip and prepare the disciples for their ultimate journey. He encouraged and motivated them to trust God for their provision and welfare. He prepared them to walk by faith and showed them how to trust Him in the moment. He taught them the need to always press on and to forget the past.

Jesus was preparing the disciples for the most important journey the world has ever known. I am humbled by the life lessons in this passage. I praise God, that I'm learning to face each day like the disciples. In fact, I am praying someday Karen and I will boldly and confidently go on a trip equipped only with the name of Jesus. As I write this, the Holy Spirit reminds me, what more do we need?

Lord, thank you for your provision. Holy Spirit, teach me to trust in and rely on you at all times. Remind me that when I take nothing, I am forced to rely on you, and you are all I need. Through the blood of Jesus and in the name of Jesus I pray, amen.

Knowing vs. Walking in the Truth

I read an article recently about a college student caught lying and cheating on exams. He expressed his dismay over his punishment by claiming, "What is the big deal. Everybody does it!" It seems that the world in general and especially Christians have bought the lie; the lie that says, "The truth will set you free." While this sounds good on the surface, this is a lie from Satan to deceive us into sin and death.

Let's take a look at some common and simple truths: (1) cigarettes (tobacco) causes cancer, (2) unprotected sex increases the risks for HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases, (3) drinking alcohol and driving is dangerous and against the law, (4) over-eating and lack of exercise are bad for your health. All of these are true, yet smoking, unprotected sex, drunk driving and obesity are all on the rise. Sadly, the truth alone NEVER sets anyone free. The truth we fail to focus on is the need to walk in faith and obedience to the truth of God's Word.

Leave your quiet, reserved, timid and politically correct self behind and go boldly into the world to confront and defeat evil. Your "G-Suit" is strong enough to withstand any sin or temptation. With it, nothing is impossible for you as it transforms your natural into God's divine power. 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

Developing Faith That Believes

Luke 1:28-38 "And he came to her and said, Hail, O favored one [endued with grace]! The Lord is with you! Blessed (favored of God) are you before all other women! But when she saw him, she was greatly troubled and disturbed and confused at what he said and kept revolving in her mind what such a greeting might mean. And the angel said to her, Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found grace (free, spontaneous, absolute favor and loving-kindness) with God. And listen! You will become pregnant and will give birth to a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus. He will be great (eminent) and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to Him the throne of His forefather David, And He will reign over the house of Jacob throughout the ages; and of His reign there will be no end. [Isa. 9:6, 7; Dan. 2:44. And Mary said to the angel, How can this be, since I have no [intimacy with any man as a] husband? 35 Then the angel said to her, The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you [like a shining cloud]; and so the holy (pure, sinless) Thing (Offspring) which shall be born of you will be called the Son of God. [Exod. 40:34; Isa. 7:14.] And listen! Your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is now the sixth month with her who was called barren. For with God nothing is ever impossible and no word from God shall be without power or impossible of fulfillment. Then Mary said, Behold, I am the handmaiden of the Lord; let it be done to me according to what you have said. And the angel left her.



Scripture has much to say about this, but my favorites include these three. I have used this simple illustration above with many of my clients to teach them the difference between these

two different and competing mindsets. Many clients are shocked to see the stark contrast. Be

prepared for an in-depth discussion because many Christians are sadly Biblically illiterate, and many pastors are not effectively teaching this from the pulpit.

- 1. I call heaven and earth to witness this day against you that I have set before You life and death, the blessings, and the curses; therefore choose life, that you and your descendants may live. And may love the Lord your God, obey His voice, and cling to Him. For He is your life and the length of your days, that you may dwell in the land which the Lord swore to give to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. (Deuteronomy 30:19-20, AMP)
- 2. For those who are according to the flesh and are controlled by its unholy desires set their minds on and pursue those things which gratify the flesh, but those who are according to the Spirit and are controlled by the desires of the Spirit set their minds on and seek those things which gratify the [Holy] Spirit. (Romans 8:5, AMP)
- **3.** From that time Jesus began to preach, crying out, Repent (change your mind for the better, heartily amend your ways, with abhorrence of your past sins), for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. (Mathew 4:17, AMP)



Tips for Leading Small Groups

I recommend you take the following steps to help you become comfortable with this resource. Over time, I expect you will make modifications or adjustments to make it your own. These steps have worked for me over the last 10+ years. I was led by the Holy Spirit to step away from my worldly or secular training in Psychology/Counseling and rely on the Holy Spirit to lead and guide me. He taught me to look and listen in the spirit realm first and that the spiritual realm was the foundation for everything I encountered. I pray that you have Spiritual Eyes to see and Spiritual ears to hear. As we read in (Luke 10:23-24, NASB), Turning to the disciples, He said privately, "Blessed are the eyes that see the things you see; for I tell you that many prophets and kings wanted to see the things that you see, and did not see them, and to hear the things that you hear, and did not hear them."

1. PRAY first before your calls or meetings. A short 30-second prayer is better than no prayer. In fact, our prayers are heard by angels and demonic spirits and change the atmosphere including us. Be vigilant and alert to the needs of others and adopt a "PRAY NOW PRAY BOLDLY" attitude and habit. As Co-Founder of PNPB, we stressed this mindset regarding prayer outlined below:

2. Study the tool, read, AND listen to the messages. This will enhance your individual connection with the message as we each have our own preferences and learning and behavioral styles. Spending time in the book before your meeting, will allow you to become familiar with the: (A) Biblical Truth/Living Word in the Scripture; (B) Commentary to determine if there are nuggets for you to learn from my examples and reflect on similar situations in your life; (C) Closing Prayer, allow it to speak to you. I know you will find that you have your favorite messages in the book, just as I do. Follow this link to one of mine.

3. Find a quiet and still place so you can be FULLY PRESENT in the moment. Adopt an attitude and practice what Martin Buber referred to in his classic writing, "I-Thou." Another great book I recommend is "Mary Morning Marth Day" by my dear friend and Sister in Christ, Pam Lilly. Start with Mary's focus and plan (sitting at the feet of Jesus) instead of the chores and activities of the day. Follow this link to hear the message.

4. Allow the Holy Spirit to lead and guide the discussion. Be directed vs. driven. Follow this link to hear another one of my favorite messages.

5. Expect Spiritual Warfare. Satan is an opportunist, he stalked Jesus in the wilderness and often interfered with the interactions between Jesus and His disciples. Also, demonic spirits to will often attempt to derail the meeting or impact. Be prepared for a fight. Follow this link.

6. Speak Godly Truth in Love at all times. Yes, you will be faced with the opportunity/challenge of having difficult but necessary conversations in your job during this challenging time where everyone is stressed and on edge. 7. Hold onto your peace. Be Christ-like and model love and compassion at all times. When unexpected challenges and difficulties come, when others are expressing their hurt, fear and anger and directing it towards you, how will you respond? Will you control your emotions or allow yourself to get "Emotionally Hi-jacked" and be led by your emotions? Remember, how others treat you is not your concern. How you treat them is! Praise and Worship Scriptures

We know from reading out Bible that praise and worship are important to God. In the NASB translation, the word "praise" is used 266 times; a total of 154 times in Psalms alone. The word "worship" appears 180 times. Because this is important to God, it is m=important to me. I have learned that praise and worship in its various forms can transport my spirit to a place that can only be accessed in this way. Some of the verses I stand on that address praise and worship include the following:

- **1.** Who is like You among the gods, LORD? Who is like You, majestic in holiness, Awesome in praises, working wonders? (Exodus 15:11, NASB).
- 2. For great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised; He also is to be feared above all gods. (1 Chronicles 16:25, NASB).
- 3. I will rejoice and be jubilant in You; I will sing praise to Your name, O Most High. (Psalm 9:2, NASB).
- **4.** I will bless the LORD at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth. (Psalm 34:1, NASB).
- **5.** Why are you in despair, my soul? And why are you restless within me? Wait for God, for I will again praise Him *For* the help of His presence, my God. (Psalm 42:11, NASB).
- 6. Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey, and I and the boy will go over there; and we will worship and return to you." (Genesis 22:5, NASB).
- 7. All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the LORD, And all the families of the nations will worship before You. (Psalm 22:27, NASB).
- **8.** All nations whom You have made will come and worship before You, Lord, And they will glorify Your name. (Psalm 86:9, NASB).
- 9. Then Jesus said to him, "Go away, Satan! For it is written: 'You shall worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only.' (Matthew 4:10, NASB).
- 10. God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth. (John 4:24, NASB).

I declare that He will cover me and completely protect me and my family with His pinions, And under His wings I will find refuge; I declare that His faithfulness is a shield and a wall.

I declare that I will not be afraid of the terror of night, or the arrow that flies by day, or the pestilence that stalks in darkness, or the destruction and sudden death that lays waste at noon.

I declare that A thousand may fall at my side, And ten thousand at my right hand, But danger will not come near me. I declare that I will only be a spectator as I look on with my eyes And witness the divine repayment of the wicked as I watch safely from the shelter of the Most High.

I declare that Because I have made the LORD, who is my refuge, Even the Most High, my dwelling place, No evil will befall me, No plague will come near my house.

I declare that He will command His angels in regard to me, To protect *and* defend *and* guard me in all my ways of obedience and service. I declare that they will lift me up in their hands, So that I do not even strike my foot against a stone.

I declare that I will tread upon the lion and cobra; the young lion and serpent I will trample under my feet.
