SYNOPSIS

Dido and Aeneas, is an apocalyptic world, where female warriors rule, Aeneas fled the destruction of his home, saved by the Gods to found the city to be their greatest legacy: Rome. But when he is stranded on Carthage, he must throw himself on the mercy of its warrior queen, Dido. Dido is dedicated to caring for her city and people. In Aeneas, she meets a man who she believes could be her equal-but they can never share a life. Just as she will not abandon Carthage, he cannot abandon his future city of Rome. Their journey is laden with love, danger, and deceit —as their duty, the scorned sorceress Medea, and fate tear them apart. In death, Dido sends Aeneas away, and births her daughter, Aeterna, and the saga continues...

& Aeterna follows the story of Dido and Aeneas's eponymous daughter. After her mother's death and Father's abandonment, Aeterna has been raised as Carthage's new queen by the city's Goddess protector, Juno. When news comes of Aeneas founding the city that he chose over Dido—Rome—Aeterna, guided by Juno, sets out to avenge her mother and change the fate of her home. For if she kills Aeneas, then Rome will never rise to destroy Carthage. But Aeterna has spent a lifetime yearning to connect with the parents she has never known, and trying to understand how to find her own place among gods and destiny.

COMPOSER STUDIO



(Program Director/Conductor)

Jake Landau is a composer, music director, and pianist from New York. His music has been performed by the New York Phil, Houston

Grand Opera, and headlining stars of Broadway shows such as Phantom of the Opera (Jay Armstrong Johnson), Frozen (Ciara Renée), and Wicked (Sam Gravitte). He earned his Bachelor of Music degree under John Corigliano at The Juilliard School, a Master of Studies from Oxford University, currently holding teaching positions at both institutions.



Pokee Chan is a Composer and Video Game Developer based in the Bay Area. She holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Composition for

Film, TV, and Games from Berklee College of Music and is currently completing a composition certificate at Juilliard Extension. With over a decade of professional experience in game development, she has contributed to several high-profile projects, including Call of Duty, Tomb Raider, and Marvel's Avengers.



Laurence Freed is a composer based in New York City. He has studied jazz at Mason Gross School of the Arts, and composition and orchestration at The Juilliard School, Extension

Division. His music has been noted as a fusion of Italian Partimento tradition, the 19th century theoretical writngs of Victor Gustave Lefèvre, and Paul Hindemith's Unterweisung im Tonsatz, but with a contemporary twist. He tends to write for large ensembles, male and mixed choirs, chamber performance and musical theater. Recordings of Freed's music are soon to be available on Spotify, Apple Music or YouTube. Freed lives on the Upper West Side of Manhattan with his wife and dog, and intermittently with his children.

She was the highest ranking African American woman in the Navy at her retirement, and has sinced authored a book, A Woman's War, as well as numerous magazines, newspaper articles and Blogs on national security topics. Despite a career focus on national security, Gail says music is her greatest love. She was a popular DJ and radio show host for Armed Forces Radio and TV, as well as an R&B show on KDUR Durango. She is also an indemand motivational speaker. Since 2019, she has been studying music at The Juilliard School, Extension Division.



Louis Horvath is a Michiganbased composer, conductor, arranger, musician, actor and educator. Mr. Horvath has been commissioned to write arrangements for Lincoln Center

Presents, RWS, and the Holland America Cruise Line, among others. In 2016, Mr. Horvath founded and was the 1st music director of the Walled Lake Alumni Orchestra. He has served as music director for several productions including "The Hunchback of Notre Dame" and most recently "The Drowsy Chaperone". Since 2021, Louis Horvath has been a student at the Juilliard School, Extension Division. In addition to his work in the arts, Mr. Horvath is also a Technical Production Supervisor for the Walled Lake Consolidated School District.



Gordon Rose is a composer, actor and singer. He started composing during middle school and continued to write music throughout high school and college. He attended Interlochen for two summers,

where he wrote chamber and orchestral music. In college, he majored in music and continued to sing in his adult life-recently resuming composition and acting. Mr. Rose was enrolled in the Juilliard School, Extension Division this past fall where he took two composition classes. He has a dream of writing a musical and will most definitely be writing more "classical" music as well. As a professional, Gordon Rose has worked in the software industry, and today works for a small Philadelphia-based startup.

In addition to their theater works, Anthime has a growing portfolio of film scores among them are Nosferatu (2018), Anxiety Stroke (2018), Sins of The Son (2018), Five of Wands (2019), Indifference (2021), The Choice (2022), and *The DoubleWalker* (In Production).
